UPDATE on Telstra outage

Outages across the Telstra 3G and 4G network could be impacting people trying to call Triple Zero (000) or the Police Assistance Line (131 444).

The advice we have received indicates Telstra customer mobile phone calls to Triple Zero (000) should automatically be connected via another carrier; however, if you are experiencing problems use a landline.

Please remember to only call Triple Zero (000) if you have an emergency.

"So far this year 138 people have lost their lives on New South Wales roads... 28 were pedestrian." - [NSW Police](#).

Hornsby: An elderly man has died after being hit by a bus while crossing Bridge Road. Witnesses rendered first aid to the injured man until [NSW Ambulance](#) arrived, however, he died at the scene.

Police statement: A pedestrian has died in Sydney's north after he was struck by a bus while crossing the road. Just before 1pm (Sunday 20 May 2018), a man was crossing Bridge Road when he was struck by a bus which was turning right from Peats Ferry Road. Witnesses rendered first aid to the injured man until the arrival of NSW Ambulance paramedics; however, he died at the scene. Crash Investigation Unit attended the scene as investigations into the circumstances surrounding the incident continue.

The man has not yet been formally identified. A brief will be prepared for the information of the Coroner."

18 May, from Kuring Gai Police Area Command [Edited]

A great arrest by dedicated Hornsby Police officers.

Numerous offences including aggravated break, enter and steal (in company), steal motor vehicle, steal from motor vehicle across Ku-ring gai, North Shore, Blacktown, Quakers Hill and Cumberland Police Area Commands occurred between 20th April 2018 and 17th May 2018.

Investigation resulted in the arrest and charging of a 39 year old male for these offences.

On the 30th April 2018, the Ku-ring gai Proactive Crime Team commenced an investigation into numerous break, enter and steal, steal motor vehicle and steal from motor vehicle offences. As a result of this investigation, three persons of interests were identified, Police allege 2 males and a female were involved.

On the 12th May 2018, 1 male was arrested and charged with two counts of aggravated break, enter and steal and one count of carried in conveyance without consent. he is currently bail refused.

Between 20th April 2018 to 17th May 2018, the 39 year old male has committed numerous offences across several commands.

He has been captured on high quality CCTV allegedly committing these offences where he has stolen property including jewellery, cash and motor vehicles, Police conservatively estimating property value in excess of (\$300,000) three hundred thousand dollars.

The Ku-ring gai Proactive Crime Team made numerous enquiries into the whereabouts of the male, and at 4:15pm on Thursday 17th May 2018, the 2 males were both arrested in the carpark at the Hotel Seven Hills carpark by Blacktown

and Kuring Gai Proactive Crime Teams. Their car was consequently searched where a large amount of stolen property was allegedly located.

A great result from the dedicated Proactive Police officers at Hornsby police

A victim held at gunpoint in his unit in Hornsby allegedly told intruders “you’ve got the wrong f***** house” after being threatened with a knife and gun.

Police were called to an address on Jersey St North, Hornsby about 1.50am this morning after three men stormed a unit.

18 May, from NSW Police Force [Edited]

The NSW Police Force, with the support of the NSW Government, will conduct a state-wide Firearms Amnesty following the success of last year’s national campaign.

During the three-month period in 2017, NSW netted 24,831 firearms and 1898 firearm parts for destruction, sale or registration – more than any other state or territory – prompting another operation to reduce the number of unregistered and unwanted firearms in the community.

Anyone with an unregistered firearm or firearm-related item in their possession will have the chance to legally dispose, or register it, without penalty between 1 July and 30 September 2018.





SCAM ALERT FOR APPLE USERS!!!!

My 9yr old's iPad got locked ... Safari came up with a legitimate Apple warning saying that her iPad was compromised and to phone a +61 1800 number immediately before her iPad got locked. I phoned the number immediately and got a bit suss when they asked for my Apple ID and just gave my name ... then they got me on my computer and took over my computer ... I gave them Hubby at that point. They told us that our IP ADDRESS had been compromised 139 times etc ... then they told hubby that cleaning our software cost us \$199 and wanted him to pay ... that is when I clocked it was wrong as Apple doesn't charge and normally send messages and PIN numbers to your mobile. We disconnected and they phoned me to tell me to reconnect my computer (scary that they found my home number) ... I said I have free Apple support due to my new iPad and they hung up. High-rise concern: Page 10 [Edited]

A PLAN to surround Wahroonga Adventist School with hundreds of apartments has outraged residents — but the Adventist Group won't support the community's battle.

The Adventist School and Sydney Adventist Hospital parent company, Australasian Conference Association, submitted revised plans for 200 units across five six-storey towers last December as part of the Wahroonga Estate precinct.

The school's P&C representative Carli Jeffrey said the area was already overdeveloped.

"This is an area already overdeveloped that houses an incredibly large hospital, churches, schools and hundreds of homes that line single-laned Fox Valley Rd," Mrs Jeffrey said.

"We appreciate the support the school, the church and the hospital provides the community. However, we have some major concerns surrounding this high-rise development."

A pedestrian has been hit by an Uber driver at a crossing at the corner of Little St and Longueville Rd in Lane Cove. The incident occurred around 11pm on Saturday, May 12, when a man in his 40s was walking across the crossing was struck by a red Mazda. Paramedics were called and the man was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a stable condition. The 27-year-old male driver was

uninjured. He was breath tested by police at the scene and returned a negative result. Officers from North Shore Police Area Command are investigating the cause of the incident.

THE students of North Turramurra Public School have received a masterclass in water safety.

The students this week received a special visit from former ironman and Olympic swimmer Ky Hurst.

The two-time Olympian and four time ironman champion stressed the importance of teaching water safety to youngsters.

“As a parent, one of my greatest concerns is keeping my kids safe,” Mr Hurst said. “I firmly believe it is never too early to prepare them on how to grow up safely in Australia’s bush, backyard and surf.”

The presentation also included safety tips from the local Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter (WLRH) crew. Westpac’s Wahroonga Branch Manager, Frank Tsai, said: “In bringing the Service to Turramurra North Public School we hope to educate our (children) about how they can avoid getting into danger and stay safe in an emergency.”

“The WLRH crew know all too well about how to prepare or respond in an emergency and I feel reassured to know they are helping to provide useful tips which might one day save lives,” Hurst added.

The national WLRH fleet includes 17 helicopters flying from 13 bases.

4 A TEENAGER in school uniform allegedly spat on a bus driver on Tuesday at Berowra train station between 7.50am and 8am. Police are reviewing CCTV footage. Several passengers tried to catch a ride on nearby buses without an Opal card in recent weeks.

WESTLEIGH

5 A gold Subaru Outback was stolen from Westleigh Village on Eucalyptus Drive on Tuesday between 6.30pm and 7pm.

BEROWRA

6 A 20-year-old man on his P1 licence has been charged with high-range drink driving after being stopped by police on Goodwyn Rd. The man was driving a yellow Ford Falcon and was spotted by police driving dangerously and allegedly speeding. After being stopped by police, he tested positive for alcohol during a roadside breath test. He was taken to Hornsby police station and returned a 0.160 blood-alcohol level. The alcohol limit for Pplate drivers is 0. His licence was suspended on the spot and he will face court on a yet to be confirmed date.

KURING-GAI CHASE

7 Police are investigating a crash during which a cyclist was injured last Wednesday just before 11am. Emergency services were called to General San Martin Drive at Kuring-Gai Chase after a collision between a McLaren and a cyclist. The cyclist, a man in his 50s, suffered serious facial and leg injuries. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a serious condition. The driver, a 28-year-old woman, was not injured and taken to hospital for mandatory tests.

REGIONWIDE

7 Police and the NSW Government will conduct a statewide firearms amnesty following the success of last year's national campaign. Anyone with an unregistered firearm or firearm-related item in their possession will have the chance to legally dispose or register it without penalty between July 1 and September 30. During the three-month amnesty in 2017, NSW netted 24,831 firearms.

Scooter collides with 4WD

A TEENAGER was rushed to hospital in a critical condition after being hit by a four-wheel drive while riding his scooter in Dural just before 9.30am on Sunday.

The nasty crash was at the intersection of New Line Rd and Sebastian Drive. The 18-year-old man was unconscious when paramedics arrived and he suffered head, chest and abdominal injuries. Bystanders were quick to give first aid before paramedics arrived.

The driver, a 70-yearold woman was uninjured.

She was taken to hospital for mandatory blood and urine testing.



Local Coordination Points (LCPs) and Safety Action Meetings (SAMs) are two key elements of Safer Pathway, currently available in 43 sites across NSW.

When a domestic violence incident is reported and a DVSAT is conducted, victims are automatically referred to a Local Coordination Point. LCPs are locally based specialist services that provide immediate and streamlined service responses within one business day of a domestic or family violence report being made.

Following contact from the LCP, victims experiencing domestic and family violence are provided with an immediate safety assessment, welfare check and locally based referrals for support including but not limited to: legal advice, court support, counselling, safety planning, youth support, immediate financial assistance, security upgrades etc.
