May 22, NSW Police Force

Officers from the <u>Police Transport Command - NSW Police Force</u> have arrested a man after he was allegedly found with illicit drugs in North Sydney yesterday. About 9.15pm (Thursday 21 May 2015), PTC officers, with the assistance of the Dog Unit, were patrolling North Sydney Railway Station when they spoke to a man at the ticket barriers.

The man handed police cannabis he was allegedly carrying, before police searched him and seized quantities of methamphetamine, cocaine, oxycodone, alprazolam, scales, and other items.

The 56-year-old was arrested at the railway station, before being taken to North Sydney Police Station, where he was charged with deem supply prohibited drug, and three counts of possess prohibited drug.

He was granted bail, to appear at Downing Centre Local Court on Friday 26 June 2015.

These days, criminals don't necessarily need to meet you in person to steal from you. Scammers can pretend to be from your bank or a service provider, claiming you owe money. On the surface, these claims can appear to be genuine.

1. Share a secret code word:



- b) The red car




The correct answer is a) The green car must give way to the red car as it is entering a road from a car park (or road related area).

May 20, DEBIT AND CREDIT CARD FRAUD (1/2): Your debit and credit cards hold highly personal information that can be 'cloned' or stolen if they're not safeguarded. Scammers can use spyware to get your card details. Protect both your card and PIN.

- DON'T lose sight of your debit and credit cards.
- INSIST the transaction be done in front of you.
- DON'T share your PIN with anyone.
- COVER your hand when entering your PIN.
- CHANGE your PIN regularly.


DEBIT AND CREDIT CARD FRAUD (2/2): Follow these tips to protect your debit or credit card account:

- REQUEST registered mail or pick up from the branch for replacement cards and PIN information.
- SECURELY dispose of banking information, bills and expired/unwanted cards preferably by shredding all documents.
- ALWAYS check your financial statements against your purchases. If you see something that doesn't look right, contact your financial institution immediately.
- USE recommended electronic payment enablers when buying online.
- INSTALL and maintain anti-virus/anti-malware software on your devices.

May 19, Waitara school teacher arrested in Brisbane for alleged child grooming:

A WAITARA Public School teacher has been charged with online grooming offences after he allegedly flew to Brisbane on the weekend to meet a 14-year-old girl for sex.

Peter Bosma, 50 was intercepted by detectives from the State Crime Command's Taskforce Argos after he arrived in Brisbane on Saturday.

Police allege Bosma used the internet in an attempt to meet the girl for sexual activity but he was unaware that he was in fact engaging with a Taskforce Argos investigator posing as a 14-year-old girl.

DOCTORS under constant threat of attack are forced to sedate out-of-control ice addicts with doses that would kill a normal person.

"The doses are six times what we'd give the average person," Gosford and Wyong hospitals head of emergency departments Dr Kate Porges said.

May19, IDENTITY THEFT (2/2): If your identity has been stolen it can take months to reclaim, and the impact can last for years. Scammers will go to great lengths to steal your personal details. This includes fake surveys and job listings, phoney fraud alerts, and hacking into your online systems. Some have been known to pay people to steal mail to collect personal information in letters.

Protect your password

- DON'T use the same password for all your devices or access systems.
- DON'T use names or words easily linked to you (eg: family, pet or school names) in your password.
- CHANGE your password regularly.
- DON'T give your password to anyone.

Protect your computer or mobile device

- INSTALL reliable anti-virus protection for all your computers and mobile devices.
- UPDATE your anti-virus protection regularly.
- DISABLE unwanted applications if you don't use it, lose it.

ROTARY CLUB HANDS OUT TOP HONOURS

RECOVERING just under \$1million worth of stolen goods and making an associated eight arrests has earned one police officer a community award.

Senior Constable Kelly Robertson, from the Kuringgai LAC, was awarded a Rotary Pride of Workmanship award for uncovering an international crime syndicate behind numerous thefts and bringing the culprits to justice.

The award was presented by the Rotary Club of Waitara at a presentation night on Monday last week.

BEROWRA A man was arrested after he was allegedly found with a shortened shotaun and a flick knife during a police search on Friday night. Two men, aged 48 and 32, were spoken to by officers from the Police Transport Command near Berowra station about 9.45pm. Police searched the older man and allegedly found the shotgun, knife, ammunition and a substance believed to be an illegal drug in his backpack. They also allegedly located more than \$4500 in cash. The man was charged with possessing an unauthorised prohibited firearm, possessing or using a prohibited weapon without permit, custody of a knife in a public place and possessing ammunition without holding a licence.

Raman was arrested after he was allegedly found in a drug-affected state in a disabled toilet at Mark Taylor Oval on Saturday. Police searched the 37-year-old man and allegedly located a quantity of the drug ice. He was charged with possessing a prohibited drug.
