As a pedestrian you should:

- 🚦 Obey signals at crossings (penalty applies for failure to do so)
- 🚶儿♂ Always cross at a pedestrian crossing if one is available (penalty applies for failure to do so);
- 🚗 Never assume a driver has seen you or intends to stop;
- 📱 Never cross a road while using headphones or mobile phones;
- 👨‍👩‍👧‍👦 Always hold the hands of children when crossing the road.

16 February, Media Release from NSW Police:

A critical incident investigation has been launched after two Highway Patrol officers were injured – one critically – at a Random Breath Test site in Sydney's south west. Police were setting up a roadside RBT site on Campbelltown Road at Leumeah when they were struck by a vehicle about 8.20pm (Friday 16 February 2018). Two male Senior Constables sustained severe leg injuries. One was taken to Liverpool in a critical condition, and one in a serious condition. The driver of the vehicle was not injured and has been taken to Campbelltown Hospital for mandatory blood and urine testing. A critical incident team will now investigate all circumstances surrounding the incident. That investigation will be subject to independent review.

Police are appealing for anyone with information about the incident to contact **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.**


15 February, from Ku-ring-gai command: Warning to all north shore residents.

There has been an increase in the number of elderly persons being contacted by a male purporting to be from a bank, the male asks for personal information and PIN's for their credit and debit cards. The male offender has either broken into homes or simply walked in through unlocked doors. Once inside he steals credit and debit cards and leaves. Once he has the cards he will ring the victim pretending to be from the bank asking for personal details like date of birth etc. He then asks the victim to confirm the PIN of the cards. As he knows most of the info

the victim believes he is from the bank, once he has the PIN he attends local ATMs and withdraws as much as he can. Banks will never ring and ask to confirm PINs or request you identify yourself with a date of birth. Police are asking those of you that have elderly family or friends (not on facebook) to contact them and educate them about this scam, We have had several cases in the past few weeks and another at St Ives just now.


14 February, shared from Crime Stoppers: Did you know that it is a crime if you make, send out, or have an “offensive” image of someone under the age of 18 (including of yourself) who is:

- Showing their private parts, which includes a person's genital area, anal area or female breasts

- Posing or acting in a sexual way; in the presence of another person involved in sexual activity or pose, or
- Involved in a sexual activity.

The law calls these images CHILD ABUSE MATERIAL, or more commonly – Child pornography. If you are found guilty of a sexting crime, you may be placed on the Australian National Child Offender Register.

It is important to protect yourself by deleting any pictures you are unsure or uncomfortable about straightaway. It is really difficult to keep images private and once they are shared, you will never be able to delete those pictures forever. Never share it online or through SMS, and only show it to a trusted adult.

13 February, shared from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: Around 10:40 am on Monday the 12th of February 2018, Police were conducting patrols of Galston Road and were travelling in an easterly direction through Galston Gorge.

At this time, Heavy Motor Vehicle bearing New South Wales registration, being driven by a 38 year old male from Cambridge Park, being a heavy rigid petrol tanker was travelling westbound. On a hair pin turn, it was observed that the heavy vehicle was required to conduct a three point turn to make the turn, causing minor disruptions to traffic flow which required all traffic, including Police to stop to allow for movement of the vehicle [edited].

Streetwatch (page 5):

HORNSBY A Little Tykes Princess Chariot toy was stolen from Toys R Us on Friday but it did not get far after police — already alerted by Central Coast colleagues — pounced on a 16-year-old San Remo boy and recovered the item. The chariot was taken around 3pm after three young people — two males and a female — entered the Westfield shopping centre store with a trolley, took the chariot and then allegedly walked out without paying. Police are viewing CCTV and still investigating the incident.

BEROWRA HEIGHTS A Turner Rd property was broken into on Friday, February 2, between 8pm and 9.30pm. A thief stole tools, a computer, vacuum cleaner and a battery charger. The property owner's CCTV footage showed the break-in taking place and the owner recognised the thief. Police are continuing to investigate.

TURRAMURRA A potential break-and-enter was foiled on Monday at 4am when a homeowner in Bobbin Head Rd woke when she heard her front door handle being jiggled. She shouted out and the person left the scene.

WAITARA A P-plater, 22, who crashed into a fence on the Pacific Highway at Waitara allegedly told police he had taken pills the night before. He returned a negative alcohol result. The driver hit the fence on Sunday at 9.30am and an oral fluid test allegedly showed the presence of drugs, with further testing allegedly revealing the driver was positive for methamphetamine. He will appear at Hornsby Court in March.

WAITARA A man discovered by police at 1.35am with his feet hanging out the back of a Toyota HiLux ute allegedly intended to steal tools when approached on Monday. Police said the Mt Colah man had his top half under the canvas rear of the ute's tray when they saw him during a patrol. Police handed him a court infringement notice for larceny.

HORNSBY A 15-year-old girl was interviewed by police after she attempted to steal several beachwear items from City Beach in Westfield on Saturday. Police said the Cherrybrook girl went into the shop and chose a Calvin Klein bikini bottom and sports bra and several other items worth \$194 at 1:30pm. She attempted to pay for only one of the smaller items and when she left the store security staff escorted her back inside to wait for police. She was handed a youth caution.

MOTORCYCLIST THROWN FROM BIKE

A MOTORCYCLIST was flung over the front wheel of his bike when he was in a collision with a hatchback at Dural last Wednesday. The 49-year-old man suffered pelvic injuries and was taken to hospital in a stable condition after the crash, on Old Northern Rd at 4.30pm. A CareFlight crew landed in a grassy clearing 100m from the scene. NSW Ambulance paramedics helped stabilise the man.

19 February, shared from NSW Police: A man has been charged following investigations into an assault that's left a man on life support at the weekend.

About 3.25am (Sunday 18 February 2018), an altercation occurred between a

number of people in the carpark of a premises on **Mona Vale Road, Terrey Hills**. Emergency services were called and a 43-year-old man was found unconscious on the ground suffering a critical head injury. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital where he was treated for a fractured skull and placed on life support. Following investigations at the scene by officers from Northern Beaches Police Area Command, a 26-year-old man was arrested. He was taken to Manly Police Station where he was charged with reckless grievous bodily harm. He was refused bail and will appear in Manly Local Court today (Monday 19 February 2018).

What is the Notifiable Data Breaches scheme?

The passage of the *Privacy Amendment (Notifiable Data Breaches) Act 2017* established the Notifiable Data Breaches (NDB) scheme in Australia. The NDB scheme applies to all agencies and organisations with existing personal information security obligations under the Australian *Privacy Act 1988* (Privacy Act) from **22 February 2018**.



TEST ANSWER: Vehicle A must give way to vehicle B.

Vehicles A and B are facing stop and give way signs; when two drivers face each

other at stop or give way signs at an intersection they must give way to all other vehicles entering or approaching the intersection then apply the give way rules to each other. Vehicle A must then give way to vehicle B, as it is turning across vehicle B's path.

From the draft 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Travel':

Tip#1: Do your research before you go. Register your trip: DFAT's www.SmarTraveller.gov.au

Tip#4: Align the wheels of your pram or motorised scooter parallel to the train platform edge to avoid accidents, ie not pointing towards/away from the track. Always apply the brakes on a station platform or whilst travelling on a train, bus, etc. Request your FREE 'Pram Safety' DVD at www.cityrail.info . Always use a 'Pram Harness' for safety.

Tip#9: If you feel intimidated by someone with you in a train carriage, jump out at the next exit, go down a carriage and hop back on.

Tip#16: Request a room other than on the lowest floor – most crimes happen on the lower floors. Acquire or make a copy of the fire escape plan on the back of your hotel door. Keep a flashlight next to the bed and within arm's reach.

Tip#19: Carry a motion alarm that can be placed over the hotel doorknob, a door-stopper alarm, or a simple rubber wedge to place under the door. Request an extra key at the front desk, so no one will know if you're traveling alone.
