7 September, from Canberra Times: Police slam 'senseless' man over alleged drug driving

Police have blasted a "senseless" man who was allegedly caught driving under the influence of drugs twice in under two hours.

Officers stopped the 47-year-old man on London Circuit about 10.30am on Monday.

Police said the man returned a positive result for cannabis and methylamphetamine in a roadside drug test before being arrested and taken to City Police Station for further tests.

He was released about 11.30am and ordered not to drive for at least 12 hours.

Just 45 minutes later, at 12.15pm, police said they stopped the man again on Cooyong Street in Braddon.

He was driving the same vehicle and allegedly returned another positive result for cannabis and methylamphetamine in a roadside drug test.

The 47-year-old was taken for a second time to City Police Station, where he was charged with five traffic offences including two counts of drug driving.

He was bailed to attend the ACT Magistrates Court.

Acting Station Sergeant David Wills, ACT Policing's officer in charge of traffic operations, said the man showed a lack of regard for everyone else on the road.

"This driver's actions are senseless," Acting Station Sergeant Wills said.

"He has endangered other road users by driving with not one but two illicit drugs present in his system.

"After being served a direction not to drive a vehicle for 12 hours by police, this man was detected less than an hour later driving a vehicle.

"It is well known that impaired driving can significantly contribute to serious collisions and deaths on our roads."

Your details are then updated into the Police Computer System with contact numbers for all nominated persons in case of an emergency.

In addition to the next of kin, you can register your doctor, dentist or any other medical alert contacts that could help you in an emergency.

This information can assist the ambulance and police to contact a relative or other nominated person to inform them of your situation.

The NSW Police will give you a registered number along with a keyring and sticker to be placed near your home phone.

Fire and Rescue NSW said the southbound lanes were closed while the wires were cut and cleared. Kuring-gai police said there were reports a Bobcat on the back of the truck clipped the power lines.

Make fire survival plans now

WITH the bushfire danger period now in place, residents across the Hornsby region are being reminded to prepare a bush fire survival plan.

The bush fire danger period started on September 1 and runs through until March 31 which means landholders across the Hornsby region need a permit to burn certain fires.

Ku-ring-gai state Liberal MP Alister Henskens said it was also critical for residents to create or update their bush fire survival plan during this period.

“Whether or not you live near bushland, it is absolutely essential you plan ahead and safeguard your property by doing things like clearing gutters of leaves, maintaining gardens, and checking that your garden hoses can reach all corners of your property.”

PYMBLE

6 MONA Vale Rd in Pymble was thrown into traffic chaos on Monday following a multi-vehicle crash and truck fire. Emergency services were called to the scene and firefighters extinguished the fire. A large diesel spill was on the road and several power lines were down as a result of the accident. Paramedics treated several drivers involved in the crash. Nobody was seriously injured. The road was closed in both directions while crews were at the scene.

VIOLENT ATTACK

POLICE have charged a 41-year-old man with a raft of offences following an alleged violent altercation. Around 3.15pm on August 30, they said, a man was walking in Dalley's Rd, Naremburn, when he turned to see a man swinging a large stick. They said the man dropped the stick, grabbed hold of the victim and yelled incoherently at him. The victim fled and phoned triple-0. Police said they found the

alleged offender at a home in Dalley's Rd, brandishing a bottle above his head. Police entered the home and subdued the man. He was arrested and will face Hornsby Local Court.

Eggs are being recalled from shops in Sydney after a cluster of salmonella cases were uncovered.

NSW Food Authority on Saturday said 23 cases of salmonella enteritidis had been confirmed in the city, leading to egg supplier Eggz on the Run to voluntarily recall some products sold under the Glendenning Farm brand.

Consumers are advised not to consume any Glendenning Farm whole shell eggs sold in NSW with best before dates of September 8, 10, 15, 17, 22, 24, 29 or October 1.

Body Worn Video provides reassurance to communities across NSW of our improved ability to support victims, prevent, disrupt and respond to crime by directly recording criminal behaviour as close as possible to the time of it occurring.



NON-EMERGENCY

While sharing suggestive images or text messages may seem like innocent flirting or be considered funny for young people, sexting can have serious social and legal consequences.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

*Stay CALM, DELETE and REPORT – If you have sent a picture or video you regret to someone, ask them to delete it immediately. If it is posted online, untag yourself and report the post to the social media site so it can be removed. Ask friends you trust to help hunt down images and also report those images.

*Try to relax and talk to someone – If the video or image has spread, try to stay calm. You might like to talk to Kids Helpline on 1800 551 800 for advice to how to handle the situation.

Sometimes the Police need to become involved as with minors it may constitute the production and/or distribution of child pornography. If Police get involved, it's best to be honest. Tell them how the video or image was made and where it might have been sent/posted. They will want to know who was involved and whether there was consent from all involved. Their concern is preventing any harm to you and other young people.

Tip #3. CONTACT THE LOCAL FIRE SERVICE FOR HELP ASSESSING YOUR OWN PREMISE'S FIRE RISK AND KNOW HOW TO PROTECT IT. Prepare your BUSHFIRE SURVIVAL PLAN, EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN and EMERGENCY SURVIVAL KIT for you and your animals. Know: When, Where,

Who, What to take? Download the 'Bush Fire Emergency Plan' App.

Tip #5. PLEASE BE ALERT AROUND SCHOOLS DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAY PERIODS AND AT WEEKENDS. Report any suspicious activity or groups of youths. Phone School Security Unit: 1300 880 02.

Tip #6. FOR BUSINESSES, INCLUDE ARSON IN YOUR BUSINESS RISK ASSESSMENT PLAN AND INCLUDE ARSON RISK REDUCTION STRATEGIES IN YOUR RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN.

Tip #7. FOR BUSINESSES, ARE ALL YOUR FIRE EXITS IDENTIFIED, ACCESSIBLE, UNLOCKED, CLEAR OF BOXES?

Tip #8. KNOW ABOUT TOTAL FIRE BANS:

- CHECK THE RFS WEBSITE, OR PHONE RFS INFORMATION LINE ON 1800 679 737 TO FIND OUT IF THERE IS A TOTAL FIRE BAN IN PLACE.
- BEWARE SPARKS: BBQs, incinerators, welding, angle-grinders, cigarettes, etc.
- KNOW THE LAW: eg, to use an electric/gas BBQ you must have available "an immediate and continuous supply of water".
- TOTAL FIRE BAN & CURRENT FIRE DANGER CAN BE FOUND AT: www.rfs.nsw.gov.au.

Tip #10. KNOW YOUR LOCAL... [Why not google them?]

- COMMUNITY 'Farm FireWise' GROUPS (CFGs) supported by NSW Rural Fire Service. CFGs have planned strategies, build knowledgeunderstanding, are locally specific, establish 'telephone trees' and "build strong social networks with neighbours".
- COMMUNITY FIRE UNITS (CFUs) supported by Fire & Rescue NSW. "Being a CFU member is about preparation, prevention and protection from bushfires".
- NEIGHBOURHOOD SAFER PLACES (NSPs) (NSW Rural Fire Service). "An NSP is a place of last resort for people during a bush fire & is an identified building or space within the community that can provide a higher level of protection."
