02 January, from NSW Police: A cyclist has suffered critical injuries after a crash at Mt Colah this morning.

Emergency services were called to Kuring Gai Chase Road after a crash between his cycle and a station wagon (between the Bobbin Head and Kalkari information centres) about 11.15am (Wednesday 2 January 2019). The cyclist, believed to be aged in his 40s, was treated at the scene by NSW Ambulance paramedics and a team from the Careflight Helicopter. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital

by paramedics under police escort.

The driver of the station wagon, an 18-year-old man, has been taken for mandatory testing.

The Crash Investigation Unit is conducting inquiries and has appealed for anyone with information, or dash cam vision, about the incident to contact them via **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000** or https://nsw.crimestoppers.com.au. Information is treated in strict confidence. The public is reminded not to report crime via NSW Police social media pages.

02 January, from The Telegraph: Cameras targeting mobile-using motorists to come into effect

New cameras capable of detecting motorists illegally using mobile phones in cars are expected to come into effect on NSW roads this month. The world-first technology — which uses artificial intelligence and can operate in both fixed and mobile locations, 24 hours a day and in all weather conditions — "penetrate" through windshields, capturing drivers sneakily using their mobiles at the wheel.

08 January, from Muogamarra Rural Fire Brigade (via Berowra Community Group): BREAK AND ENTER - PLEASE READ

About 8.18am on Sunday 6/1/2019 Muogamarra Rural Fire Brigade was paged to assist with storm damage in Berowra Heights. When members arrived at our fire station on Glendale Road Cowan, they discovered that a part of the station had been broken into and power tools and electrical equipment stolen.

Some of the items stolen from our fire station include:

- Honda self propelled lawn mower
- Oleo-Mac backpack blower
- Echo leaf blower
- Stihl Magnum chainsaw
- Oleo-Mac polesaw
- Stihl polesaw
- Stihl brushcutter
- Gerni pressure washer

Value of the stolen items at this stage is approximately \$10,000.

Most of the items are marked with Muogamarra "brigade colours" of red/white/green (as pictured below). Serial numbers and engravings have been provided to NSW Police.

There has been a further attempt to break into our fire station overnight on Sunday 6/1/2019 and Police are investigating.

We are now seeking assistance from the wider community to keep an eye out for our equipment in the hope of getting some of it back. Our volunteers work their backsides off fundraising, maintaining and using the equipment and to have someone break into our VOLUNTEER rural fire brigade station and steal it is heartbreaking. This also serves as a timely reminder to RFS Brigades that thieves are out and about trying to steal our equipment.

Our crew continued with a 12 hour shift on Sunday assisting with storm damage jobs and tarping homes in Berowra Heights. This in no way affects our ability to respond to emergencies or assist our neighbouring RFS Brigades.

08 January, from Neighbourhood Watch Victoria Inc: Preventing home burglary - don't make it easy for a thief (Video)

Like most people, you probably have a "Plan B" in case you accidentally lock yourself out of your house. Perhaps you hide a key in a safe place, or maybe even leave a rear window or door unlocked or slightly ajar. Hey, no-one will know, right? Wrong!

More than 30% of home burglaries in 2017 involved no sign of forced entry. Around 19% of victims confirmed that offenders entered via an unlocked door or window. Eagle-eyed thieves know all the tricks in the book. Every place you've thought of to hide a key, they have too. Every secret entry point you have - they know them too. If it's easy for you to get inside your locked home, it's also going to be easy for a thief.

05 January, from SBS: Opening your car door like Dutch people do could save lives


Have you heard of the 'Dutch reach'?

'Dooring' is a daily danger for cyclists in cities. It occurs when the occupant of a parked vehicle opens their door in the path of an approaching cyclist. The cyclist collides with the door, falls off their bike, resulting in injury or sometimes even

death. While there is a lot of talk about the need for awareness-raising campaigns or designated 'door zones' for cyclists to steer clear of, the Dutch have a simple and effective way of avoiding car dooring accidents.

It's called the 'Dutch reach', and it involves opening the car door by reaching across the body with the hand that is further away from the handle - the opposite to the hand you'd usually open the door with. This simple change forces you to look over your shoulder as you open the door, making you more aware of any approaching cyclists.

03 January, from NSW Police Force: A teenager has been arrested after two men were allegedly stabbed on Sydney's Lower North Shore today.

Emergency services were called to a religious centre on Greville Street, near Fullers Road, Chatswood, just after 12.30pm (Thursday 3 January 2019), following reports of a stabbing. The two injured men, whose ages are not known, were taken to Royal North Shore Hospital. One of the men is in a critical condition.

Officers from North Shore Police Area Command attended and arrested a 16-yearold boy. He was taken to Chatswood Police Station where he is assisting with inquiries.

02 January, from CareFlight: CYCLIST CRITICAL AFTER CRASH NEAR BOBBIN HEAD TODAY

A cyclist has been transported to Royal North Shore Hospital in a critical condition

this afternoon after he collided with a vehicle near Mount Colah earlier this morning.

CareFlight's rapid response helicopter was tasked just before 11.30am, to attend a collision between a male cyclist, believed to be in his 50s, and a car on Kur-ing-gai Chase Road. Thanks to some helpful members of the public who stopped to offer assistance once the crew landed at nearby Apple Tree Bay boat ramp, the medical team were transported the short distance to the crash site.

According to first responders on the scene, the cyclist collided with an oncoming vehicle, landing on the bonnet of the car, sustaining critical head injuries and suspected upper limb fractures and injuries on impact.

NSW Police, Fire and Rescue and Ambulance were also tasked to the scene. CareFlight medical team intubated the man before transferring him to an ambulance for the journey to Royal North Shore Hospital by road. He is in a critical but stable condition.

02 January, from Neighbourhood Watch - Normanhurst: We received this in an email today:


