### **31 December, from Traffic and Highway Patrol Command - NSW Police Force**

About 10pm Saturday 30 December 2017 a 33 year old male driver was stopped for rbt on Henry Lawson Drive George's Hall. An inspection found a 4 month old child unrestrained, the child was in a capsule seat facing sideways not secured to the vehicle at all. On the other side of the vehicle was a 4 year old sitting in a booster seat with no seatbelt.

Driver was issued two fines totalling \$660 and 12 demerit points.

Driver was not permitted to leave the scene until restraints were fitted correctly.

Officers assisted the husband and the baby was delivered in the front seat of their car.

Paramedics arrived on scene to attend to the new baby boy and his mother.

The family were taken to hospital where they are currently recovering well.



**31 December, NSW Police Force**

Inquiries continue into a sea plane crash off Jerusalem Bay near Cowan.

The plane, which had six people on board including the pilot, went down about

3.10pm today (Sunday 31 December 2017).

Police divers are on scene and the six bodies have now been recovered from the wreckage.

Police will work with Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB) investigators as inquiries into the crash continue.

A report will be prepared for the Coroner.

No information is available on the identity of the occupants at this stage and media are asked not to speculate on their identity until confirmed by police.

one reason - visitor safety. Unfortunately police and emergency services have attended several tragic incidents in recent years, where visitors have fallen, after getting too close to edges or slipping on wet rocks. No selfie is worth losing your life for. At Katoomba Falls, like any location within the National Park, Police or Park Rangers can issue on-the-spot fines to people who choose to ignore signs or risk their own safety. Please obey safety signs, remain behind fences and enjoy your visit to the mountains. You'll go home in one piece and your bank account will be better for it.

### **31 December, from NSW Police Force**

A man has been charged after allegedly wounding three teens at Lindfield yesterday.

The three teens aged 15, 16 and 18 were walking along Havilah Road about 3pm yesterday (Saturday 30 December 2017), when they became involved in an argument with a man walking towards them.

The man produced a kitchen knife and allegedly stabbed the 18 and 16-year-old in the hand and then pinned the 15-year-old to the ground and held the knife to his throat.

The teens called out to a nearby witness for help, who contacted police before the man left the scene.

A short time later, officers from North Shore Local Area Command arrested an 18-year-old man in Nelson Street.

He was taken to Chatswood Police Station and charged with three counts of wound person with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

The man was refused bail to appear at Parramatta Local Court today (Sunday 31 December 2017).

The three teens were assessed by NSW Ambulance Paramedics and taken to Hornsby Hospital for treatment.

Their injuries are not life-threatening.



Australian authorities have seized nearly 150 kg of fireworks in northern Sydney, days before the city's popular year-end festivities.

The illegal fireworks were being kept in a garage area unsuitable for storing

explosives, New South Wales state's Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation Matt Kean told Xinhua on Thursday about the seizure by workplace health and safety agency SafeWork NSW. Investigations into the case are ongoing.
