COPS ARE TOPS FOR STANSBIES

NEW policewoman Sarah Stansbie is a chip off the old block – following the same career path as her father.

Constable Stansbie is among the three recruits joining Ku-ring-gai police.

A huge ceremony was held on Friday, April 27 at the police academy in Goulburn to welcome 234 new recruits to the NSW Police Force.

The new officers have been split up and sent to area commands across the state, starting their careers in the police force last week.

Constable Stansbie said she studied forensic science at Western Sydney University before

joining the police. She said her father had a big influence on her making that decision.

"He served for over 20 years in the police force and loved it," she said. Constable Stansbie said her father was rapt to see her join the force. "He loved it. I have never seen him with that much emotion."

The probationary constables will undergo 12 months of on-the-job training before they are confirmed to the rank of constable.

They will also study by distance education with Charles Sturt University to complete an Associate Degree in Policing Practice.

The 234 recruits comprise 164 policemen and 70 policewomen. A total of 213 were born in Australia and 21 were born overseas.

10 May, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: [Asquith Boys High School Events & News 2018](#) - another great day speaking to over 200 year 10 & 11 students about keeping safe on our roads.

During the morning we got to talk to students, many who were L & P platers on the risks of speeding, drink or drug driving, not wearing a seat belt or proper helmet, driving fatigued, or distracted by a mobile phone. After that students were to view vehicles & equipment, and speak to officers from NSW Ambulance, Rescue & Bomb Disposal - NSW Police Force, along with Highway Patrol & Crash Investigation Unit Officers from the Traffic & Highway Patrol Command. Also at the

event were the team from Moits who provided a Truck, with vehicles parked in blind spots, where students (& teachers) got to jump in the cab & check to see if they could see those vehicles in front, & behind, & along side (along with tooting the horn!). A special thanks to the Principal, Mr Bryce Grant, for allowing us the opportunity to speak to students directly, along with showcasing those who keep us safe on NSW roads!

08 May, from NSW Police: Truck driver charged over road rage incident - St Ives | Monday, 07 May 2018 09:13:50 PM

Police are appealing for witnesses after a road rage incident in Pymble today in which a man was charged. About 11.45am (Monday 7 May 2018), a 55-year-old man was driving a truck north on Forest Way, St Ives when he allegedly tailgated a station wagon being driven by a 59-year-old man. When the vehicles stopped at

traffic lights, the truck driver allegedly threatened the station wagon driver with a metal bar. When the lights turned green the vehicles continued on Mona Vale Road, with the truck allegedly driving alongside the car before driving into its lane. The truck driver then allegedly got out of his truck and smashed the front window of the car. The car then drove up onto the kerb and drove from the scene in order to escape. Police were notified about the incident and intercepted the truck on the Pacific Highway, Pymble. The 55-year-old was arrested and taken to Hornsby Hospital for blood and urine testing. He was subsequently issued a Field Court Attendance Notice for malicious damage, menacing driving and use of offensive weapon, to appear at Hornsby Local Court at a later date.

Police are calling for witnesses who have yet to speak to police to come forward. 14 May, from the Australian Federal Police: SCAM ALERT

Be on the lookout for a complex new scam targeting the Chinese community in Australia – it goes something like this:

- 1) The victims are told they are implicated in crimes in China.
- 2) The scammers then coerce the victims into a series of actions and make threats that their families in China will be harmed if they don't cooperate.
- 3) The victims' families in China are told by the scammer their family members have been kidnapped and will only be released if a large sum of money is paid.

In each case, the scammers communicate with the victims in Mandarin and falsely claim to be Chinese government officials. If you think you are being – or have been – scammed, help is on hand. 12 May, from our neighbouring Ryde command: Police investigating a child approach in Sydney's north-west yesterday are appealing for public assistance.

About 4.15pm (Friday 11 May 2018), police have been told a 16-year-old boy was walking on Endeavour Street, West Ryde, when a grey Holden Commodore began to follow him. A man inside the vehicle spoke to him but the boy continued to walk on towards Bennett Street. As he approached the intersection, the car pulled up again and stopped in front of the boy. The man left the vehicle and tried to grab him but the boy managed to get away and ran onto Mons Avenue. The boy was not injured. Officers from Ryde Police Area Command commenced an investigation.

Investigators wish to speak with a man who may be able to assist with their inquiries. He has been described as being of Caucasian appearance, aged in his mid-40s to 50s, about 175cm tall, of an average build, with a bald head and partial grey hair at the neck, and missing three teeth.

13 May, KILLARA Concerned residents sent evidence of last night's commotion.

"Last night our neighborhood experienced quite a disturbance in the park and on the tennis courts on Koola Ave. There was a large group of young people early in the evening making a lot of noise clearly a considerable amount of alcohol consumed and a huge mess left including broken glass. Our neighbors called the police before 8pm and they responded, by that time the group had moved on. Our neighbors took photos and called into the Gordon Police Station this morning to ensure their phone call had been recorded plus report the mess left. We will report this to the council as this is not the first time something like this has happened. Some time back the Council were considering allowing this area to be used for functions/parties on Friday and Saturday nights to raise revenue for the council. People in the area were strongly opposed to this because of previous damage to property and cars along with disruptive behavior and drug use, needles and syringes found along with cans, bottles, used condoms and general rubbish, not pleasant. We have not heard back from the council concerning this proposal and had assumed it will not go ahead but they need to be aware we are concerned about this type of behavior in the neighborhood. I imagine this information will be in the Newsletter later this year but I think it is useful people are aware of these things happening in our community (now)."



10 May, from NSW Police: Great News. A man missing from Sydney's north-west has been located.

The 75-year-old was went missing from a care facility in North Turramurra about 4.45pm yesterday (Wednesday 9 May 2018). About 8.35am today (Thursday 10 May 2018), he was located by police from Bike Unit in bushland in Bobbin Head National Park. He has been taken to Hornsby Hospital for observation.

PENNANT HILLS The driver of a stolen ute suspected of robbing a Thornleigh cafe led police on a chase across northern Sydney before running away. Police

were called about 12.40am on Monday after the front window of a cafe on Station St was smashed and \$600 stolen from the shop's cash register. Police were given a description of a white ute which was seen leaving the area. About 10 minutes later, police spotted a white Toyota Hilux near George St in Pennant Hills. The driver of the vehicle tried to evade police starting a pursuit. The driver eventually stopped at Kurrajong St, Pennant Hills, and ran into bushland. Police lost sight of him. The plates on the vehicle were also stolen and did not match the Toyota Hilux.

GALSTON An 18-year-old man has been charged with midrange drink driving after being spotted reversing at high speed in the Galston Aquatic Centre carpark on Galston Rd on Friday about 11.20pm. The man was tested and returned a 0.081 blood alcohol concentration. His licence was suspended and he will face Hornsby Court on June 7.

REGIONWIDE Ku-ring-gai police have noticed an increase in numberplate thefts across the region. They said about five to 10 numberplate thefts were reported each week. Police are offering motorists free one-way screws to attach your numberplate to your car in an effort to reduce the plates being stolen. To pick up the screws, visit Hornsby police station on 292 Peats Ferry Rd. **[NOTE: These screws are made possible through the Neighbourhood Watch Australasia Community Funding - Ed.]**

NORTH TURRAMURRA Three goats' heads were among goat remains found near a children's playground on Bobbin Head Rd on Saturday morning.

ASQUITH Police are investigating a fire at Asquith Oval after a Hyundai vehicle was set alight on Sunday about 11.05pm. A witness said a man with a red hoodie ran from the car before it was engulfed in flames.

BEROWRA A 21-year-old Berowra man has been charged with high-level drink driving after police stopped him at Berowra Waters Rd on Saturday about 12.35am. He returned a 0.190 blood alcohol level.

From the North Shore Times, Thursday 10 May: One camera, \$40,000 a week [online edition here.]

Page 18: A NOTORIOUS speed camera in Wahroonga averages over \$40,000 a week in fines, making it the most expensive speed camera in the region.

The camera is on the Pacific Highway in Wahroonga, between Gilda and Woodville avenues. It is in a school zone near Knox Grammar School. It racked up \$2.16 million worth of speeding fines between April 2017 and March 2018 — averaging more than \$40,000 a week. Mobile speed camera locations can be found on the Centre for Road Safety website. A Transport for NSW spokesman said speed cameras were there to save lives, not to fine drivers. “Speed is the biggest killer on our roads and last year 168 people lost their lives in NSW because somebody was driving too fast,” he said. He said a speed camera review was undertaken in 2016 and found there had been a 92 per cent reduction in fatalities at fixed speed camera locations.

Page 20: David Ewen is charged with sexual assault of a three-year-old girl.

A NORTH shore man accused of sexually assaulting a three-year-old girl at a NSW ski resort last year has had his bail suspended so he can attend an alcohol and drug detox clinic. David Carl Ewen, 50, had his bail put on hold last Thursday so he could attend Royal North Shore Hospital’s Herbert St Clinic for two weeks as a full-time inpatient. The decision came as the Roseville man fronted Sydney’s Downing Centre Court, where two of the four charges levelled against him by NSW Police were dropped. Mr Ewen — who was previously a team manager at the Lindfield Football Club — was initially charged in August last year with aggravated indecent assault of a person under 16, sexual intercourse with a child under 10 and two counts of indecent assault against a person under 16 and his bail was refused when he first fronted court.


Page 28: [edited] Bumper year for parking fines

KU-RING-GAI Council is on track to issue its highest number of parking tickets for

a financial year since detailed records began, delivering \$2 million in revenue. Council has blamed the large number of fines on the increased population in the area which led to high demand for parking spots. The council issued 12,125 parking tickets between July 2017 and March 2018 equating to just over \$2 million in fines. At the current rate, the council will issue over 16,000 tickets by the end of the financial year equating to more than \$2.7 million in fines.

09 May, from North Shore Mums group: Cot theft!



We were broken into and robbed last Thursday about midday in Wahroonga in Woonona Avenue.


And another added: I know a friend in Wahroonga was broken into last week. During the day.

08 May, Further clarification from the council regarding this intersection [edited]. Thanks to Emily for sharing in the St Ives Community group.

Hello everyone, I'm on the St Ives North P&C and we sought formal advice from Ku-ring-gai Council on the new markings through the Toolang Rd/Memorial Avenue intersection:

"Eastbound traffic on Toolang Road turning right into Memorial Avenue and northbound traffic in Memorial Avenue turning left into Toolang Road have right of way. These vehicles are following the white turning broken lines; hence they are meant to continue with no stopping. "The other two legs are controlled by 'Give Way' and they must give way to other traffic."

Council has also advised us that northbound cars that are continuing into the Memorial Avenue cul de sac OR turning right into Toolang / Raleigh Crescent must indicate and give way to the cars turning right from Toolang into Memorial. (That is, to treat Toolang as it turns right into Memorial as the main or continuous road, and all of the other side roads as minor roads that have to give way when turning both in and out.)



08 May, from 7News: The phone scam fooling hundreds of Aussies

This is the missed call you don't want to return. Almost 200 Australians a month are being stung by the latest phone scam doing the rounds, known as Wangiri scams. Fraudsters call from an overseas number, hoping you ring back. If you do, you're charged a premium and the scammer keeps a large chunk of the money, similar to a 1300 call.
