

6 October, from Australian Federal Police: Help us find 15 year old Zane.



We believe he's with his father, 45 year old Peter (Pietro) Dal Bianco, possibly in southern Queensland or northern NSW.

Zane is described as Mediterranean in appearance with olive complexion, dark brown hair and dark brown eyes. He's approximately 170cm to 175cm tall and of a thin build.

Peter is also Mediterranean in appearance with fair complexion, black hair and hazel green eyes. He's approximately 180cm to 185cm tall and of a slight build.

They may be traveling in a 2004 silver Volvo with NSW registration CYC02X.

A recovery order has been issued by the Federal Circuit Court of Australia to return Zane to his mother. For full information, read the media release here.

Brew-tea-ful arrest!

A record 3.9 tonnes of liquid ephedrine, plus 350kgs of meth, have been seized and three people arrested as a result of joint investigations between AFP and Australian Border Force. The shipment of the precursors was disguised as iced tea bottles...

This is the largest seizure of precursor chemicals at the Australian border – the previous record was a 1.4 tonne seizure in June 2017.

We knew trouble was brewing and stopped these drugs hitting the streets. With the potential for plenty of time in prison let's hope these three are able to turn over a new leaf.

Moral of the story is, don't chai and import drugs into Australia or you will be in serious hot water.

From the Hornsby Advocate Thursday 5 October [view online edition here]: Street Watch page 8:

HORNSBY

A laptop worth \$2500 was stolen from a man's backpack after he fell asleep on a T1 North Shore and Northern Line train on September 12 between 3.15pm and 4.05pm. The man fell asleep between Chatswood and Hornsby stations and had the backpack at his feet.

GALSTON

A total of \$200 damage was caused to Galston High School between 7pm on September 8 and 4pm on September 10 after walls were damaged with black spray paint.

WAHROONGA

A briefcase worth \$1685 was stolen from a black Mercedes left unlocked in an open garage at Lucinda Ave on September 19 about 5pm. Police said the offender had to scale a 1.8m-high fence to get in.

HORNSBY

A man's wallet was stolen at Westfield Hornsby on September 19. The man last saw his wallet at 1.30pm and an hour later collected it from the centre's security desk but the contents, worth \$450, were gone. Police said CCTV footage was viewed and the person of interest is believed to be a 60-year-old Caucasian man,188cm tall with a slim build. He was wearing a beige shirt and blue trousers.

HORNSBY

A bag worth \$395 was stolen from a shop at Westfield Hornsby on September 16 between 12.45pm and 12.55pm. Police said a store employee saw a man grab the bag from a shelf and run out the shop. The man has been described as aged 30-40 with a fair complexion, large muscular build, 180cm tall with a shaved head and wearing khaki cargo pants and a black jumper.

Page 13: 'Illegal tip' site owner complies with EPA notice [Edited]

AN OFFICIAL clean-up notice with a list of demands that was sent to the owners of an Arcadia property being investigated for allowing asbestos and other pollutants to be dumped on their property has been complied with.

NSW EPA waste compliance head, Trevor Wilson, issued Arcadia Investment Holdings' David Levy with a formal Notice of Clean-Up Action last month, following a series of investigations by the EPA and Hornsby Council at 22 Geelans Rd, Arcadia.

Page 3: Left bitten and bloody by dog duo [Edited]

"IT WAS like being bitten by a shark".

Those were the words used by Aileen Scanlan as she started to describe her experience of being attacked by a dog while she was out for a stroll in Riverview St on September 27.

The Lane Cove resident said she was "left to bleed to death" by the owners who allegedly stood by and watched the incident occur.

"The dog just pounced and latched onto my leg and the man and the woman just stood there," she said.

"They had their two dogs on long leads and blood started pouring everywhere. I've been walking along that street for 32 years and this has never happened. I was terrified."

Page 9: Man accused of farming wife out as sex slave [Edited]

A LINDFIELD man was refused bail in Central Local Court on Wednesday afternoon, after his relationship with his wife allegedly spiralled out of control, with the man charged and accused of subjecting her to horrifying sexual violence.

As reported in the Sunday Telegraph, the couple, who cannot be named, looked happily married, but behind closed doors it was a very different story, according to documents tendered to Parramatta Local Court.

Police claim the couple's "master/slave" dynamic, which initially started out as 50 Shades of Grey-style sex games, allegedly saw the man farm his wife out as a sex slave.

Police have also accused him of forcing his spouse to wear a "slave dress", as well as hogtying her and subjecting her to other horrific sexual violence while his two young children were in the next room of their home.

Page 20: Major raids reveal cosmetics Danger [Edited]

DODGY, deadly and illegal medications from Asia have been seized in major raids of cosmetic clinics in Chatswood and Haymarket last week as the government declares war on the industry.

Large amounts of Botox, fillers, vitamins – even human placenta that is injected into unwitting women – as well as antibiotics and anaesthetic used in cosmetic procedures were seized.

The products were mostly imported from China and South Korea.

Authorities also seized surgical equipment suspected of being unhygienic, and potentially deadly products with illegal packaging that failed to warn of the risks.
