4 March, from the dailytelegraph.com.au: Ku-ring-gai police welcome new commander Chris Keane



The Hornsby Shire has some of the lowest crime rates in the state, but that doesn't mean Superintendent Chris Keane has any plans of putting his feet up during his time in charge of Ku-ring-gai police.

Supt Keane took over as the new Ku-ring-gai police commander late last year following the departure of Superintendent Jenny Scholz, who is now in charge of Quakers Hills police.

"I started at the beginning of November and I'm settling in well and really enjoying the area," he told the Advocate.

"I have been looking to get back to a police area command for a couple of years now and the opportunity came up to come to Hornsby."

Supt Keane has a long history working in the NSW Police force stretching back to 1996, including time working in counter terrorism and most recently radio operations.

Supt Keane has introduced some fresh ways to prevent crime in the area.

"In the last month we have just reintroduced bike patrols to try and increase our visibility in the area."

He said the bike patrols would be used across the region from Gordon right up to Brooklyn.

When asked if some of the communities on the edge of the command, such as Canoelands and Brooklyn, needed closer attention from police he said the response times were already very good.

Supt Keane, who grew up in The Hills and lives in western Sydney, said when he was not working he enjoyed spending time with his family and watching AFL — holding season tickets to the Swans and Giants.

4 March, from Kuring Gai Police Area Command: Message at Gordon Baptist Church

We want our community to be and feel safe.

We want our community to be comfortable in approaching police and speaking with us.

We are here for you, the community. We are here to help!

This was the message shared today at Gordon Baptist church where we addressed between 60 and 70 people from China, Vietnam, Japan, Korea and Iran.

There were many who have been in Australia for less than a year and in many cases, this was their first up close and personal discussion with a police officer.

We talked about general policing duties, personal safety, internet scams, text scams and mail theft and how best to minimise becoming a victim. We also addressed what to do when an emergency vehicle drives up behind you...and what NOT to do.

We discussed the importance of calling triple zero (000) in an emergency and how and when to report crime through the Police Assistance line on 131444 and Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Road Safety Quiz: Is this fully licensed motorcyclist in the picture lane filtering legally?

- a) No
- b) Yes
- c) Yes, under certain circumstances



ANSWER: c) Yes, under certain circumstances

A motorbike rider can legally lane filter, which is to ride between other stopped or slowly moving vehicles that are being driven in two adjacent marked lanes (broken or continuous) in the same direction as the rider, as long as the below criteria are fulfilled:

- the motorbike is being ridden at a speed not exceeding 30km/h
- the motorcyclist holds a full licence
- the motorcyclist isn't riding next to the kerb, next to parked vehicles or in a school zone
- it's safe to do so

Motorcyclists should always look out for pedestrians and bicycle riders, and are warned not to lane filter around trucks and buses.

HORNSBY

A 27-year-old Hornsby man was left bloody and bruised after being attacked by a group of men near The Hornsby Inn on Tuesday night. After leaving the inn about 11.30pm, the man was attacked by a group of five or six males, described as being of Asian appearance. His headphones were stolen and his phone was destroyed in the incident. Police are asking for witnesses to the attack to come forward.

HORNSBY

A 36-year-old Merrylands man is suspected of stealing \$18,500 worth of equipment from Kennards Hire Hornsby. The man hired two large airconditioning units, two generators, an airless sprayer, air compressor and compound saw on Tuesday, February 12. The store contacted police after he failed to return the items. Police said the man has since left the country.

MT COLAH

A Central Coast man has been arrested for assaulting a police officer on the side of the M1 after he got into an argument with his partner. Police were called to the M1 about 6.30pm on Sunday following multiple reports of an intoxicated man on the motorway. When police arrived, they found a 33-year-old man in the shrubbery. Police said he appeared to be heavily intoxicated. He told officers he had an argument with his wife who left him on Pennant Hills Rd. Police will allege he became aggressive and kneed an officer in the groin. He was arrested and taken to Hornsby police station, where he allegedly attempted to headbutt another officer. He will appear in court at a future date on multiple charges including assaulting a police officer and resisting arrest.

WAHROONGA

A Wahroonga man, aged in his 30s, has been defrauded \$7200 in a scam. Police say he was called by someone pretending to be from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). The man was told there was a warrant out for his arrest due to an

outstanding debt. He was asked to purchase iTunes cards worth \$7200 and he gave the scammer the code on the back.

A white Toyota Kluger was stolen from a carpark at Westfield Hornsby on Tuesday between 11.20am and noon. A witness saw two men take the car before turning right on Muriel St.

KILLARA



TURRAMURRA

the car pulled up near a dead end. Police saw smoke billowing out of both the front and rear brake ducts. After a roadside breath test, the man was taken to Hornsby police station where a breath analysis returned a reading of 0.086 and he was charged.

Trystien Caceres, aged 19, was last seen at a home on Ryries Parade, Cremorne on Wednesday evening (Wednesday 27 February 2019).

Officers from North Shore Police Area Command were notified of his disappearance the following day and commenced a search without success.

Police and family members hold concerns for his welfare.

Trystien is described as being of Caucasian appearance, with a medium build, approximately 180-185cm tall, with brown hair, and brown eyes.


