28 July: Our Crime Prevention Officer, S/C Paul Cleary recently gave a presentation on Crime Prevention tailored to the seniors at the Turramurra Uniting Church Seniors Centre. Such great information and reminders were given, that we have been asked to share the best bits with the public via facebook. If you don't come into the seniors category, and so are thinking this is not for you, please think again. There'II be one or two items mentioned here for all our readers! We all need reminding… …so, in no particular order:

At the supermarket, keep your handbag with you, NOT in the trolley. Similarly, for those pushing prams - don't leave your handbag on the pram at any time. Beware shoppers distracting you in order to snatch your bag/wallet.

At the coffee shop, or the movies, keep your handbag on your lap or very close.

When driving the car, lock your car doors. If windows are down, only have them open 10cm. Place your handbag on the floor, or under the passenger seat.

Beware tradesman that come touting at your door, eg tree loppers, gutter cleaners, yard work. Note: If you invite anyone into your home, your insurance may be invalid. Beware charity collectors. Never admit that you are alone: "My son will be home in 5 minsɉۥ

At ATMs hide your cash immediately. Remove any receipt. Don't carry large amounts of cash. Note: the large supermarkets will let you have \$50 cash without a purchase.

When selling your house, beware Open House days. Lock away everything valuable. Consider being there as a †purchaser'.

When using public transport, utilise populated and well-lit areas. Plan your trip. Try not to be alone. Try not to be waiting for a long time. Carry a torch.

Have the brightest sensor light at your house entry. Have your key ready. Use deadlocks when you go out. Review your locks â€" some people have been in the same home for many, many years and still have the original locks.

Beware lead-lights in or by your front door. The lead can be vulnerable – add security bars or similar.

If installed, use your burglar alarm. Check it out regularly. Don't hide valuables in hiding places within the home, such as the biscuit tin, or freezer. The crooks know all the usual places. Consider a safe attached to the floor.

Pre-programme emergency numbers into the bedside phone. If you hear someone, use the car alarm panic button. Consider a barking dog alarm linked to sensor lights.

Always lock your car, even in your driveway. Remove the garage remote control from your car. Hide anything from view.

Shred old documents with personal details on and financial information.

Report everything suspicious.

Beware scams. Get your â€~Little Black Book of Scams' (Copies available online or at Hornsby Police Station)

### 26 July, from neighbouring Ryde command: Police investigate act of indecency – North Ryde

Police are appealing for public assistance following an act of indecency in Sydney's north-west earlier this week. A 62-year-old woman was inside a home on Eastview Avenue, North Ryde, just before 7pm on Monday (21 July 2014), when she heard a knock on the back door. The woman was then confronted by a man outside the home performing a lewd act. The man fled and police were alerted. Officers from Ryde Local Area Command attended and conducted a search of the area with assistance from the Dog Unit.

An investigation into the incident is underway and police are appealing for public assistance to identify and locate the man involved. He's described as being **approximately 180cm tall and with a large, solid build**. The man, who had his face concealed, was wearing a light-coloured shirt.

Investigators are urging anyone with information about this incident, or who has reports about similar incidents in the area, to come forward.

### 26 July, from neighbouring North Shore command: Massage therapist charged with indecent assault – Chatswood

A massage therapist has been charged over the alleged indecent assault of a client on Sydney's North Shore. On Sunday 20 July 2014, a 35-year-old woman attended a massage clinic on Victoria Road at Chatswood for treatment. It's alleged the woman was indecently assaulting during the massage. Police were alerted and officers from North Shore Local Area Command commenced an investigation.

Following inquiries, investigators arrested a 57-year-old man at the business just after 3.30pm yesterday (Friday 25 July 2014). The man was taken to Chatswood Police Station where he was charged with two counts of assault with act of indecency. The Chatswood man was given conditional bail to appear at North Sydney Local Court on 20 August 2014.

Inquiries are continuing and police are urging anyone with information about this incident, or any similar incidents, to come forward.

25 July, from the AFP: You've worked hard, you've paid your taxes. And now the scammers are lining up to get their hands on your refund.

A common tax time scam involves scammers claiming that **you have overpaid your tax** and are entitled to a refund, but that you have to pay a tax or administration fee upfront for the money to be released.

If you think your email from the Australian Taxation Office might not be legit, forward it to ReportEmailFraud@ato.gov.au, or call the ATO during business hours on 1800 060 062.

24 July, from NSW Fair Trading: If you have a Malaysian Airlines booking, and are seeking a refund on tickets, contact the airline immediately. The Company will allow full refunds, even on non-refundable tickets, for travel through to December 31 as long as customers notify the airline by midnight, Thursday 24 July 2014. You can contact the Malaysian Airlines ticketing office on 13 26 27 (Australia), or call the Malaysia Airlines call centre on +603 7843 3000 (outside Malaysia). 24 July: Police are appealing for witnesses after a fire in Hornsby earlier in the month.

About 4.50pm (Thursday 10 July 2014), emergency services responded to reports of a house on fire on Burdett Street. On arrival, officers from Kuring Gai Local Area Command found the rear of the house alight.

The fire was extinguished by personnel from Fire & Rescue NSW.

Police launched an investigation, establishing a crime scene that was examined by specialist forensic officers. Investigators are treating the fire as suspicious.

They are appealing for anyone who witnessed unusual behaviour in the area, or may have taken photographs or vision of the fire, to call Hornsby Detectives or Crime Stoppers. Police are urging anyone with information about this incident to call **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000** or use the Crime Stoppers online reporting page, <u>click here</u>. Information you provide will be treated in the strictest of confidence. We remind people they should not report crime information via our Facebook.

24 July: Hornsby police are investigating a taxi fare evasion incident. About 5am Sunday 29th June, 2 males entered a taxi at the Hornsby taxi rank for a fare to Carlingford and West Pennant Hills. In West Pennant Hills one male requested to stop and advised the driver the other male would pay the fare. The taxi continued onto Mosely street, Carlingford. About 5.26am the remaining passenger requested the driver to stop. It is at this point the remaining passenger is alleged to have got out and ran from the taxi without paying the fare. Due to the early hour it was dark and the driver lost sight of the male. Police believe the males depicted may be able to assist with their inquiries into the matter.

Sensor lights can be linked to **barking dog sounds**. NSW Police and Neighbourhood Watch cannot endorse any product or service, so you must do your own homework.



It can also be very simple – just lock up! Your police continue to investigate thefts that occur on unlocked targets. These include unlocked windows and doors in houses, unlocked garages at houses and units and unlocked cars. Criminals are often opportunists. They know they want to steal something, and they know if they look hard enough they will find unlocked premises or cars, which makes it easy to steal from and also does not attract the attention that breaking a window or door will do. - Detective Inspector Jon Gross



#### And extra info from Hornsby Shire Council: Works Near You Monday 28 July, 2014


Hornsby Shire Council will be carrying out major road resurfacing works this week in **Hornsby** on Northcote Road and Lisgar Road.
