Road rage - Here's a few tips on how best to avoid it.

When merging into another lane, indicate well in advance. Don't push in. If the other driver won't let you in then so what? ... another driver will.

Why not let the person wanting to merge into your lane come in? It's a kind gesture and remember, a smile goes a long way and you help minimise the chance of a collision.

Now, we realise not everyone has grasped these important driving skills but if each of us practices them, our roads will be a safer place

05 August, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command [edited for local content only]: An international licence holder – who was caught driving at 100km/h in Pymble – is only one of several people caught doing twice the limit at the weekend, shocking Traffic and Highway Patrol officers.

About 5pm on Friday 2 August 2019, a 20-year-old man, driving on an international licence, was issued a traffic infringement notice for motor vehicle exceed speed more than 45km/h after he was allegedly detected travelling 101km/h in a 50km/h zone in Bannockburn Street, Pymble. The man's licence was also suspended.

02 August, from Ku-ring-gai command: Ku-ring-gai PAC Week in Review

- * A time to remind elderly family members not to accept any unsolicited offers of roof repairs or tree removal from unknown persons who may knock on their door. A well known male from out of the area was spotted looking over fences around the **Wahroonga/Waitara** area. The male who is known for targeting elderly and vulnerable victims to carry out unsolicited work at their homes and charge high rates was stopped and spoken to by police. He was unable to provide police with a reasonable reason to be in the area apart from 'looking for work'. He and his vehicle were subsequently searched, after which he left the area.
- * A 29 yo male from Green Point was stopped in his vehicle travelling north on the M1. A search of his vehicle uncovered over \$1,000 worth of grocery items including a large amount of packaged meat. Checks revealed he had stolen the groceries from a supermarket in **St Ives** earlier that day. He was charged with Larceny & GIC and has been bail refused.
- * A 28 yo female from **Waitara** was caught shoplifting a large amount of Clothing from **Bonds**, **Hornsby** by concealing them in an eco bag in her pram. The female was issued a Court attendance Notice and will attend Hornsby Local Court later in the month.
- * A search of a vehicle in **Hornsby** near the train station which was occupied by 4 individuals from out of the area uncovered numerous spray cans in a number of back packs. In addition, police located house breaking implements and clothing

belonging to a company that conducts repair work within the rail network. All four individuals which are known for graffiti offences were charged with a multitude of offences including Goods suspected stolen, Armed with intent commit indictable offence, Possess housebreaking implements and Malicious Damage.

* A 22 yo female from Morisset Park was stopped for an RBT travelling north through **Pymble**. The female failed to produce a licence and when questioned further admitted she did not have one after being disqualified from driving twice this year. A drug test was also carried out which returned a positive result. The female was charged with driving whilst disqualified with further charges pending drug results.



31 July, from Ku-ring-gai command: Your assistance is required please.

30 July, from Ku-ring-gai command: Break and enters along with stealing from motor vehicles continue to be prevalent within the command.

Some of the suburbs where this type of crime occurred in the last two weeks are Asquith, Brooklyn, Dural, Galston, Gordon, Hornsby, Killara, Normanhurst, North Wahroonga, Pymble, St Ives, Thornleigh, Turramurra, Warrawee, West Pymble and Westleigh.

- If you see someone or something suspicious then report it to police at the time
- This is a timely reminder to lock your homes, your doors and windows.
- Set your house alarms if you have them and watch out for your neighbours.
- Consider sensor lighting and installing CCTV cameras. Whilst the cameras
 don't stop all crime, they can assist police in identification of the thief or
 would be thief.
- Keep your wire security doors locked.
- Don't allow any person you don't know or trust inside your home.
- · Lock your vehicles, even if they are garaged.
- Lock your garage doors.
- Don't have valuables showing from inside your car.

06 August, from ABC News: Knox swimming teacher charged with possessing child abuse material

A teacher from exclusive Sydney private school Knox Grammar has been charged with possessing child abuse material after a mobile phone was found at the school's aquatic centre.

Nick Warby, 30, the school's director of aquatic sports, was arrested on Monday afternoon. Police had searched his home and found six USB drives and allegedly found substances, believed to be ice and GHB, in his car. Four phones and a laptop were also seized from his home, car and from Knox Grammar. Mr Warby was charged with possession of child abuse material and drug possession and today appeared in Hornsby Local Court, where his parents watched from the public gallery.

06 August, from ABC News: Mobile phone payments ban at takeaway drivethroughs spark motorist backlash

Victoria Police inflamed public outrage on Friday when they posted a social media quiz to illustrate that a fine of \$484 and the loss of four demerit points could be imposed on motorists who used a phone to pay for food from a car.

"If you intend to use your mobile phone to pay at the drive-through window, apply the hand brake, switch the engine off and then access your mobile phone," Victoria Police wrote in a social media post. "In doing so, you are not considered driving."



30 July, from Neighbourhood Watch - Galston, Glenorie, Arcadia & Dural: From Senior Constable Mitchell | Your Crime update in a nut shell

Over the last two (2) week period were only two (2) reported incidents in the Galston, Dural suburbs. Both related to "Steal from motor vehicle". This equates to around 2% of offences in our command over the same period of time. I note that a couple of Facebook reports have been made with regards to suspicious vehicles in your area. It was good to read that those incidents were reported to police at or near the time. There have been no recent reports of sightings of drones in the area, but if you see one, please report it to police as soon as practically possible.

Even though the crime in your area is significantly less than the incidents throughout the command, rest assured that we are patrolling your area regularly.

What can you continue to do?

- Keep being vigilant
- Keep reporting as soon as possible
- Keep being on the lookout for yourselves and your neighbours

How to report crime:

- Triple zero "000" for emergencies or life-threatening situations
- The Police Assistance Line "131444" for non-emergencies
- Crime Stoppers "1800 333 000" to provide crime information

From "Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for New Neighbours":

Tip #1. IDENTIFY YOUR 6 IMMEDIATE NEIGHBOURS — 2 TO YOUR LEFT, 2 TO YOUR RIGHT, ACROSS FROM AND BEHIND YOU. Make an effort to get to know them and swap contact details.

Tip #2. SUGGEST AN ARRANGEMENT WITH NEIGHBOURS FOR WHEN ANY OF YOU ARE ON VACATION, eg for clearing the local newspapers, putting out & retrieving garbage bins, clearing mailboxes, parking in driveways/spaces, etc.

Tip #9. CONSIDER HAVING THE LOCKS CHANGED/UPDATED/RE-KEYED.

RE-PROGRAMME NEW ALARM CODES FOR THE BURGLAR ALARM.

Tip #10. HAVE THE BURGLAR ALARM SYSTEM CHECKED. CLEAN THE SENSORS. CHECK BATTERIES. CONSIDER NEW ATTACHMENTS—there are some amazing new technologies available! Eg balcony sensors, broken window sensors. Spray insect products around sensors to prevent spider webs.

Tip #20. REMOVE VALUABLES FROM VIEW IN YOUR CAR, ESPECIALLY WHEN PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY OR ON THE STREET. This includes any GARAGE REMOTE CONTROL, as these can be used to get into your home at a later time.
