20 January: Hornsby Police news, 20/1/14 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: High range drink driving

Time/Date: About 2.10am on Sunday the 19th Place: Alexanria parade, x Romsey street, Waitara

Vehicle 1: Hyundai Getz Driver 1: 36 year old female

Details: Witnesses have seen a Hyundai Getz drive across the roundabout at the above intersection and go through a fence towards the railway line, a short time later a female is seen to try to push the car out of the grass area. Police have been called. Witnesses pointed out the driver who was then spoken to by police. A roadside breath test was allegedly positive for alcohol. A subsequent test gave a result of .166. The female allegedly made admissions to consuming 15 Vodka and Orange drinks earlier that evening. Her license was suspended by police and she was charged.

Court: The female is to appear at the Hornsby local Court on the 27th of March charged with Driving with a High Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol

Incident: Child run over in driveway.

Time/Date: About 1pm on Friday the 17th

Place: home in Wahroonga

Details: A mother was reversing her car from the driveway of her home. The matter is still being investigated however it appears in the confusion the child, a 1 year old boy was thought to have been in the car but was unfortunately at the rear of the car. As the car has reversed the mother felt a bump and stopped to see her son with extensive injuries. A passing motorist assisted and the child was taken to the Sydney Adventist hospital for treatment and eventually to Westmead Children's hospital where the boy was pronounced deceased. Investigations are continuing.

How to protect yourself from fraudsters

- Never give out contact details or financial information to strangers or to businesses that should already know your details.
- Never send money to someone you don't know.
- Walk away from job adverts that ask for money in advance.
- Shred anything containing your personal or bank details don't just bin it.

- Check bank and credit card statements regularly and let your bank know immediately if there are any entries you don't recognise.
- Often, you can't get lost money back, particularly if you have handed over cash. If you have paid by credit card you have more protection, and if you used a debit card you may be able to ask your bank for a chargeback.

18 January, from our neighbouring North Shore command: POLICE RENEW APPEAL FOR INFORMATION FOLLOWING SERIOUS ASSAULT IN NAREMBURN LAST YEAR

North Shore Detectives are appealing for information that may assist them in

identifying those who are responsible for the alleged assault of an Anglican Minister in Naremburn in November last year.

Police were called to Willoughby Road, Naremburn on Saturday 9th November in response to reports that a man was being assaulted by a number of youths at around 9:30pm. The incident occurred after the Minister went to the aid of a young pizza delivery driver who had been allegedly approached by a group of youths who had taken his pizza from him. A physical altercation occurred between three of the youths and the minister which left the minister suffering several broken ribs, cuts, bruising and a suspected broken jaw. The youths were last seen running south on Willoughby Road.



Police are interested to speak with two of the youths depicted in these photos as investigators believe they may be able to assist them with their enquiries.

15 January: Hornsby Police news, 15/1/14 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: Pedestrian crash

Time/Date: About 10am on Saturday the 11th

Place: St Ives shops car park.

Details: A 21 year old male was walking across the pedestrian crossing at the time he was paying attention to his mobile phone. A car has hit the pedestrian and run over his foot. The car only described as a red car did not stop. Police have seen the 21 year old and have viewed CCTV from the local shops, but were not able to identify the red car. The male was taken to Hornsby hospital with a suspected broken foot.

Time/Date: About 2.50pm on Wednesday the 8th

Place: Bobbin Head road, Turramurra

Vehicle 1: Toyota Corolla. Driver 1: 22 year old male.

Details: The Corolla was detected on Lazer to be travelling at an alleged 88km/h in a 50 speed zone, the car was caused to stop and the driver spoken to. He received a ticket for speeding over 30km/h above the speed limit.

Details: Police have driven past a unit block and have seen a male striking at a for sale sign. Police stopped and spoke to the male where admissions were made to allegedly slashing the sign with a knife. The male was arrested and charged with Malicious Damage.

Time/Date: About 9.30am on Saturday the 11th

Place: Alice street, Turramurra

Details: Police were called to the area due to a break and enter offence. A male person was seen leaving the area. Police have patrolled the surrounding streets and stopped and spoke to a male. The male a 38 year old was searched and in his backpack police found a white power which police will allege is Methylaphetamine. The male was charged with possess a prohibited drug and is to face Hornsby Court.

Incident: Tazer found

Details: Police have executed a search warrant at the location and found a tazer

device. This was seized and inquiries are still being made into ownership.

Place: An aged care facility in Myra street, Wahroonga

Details: Person/s unknown have stolen a handbag and its contents from a bedside drawer at the facility. It was owned by an 88 year old lady.

Place: Bobbin Head road, Pymble

Details: Person/s unknown have used a master or jiggler key to open mail boxes at a unit complex. Several boxes had mail taken. It is believed a jiggler type key was used as there was not damage to the locks. It is presumed the offenders are after personal information or banking statements and credit cards.

Details: Person/s unknown have entered the home presumably by an open door. A small amount of jewellery was taken.

Details: A home was broken into via a ground floor rear door. An amount of jewellery was taken by the offenders.

Place: Berowra Railway station.

Details: A witness has seen 3 males all described as Caucasian in appearance about 173 cm tall with T shirts or balaclavas covering their faces. The males were seen to go to a train carriage which had terminated at the station and commence tagging the train carriage. Police were called. At this time the males have spotted the witness and have fled in a car described as either an Audi or a BMW about a mid 80's model. Police have attended but could not locate the car or the males.

Incident: Fraudulent scripts.

Place: Several pharmacies in the Hornsby area.

Details: A doctor's office in Chatswood had a prescription pad used to forge a script. A male has then tried various pharmacies in the Hornsby area to fill the prescription, which had been made out for Alprazolan. The male did not get it filled as the pharmacies were suspicious of the male. CCTV is being viewed which shows the male.

15 January, from the North Shore Times: Police find sophisticated hydroponic set up in Turramurra home on Sydney's north shore.

Police say a search of a cream-rendered Federation cottage on Turramurra Ave at 6.20pm on Tuesday turned up a crop of 170 hydroponically-grown cannabis plants worth \$350,000.

The rental property, with an overgrown garden, is surrounded by neat homes with manicured lawns, on a street that is a popular parking spot for local commuters. An illegal electricity diversion was also found at the home and a 22-year-old man faced Hornsby Local Court today, charged with cultivating a commercial quantity of drugs.

From our neighbouring North Shore command on 18 January: REMINDER TO SECURE YOUR CAR AND HOME FOLLOWING REPORTS OF THEFTS - LINDFIELD/ ROSEVILLE

North Shore LAC Police have received a number of reports over the last week of thefts from vehicles in the **Lindfield and Roseville west** areas. Police are investigating a number of incidents where items have been taken from vehicles that have been parked on the street. Police urge residents not to leave any valuable items inside their vehicles, even loose change can encourage would be thieves to take a closer look inside your car.

It is also important to be mindful of your home security particularly over the summer months and warm evenings. Ensure your ground floor doors and windows are secure and locked whilst you are home and particularly at night. Consider installing sensor lights to the side walkways of your home as it discourages people from accessing your property as they will be seen easily.

It is important to be mindful that if you see anything or anyone who is acting suspiciously in or around your neighbourhood you should contact Police.

From the government's StaySmartOnline: Adobe leaked credentials checker - http://adobe.cynic.al/

What is this about? Adobe got hacked and about 150 million people's account details have been leaked.

Why does this matter? Adobe didn't store the passwords securely and you should work on the assumption that they have been cracked. Popular wisdom suggests people use the same password on multiple websites.

What should I do? A visit to the 'Adobe Leaked Credentials Checker website is suggested by the government's StaySmartOnline. On the website, enter your email address and see if yours was on the stolen list.

If found, you receive this message, "youremail@gmail.com was found. You need to change your passwords now."

If you are OK, you receive the message: "youremail@gmail.com was not found. You seem to be safe."
