03 February, from CareFlight: A tree lopper suffered critical head injuries

when he plunged 15 metres to the ground at Terry Hills, in Sydney's north, today.

Ambulance paramedics called a CareFlight trauma doctor to help treat the man before flying him to hospital. CareFlight landed in an adjacent property minutes later, shortly before 11am. The CareFlight doctor said the 26-year-old man was cutting branches when the tree fell over, sending the man plunging to the ground. The doctor said it if the tree had landed on the man he would have been killed. The paramedics and doctor treated the man for head and arm injuries. The doctor placed the man in an induced coma as a pre-hospital start to intensive care management, on a ventilator to control his breathing.

CareFlight flew the man to Royal North Shore Hospital where he was admitted in a critical condition.



03 February, from North Shore Times: A teen has been charged with the bashing of Naremburn Cammeray Anglican Church minister Rick Smith.

Canon Smith was assaulted while coming to the aid of a pizza delivery driver late last year. Following investigations of the incident, police arrested a 17-year-old youth at his home before taking him to the Chatswood Police Station yesterday

where was charged with affray and granted conditional bail to appear at Hornsby Children's Court on Thursday February 13.

Canon Smith, 49, intervened when a bunch of male teens approached the 17 year-old driver on Willoughby Rd in Naremburn at 9.25pm on Saturday November 9, 2013. 03 February, from our neighbouring Ryde command: Assault of nine-year-old boy - Eastwood

Police are appealing for witnesses following the alleged assault of a nine-year-old boy at Eastwood yesterday. About 4pm (Saturday 1 February 2014), the boy was jogging with two friends along Threlfell Street when he fell behind them by a short distance. As he jogged past bushes, a man allegedly grabbed the boy around the neck and shoulder. A short struggle ensued before the boy was able to escape and inform his friend's father of the incident. The boy was not injured.

Police from Ryde LAC - NSW Police Force attended and established a crime scene. Inquiries are continuing and investigators would like to speak to a man they believe may be able to assist with inquiries.

He is described as being of Caucasian appearance, aged in his late 30s to early 40s, of average height with a thin build, light brown hair cut in a flat top style, and a small goatee. He was last seen wearing a white round neck T-shirt and black three-quarter length pants.

DETAILS: About 7:15pm Sunday 26/1/14 police were conducting a foot patrol in the Woy Woy area as part of the Australia day Operation. 28 January: Police have established a crime scene following a bank robbery in North Sydney early this afternoon (Tuesday 28 January 2014).

About 12.40pm, a man entered a bank on the Pacific Highway in North Sydney and demanded money from staff. Staff members handed him cash before he fled the scene on foot. The man did not present any weapons, nor was anyone injured, during the robbery.

Officers attached to Harbourside Local Area Command were called and immediately attended the scene. There, they were joined by specialist forensic staff and detectives from the Robbery and Serious Crime Squad. Police spoke to a

number of witnesses and conducted an extensive search of the surrounding area, but the man has not been found. Investigations are continuing and police would now like to speak to a man who may be able to assist with their inquiries.

The man is described as being of Caucasian appearance, aged between 40-50 years old, about 170cm tall, having a medium build and a fair complexion.

While the investigation is in its infancy, detectives will explore whether there are links between today's robbery and other incidents in recent weeks. Anyone with information that may assist the police investigation is asked to contact **Crime**Stoppers on 1800 333 000. Information can be provided anonymously and will be treated in the strictest of confidence.



From the North Shore Times Jan 31: SUPERINTENDENT MOVING ON

HIS role as Kuring Gai's commander has been the most satisfying of **Superintendent Jeff Philippi**'s 29year policing career. After working within the command for the past two years, Supt Philippi has now farewelled the Kuring Gai community to take up a post in Mt Druitt. He enjoyed being among the community after his previous role as Police Prosecutions operations director.

"Coming back into an operational command, working closely with the community on issues impacting on people's lives, lets you contribute in a different way," he said. "Also, to have a real respect for what our police do every day, to re-engage in that and support them in what they are doing. "(To) help them through the hard times and thank them for their efforts in the good times, it's just been very rewarding, I must say."

Supt Philippi said he had focused his role on working with his team on core issues

within the community.

"The domestic violence network is having a positive contribution to victims, to encourage them to seek help for themselves and their family members and dealing with offenders so that appropriate orders are made."

Another major focus had been improving emergency management – including bushfire preparation and zoning with the RFS, SES and Ku-ring-gai Council.

"We have been developing firm concepts in relation to evacuation so we can build confidence in the community about our ability to respond," he said.

Supt Philippi praised the 155 officers, admin and volunteer staff in the command. "You couldn't find more dedicated people".

Tip #8. INVITE A LOCAL FRIENDLY TEENAGER TO TRY AND GET INTO YOUR

HOME. Can they climb up to balconies? Can they fit through gaps?

School Zone Parking Offences



Penalties that apply to illegal parking on all roads in <u>School Zones</u> – from 1 July 2013

NO STEPPING	No Stopping Means that under no circumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping sign applies. Aus Road Rule - 167	Penalty \$304 + 2 demerit points
® 	No Parking Means that you have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. ARR - 168(1)	Penalty \$169 + 2 dement points
BUS	Means that you must not stop your vehicle in the indicated zone unless you are driving a public bus. ARR - 183(1)	Penalty \$304 + 2 demerit points

Help keep our kids safe!

Obey these parking signs at all times.

There are now increased penalties and demerit points associated with speeding and parking offences in School Zones. The following offences carry the following fines and demerit points from 1 July 2013:

Double Parking in school zone - \$304 + 2 demerit points	You must not stop your vehicle or park in the middle of the road to drop people off or pick their up. Always stop or park legally and safely at the edge of the road or in a parking area. ARR - 169
Stop on or across a driveway or block access to a property in school zone – \$169 + 2 demerit points	You must not stop or park your vehicle on or across a driveway, or block access to a property. ARR — 188(2)
Stop on path or nature strip in school zone - \$169 + 2 demerit points	You must not stop or park your vehicle on a footpath or nature strip in a built up area. This includes stopping with two wheels on the road and two on the path or nature strip. ARR-197(1)
If you stop in, on or near an intersection in school zone + fine from \$236	Unless a sign allows you to park there, you must not stop or park your vehicle: ARR – 170(1-3) Within 20 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection with traffic lights. Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights including roundabouts.
Stop on/near pedestrian/marked foot crossing / children's crossing - \$405 + 2 demerit points	You must not stop or park your vehicle on or near a pedestrian crossing to drop people off or pick them up. ARR – 171(1)

Yahoo! Mail accounts breached, change your password: SSO Alert Priority High

On 30 January 2014, Yahoo! <u>confirmed</u> that user names and passwords for its Yahoo Mail accounts were stolen in a cyber attack. Australian Yahoo Mail users are likely to be included.

Yahoo states that affected users should have already been prompted to change their password.

We advise anyone who uses Yahoo Mail to also change their password as a precaution. Yahoo has currently provided limited information about the attack.

It has stated its own systems were not breached, and that user names and passwords were stolen from a third-party database. There are estimated to be more than 270 million Yahoo Mail accounts worldwide, but it is not known how many accounts could be affected by this attack.

In addition to changing passwords, Yahoo is encouraging users to use "second sign-in" (<u>two-factor</u>) authentication as an additional layer of security for their accounts.

Yahoo has also stated that it has implemented, "additional measures to block attacks against Yahoo!'s systems."

Yahoo also offers advice on its website about safeguarding your account.

From the Hornsby Advocate, Jan 30: EVIDENCE MOLOTOV COCKTAIL WAS THROWN

POLICE say a fire that destroyed a Hornsby motorcycle business on Monday and killed a guard dog was started by a molotov cocktail. [edited]
