e.g. hospitality staff working at restaurants; pubs and clubs, or anyone attending places of worship




Sick and going for care or to get tested

01 August, from Ku-ring-gai command:



31 July, from NSW Road Safety: Your legal BAC depends on your licence category and the type of vehicle you drive.

Counting drinks to guess your BAC is difficult and often inaccurate because alcohol affects people differently and alcohol concentrations vary between drinks. If you've been drinking, the best decision is not to drive.

31 July, from NSW Health: Following a growing number of COVID-19 cases, NSW Health is asking people across key suburbs to come forward for testing if they have any symptoms of COVID-19 at all.

Please check <u>here</u> to see if you live in, or have recently visited, one of these areas for increased testing. Even if your have mild symptoms, such as a runny nose or scratchy throat, get tested immediately and isolate at home.

31 July, from NSW Health: CHANGES TO NSW GYMS

From 12.01am Saturday, 1 August all gyms and fitness centres in NSW must have a dedicated COVID-19 Safe Hygiene Marshal on duty at all times as well as a registered COVID-19 Safety Plan

COVID-19 Safe Hygiene Marshals will play a critical role in maintaining social distancing, cleaning equipment after use, making sanitiser available and ensuring all attendees details are recorded.

28 July, Posted on behalf of NSW Health: If you are directed to self-isolate when entering New South Wales from Victoria, you must remain at your place of residence or accommodation for 14 days from the time you entered NSW.

Breaches of the public health order can result in a maximum penalty of imprisonment for 6 months or a fine of up to \$11,000 (or both). You could also incur a further \$5,500 fine each day the offence continues. Anyone in the community can report public health order breaches via Crime Stoppers.



02 August, Shared with permission from the South Turramurra Community group:



31 July, from ABC Sydney: Woolworths has issued a statement saying its customers are "strongly encouraged to wear face coverings" in NSW due to increasing numbers of COVID-19 cases in the state. [edited]

Customers, employees and visitors across all Woolworths Group stores and sites in NSW and the ACT will be "strongly encouraged" to wear face coverings from Monday 3 August.

31 July, from Ausgrid: SAFETY ALERT: The heavy rain may have passed but saturated soil and wind can still cause trees to fall on powerlines.

Fallen trees or branches can hide damaged wires. If you see see fallen powerlines always assume they're live, never approach them, stay 8metres away.



31 July, from NSW Police: Two men have been charged with a burnout following an investigation by Strike Force Puma.

About 9am on Saturday (25 July 2020), the driver of a modified bronze Nissan 200sx sedan allegedly conducted a burnout, where the driver maintained a sustained loss of traction and performed numerous drifting manoeuvres on **Cattai Ridge Road**, **Glenorie**. After a video was posted on social media, officers from Strike Force Puma commenced an investigation. On Tuesday 28 July 2020, officers spoke to the driver, a 20-year-old man, at a Minto home. The man was issued a court attendance notice for committing a burnout and will appear at Parramatta Local Court on Wednesday 9 September 2020. His driver's licence was also suspended and confiscated. Officers identified the owner/publisher of the social media page, a 33-year-old man, who was charged with urge etc view activity contrary to subsection (1), sustained loss of traction. He was issued a court attendance notice to attend Parramatta local Court on Wednesday 23 September 2020. Strike Force Puma was formed 2018 to target drivers with a history of

licence offences and a repeated history of drink and drug driving offences, and drivers with extreme and erratic behaviours.

31 July, from NSW Police: Redfern RES detectives have executed 11 search warrants across Sydney and charged 16 people as part of an investigation into the supply of cocaine and MDMA. [edited]

In December last year, officers from Redfern Region Enforcement Squad established Strike Force Caladenia to investigate the supply of prohibited drugs – mainly cocaine and MDMA – across Sydney. So far during the investigation, detectives have charged five people for drug-related offences. Following extensive inquiries, strike force investigators executed 11 search warrants at locations at Bondi Beach, North Bondi, Maroubra, Chippendale, Randwick, Sydney CBD, Alexandria, Darlington, Earlwood, Balgowlah and **Pennant Hills** from 6am yesterday (Wednesday 29 July 2020).

A 27-year-old man was arrested at **Pennant Hills** and charged with supply prohibited drug (indictable quantity), possess prohibited drug, deal with property proceeds of crime (greater than \$100,000) and possess/attempt anabolic or androgenic steroidal agent. He appeared at Burwood Local Court yesterday, where he was formally refused bail to reappear at the same court on Friday 7 August 2020.

And in the comments: Police are coming out today to view my CCTV and requested that anyone else that has footage or has been affected to call the Police Assistance Line (PAL) 131 444 and report it. The more information they have, the easier it will be to find these 2 thieves.



29 July, from ismyairbagsafe.com.au: Australian Governments are deregistering vehicles fitted with faulty Alpha type Takata airbags.

This could be extended to all faulty Takata airbags. Visit <u>ismyairbagsafe.com.au</u> because a faulty airbag can kill you.

29 July, Shared with permission from the Turramurra and Wahroonga Community group:

This afternoon whilst on a walk with my dog. I was approached by a young man, approximately 28-35 years, who asked me for directions at the corner of Bangalla and Warrawee avenue. He asked me for directions to a location in Wahroonga. During the interaction, he asked me personal questions such as where I lived, whether I had a boyfriend. He also tried to stop me from leaving the interaction. When I tried to walk away he asked me to help him navigate to his destination. I said, "no, I am not comfortable". I walked away. Further down Hastings road, I noticed he was following me in his older silver/grey Kia Carnival, approximately 1999 year. I thought to share this for the safety of others and our youth as this is near schools.

And in the comments: 180-185cm, dark skinned, wearing trackies, brown hair,

slight beard.

Taken from "Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips to Protect your Identity"

Tip #1: Consider using a third party payment system for internet transactions, such as PayPal, in order to avoid entering credit card details. Consider having another credit card with a low credit limit to be used specifically for internet purchases, or for overseas.

Tip #5: Encrypt and password protect all sensitive files. Consider encrypting your device. Use encrypted messaging systems (such as Signal). Consider using Virtual

Private Networks (VPN). Forget wi-fi networks once used. Browse using 'incognito' mode, in order to stop the logging of browser history.

Tip #8: Shred any unneeded document (statements, accounts) that has your personal details (eg signature, birth date), as well as credit cards and loyalty cards. Your local Neighbourhood Watch group may have a shredder to borrow – ask your CPO. For generic letters, simply tear out your name/address, before recycling. Keep receipts & always check statements.




