OPTUS SCAM ALERT! Emails claiming to be from Optus are circulating. They want your credit card information for what is claimed to be unpaid bill.

The ACMA has been receiving reports about emails with the subject line 'We are unable to process your last payment'.

The fake emails are sophisticated and use a web address that looks like the real Optus website. The email contains a link to a fake 'pay your bill' page, which then asks for your credit card details.

The fake email and payment form are cunningly crafted to trick people. It's important you check the legitimacy of email links to protect your personal information—use contact details you find through a legitimate source and not those contained in the suspicious message.

If you receive this scam email, delete it immediately.

10 August, from Burwood Police Area Command

Full Drivers Licence holders and bicycle riders may only use a mobile phone to make or answer an audio call or use the audio function if:

- it is secured in a commercially manufactured and designed mounting which is fixed to the vehicle and does not obscure the driver/rider's view of the road, or
- it can be operated by the driver/rider without touching any part of the phone, for example through the use of Bluetooth technology or voice activation

DRIVER's AIDS

(e.g. navigational GPS function, Speed Advisor app)

Drivers/riders may only use the navigational or GPS function of a phone while driving/riding if the phone is secured in a fixed mounting and doesn't obscure the driver's view of the road.

All other functions while driving/riding, a mobile phone cannot be used for anything else, including:

- Texting or audio texting
- Emailing
- Using social media
- Taking photos

- Video messaging
- Holding your phone in any way (in hand, on lap, between shoulder and ear).

Drivers/riders can only use their phone for any of these functions if their vehicle is parked out of the line of traffic.

These functions are not permitted when your vehicle is stopped, including waiting at traffic lights or stuck in traffic.

Learner and provisional (P1 and P2) licence holders

Learner, P1 and P2 drivers and motorcycle riders ARE NOT PERMITTED TO USE ANY FUNCTION OF A PHONE while driving/riding. This includes when waiting at traffic lights or stuck in traffic.

7 August, from Crime Stoppers NSW: Protect Your Car

Relying on the convenience of a car is something most of us take for granted. However, if your car or contents were stolen or damaged, the effects upon your family, work and finances could be devastating.

PROTECT YOUR CAR FROM BEING STOLEN:

- 🚘 NEVER leave your keys in the ignition when not in your car, even in your driveway at home
- 🚘 ALWAYS keep your car's doors and windows locked, including when driving
- 🚘 CONSIDER upgrading your car's security with a quality alarm or electronic immobiliser
- 🚘 NEVER leave your keys in plain view at home or in public places such as restaurants

PROTECT THE PROPERTY IN YOUR CAR

- 🚘 ALWAYS keep your doors and windows locked when out of your car
- 🚘 NEVER leave valuables such as mobile phones, handbags, GPS or spare change in plain view – even when parked at home
- 🚘 ALWAYS try to park in a well-lit or populated area
- 🚘 TRADIES always lock your toolboxes and try to avoid parking on the street at night

PROTECT YOURSELF WHEN SELLING YOUR CAR

- 🚘 NEVER advertise your home address when selling your car
- 🚘 ALWAYS view and record any potential buyers identification
- 🚘 NEVER let someone take your car for a test drive without supervision.

Small business owner Phoebe Bell believes scammers were watching her emails "for months" before they swiped \$10,000 from her homewares operation, Sage and Clare.

Earlier this year, the company placed a stock order with an unnamed supplier. There was nothing out of the ordinary about the interaction — Bell outlined the required stock and emailed back and forth for weeks about the order.

Trucks a scourge at intersection, Page 5

A REDUCTION in the number of NorthConnex trucks using a deadly intersection in Hornsby cannot come soon enough, say drivers who are concerned about the intersection.

Two pedestrians were killed at the intersection of Bridge and Peats Ferry roads between December and May.

Up to 2100 trucks use the intersection each week to access Hornsby Quarry, taking rocks and spoil from the huge NorthConnex tunnel project down to the quarry.

The plan is to fill the quarry by the end of the year — at which stage the trucks will stop accessing the site.

Motorist Richard McDonald said that could not come soon enough.

He said he had been blocked from driving through the intersection on a couple of occasions by trucks rushing through orange lights or stopping halfway across.

“On many occasions they have been seen to block all or part of the fire station exit area,” Mr McDonald said.

WAHROONGA

1 Police are asking for help to find a man after two girls, aged 11 and 12, were followed home from school at Woonona Ave. The man tried to start a conversation with the pair but the girls quickly walked away when they walked towards Wahroonga station last Thursday about 3.30pm. Kuring-gai police are searching for a man described as being of Indian or sub-continental appearance, aged between 30 and 40, about 160cm tall, of large build and wearing glasses. He was last seen wearing a navy woollen jumper and white and orange shorts.

HORNSBY

2 A 51-year-old Merrylands man has been charged after attempting to buy a restricted drug with a fake prescription at a pharmacy in Westfield Hornsby. Police were contacted by the pharmacy and spoke with the man about 6pm last Friday. Police also searched his vehicle and found a small amount of methamphetamine, commonly known as ice. He will face Fairfield Court on August 15.

3 An alleged shoplifter has been charged after being approached by police during a shoplifting operation at Westfield Hornsby. The police operation was held on July 26. Police have charged a 43-year-old South Granville man who was allegedly found with a stolen laptop.

4 Police are still investigating a shocking incident at Westfield Hornsby where a mother of three received a tirade of abuse inside a parents' room at the shopping centre. A man threatened to kill and dismember the woman on July 23 about 12.30pm in front of her children.

5 A 33-year-old man will face Hornsby Court on September 19 after allegedly being found with the drug ice at Cenotaph Park on Saturday about 2.15am.

6 Police are warning residents to be wary of a scam targeting vulnerable people after a man pretending to be a tradie and wearing a fluoro shirt approached an elderly woman at her Old Berowra Rd home last Thursday about 2pm. The man later cashed a cheque from the resident.

WAHROONGA

7 A 34-year-old South Coogee man has been charged with driving under the influence of an illicit drug. He was found unconscious behind the wheel on Junction Rd at Wahroonga on February 8. He crashed his car into another vehicle. No one was injured. He will face Hornsby Court on September 20.

SCHOOLS across Ku-ringgai have been earmarked for pedestrian safety upgrades.

An off-duty police sergeant who failed a random breath test in West Pennant Hills is due to face court later this month.

About 2.05pm yesterday, the sergeant was stopped at a random breath testing site on New Line Rd in West Pennant Hills.

The roadside test returned a positive result. The 55-year-old man was arrested and a subsequent breath analysis returned an alleged reading of 0.73. He has been charged with low-range drink driving.

He will appear in Hornsby Local Court on Thursday, August 30.

The duty status of the sergeant, who is attached to the Central Metropolitan Region, is under review.

11 August, from finance.nsw.gov.au: Public Warning – do not deal with Allan James Piggott



Consumers are warned not to deal with Allan James Piggott, also known as Allan Chisel. Mr Piggot contracts to do unlicensed and uninsured work under various unregistered business names. In many cases the work he does is defective.

Mr Piggott has recently been seeking concreting, paving and structural landscaping work in the Sydney suburbs of Blacktown, Seven Hills, St Clair, Rooty Hill, Minchinbury, Stanhope Gardens, Chatswood and on the Central Coast.

NSW Fair Trading Commissioner Rose Webb said Mr Piggott has been offending since 2006. A previous public warning was issued about him in February 2013.

“Mr Piggott is not and never has been a licensed contractor, yet he continues to enter into contracts to do residential building work,” said Ms Webb.

Mr Piggott is continuing to commit offences despite three prosecutions in 2013, 2015 and 2018.

A man has been injured following a serious motorcycle crash in Sydney's north overnight.

Just after midnight (Saturday 11 August 2018), emergency services were called to Clanville Road at Roseville, after reports a trailbike had hit a park car and crashed.

The rider, a 19-year-old man, was treated and taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a serious condition.

Officers from North Shore Police Area Command established a crime scene and are investigating the circumstances surrounding the crash.

The road remains closed.
