01 September: Hornsby police would like to warn people of an incident that

occurred in Wahroonga on Friday 22nd August.

About 4.45pm a female has got off a train at Wahroonga and was walking on the

northern side of the station along station lane. As the female walked past a man

seated at a table, she gave a passing glance at him. The male then has

commenced a tirade of abuse to the female which included some pretty foul and

graphic language. The male also stated he just got out of gaol. The female

obviously distraught at this has turn away and hurried to her car which was some

distance away. The male has started following the female while still abusing her.

The female has called police who stayed on the phone until she was in her car.

The area was patrolled for the man but he had left the area and could not be

found. A number of inquiries are being made into the matter.

We have heard of a similar incident nearby which has not been formally reported to

police, so details of that incident are not known.

If you experience anything like this please make your way to a place of safety: this

may include a business or shop, a home you know of or you see other people who

may assist you. It is also important to call **000** immediately.

The male is described as about 40 years of age, with a slim build, Caucasian in

appearance, dark eyes, grey hair and was unshaven, he was about 160 cm tall,

wearing a black beanie, black t shirt and light blue jeans.

01 September: Hornsby Police news, 1/9/14 The following relate to local

issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command.

Incident: Car crash

Time/Date: About8.10pm Wednesday 27th

Place: Pacific Highway, Waitara

Vehicle 1: Toyota Yaris

Driver 1: 18 year old female

Vehicle 2: Holden Commodore

Details: The Commodore was travelling north bound on the Pacific highway, a Toyota Yaris travelling south has turned right into Unwin road and in doing so has collided with the Commodore. No one was injured however both cars needed to be towed from the scene. The 18 year old female Yaris driver received a ticket for not make right turn with safety.

Incident: House fire

Time/Date: About 8.30am Thursday 28th

Place: Dural street, Hornsby

Details: The owner of a town house in Dural street has noticed smoke coming from under the bedroom floor. The owner, an elderly lady has tried to put the fire out without success; she has then gone to the balcony and called for help. A person in a neighbouring block has seen and heard her and called 000, with police and fire brigade units arriving soon after. The townhouse was extensively damaged. Initial investigations showed a faulty electric blanket to be the most likely cause. The elderly female was not hurt and was treated for minor smoke inhalation. In total 5 fire brigade units responded to the call out.

Incident: 2 motor bike stolen in separate incidents.

Details: A Kawasaki 250 was stolen from the underground car park of a unit complex in Dural street Hornsby. That incident occurred between 5.30am and 1.30pm Wednesday 27th.

In a separate incident a KTM Enduro motor bike was stolen from Brooklyn road, Brooklyn. The bike had been chained up, when sometime between 3pm Sunday 31st and 9.30am Monday 1st the bike has been stolen. The chain and lock is missing so it is unknown if the lock or the chain was cut.

Incident: Backpack stolen from train.

Time/Date: About 1pm Wednesday 27th

Details: A man was travelling on a train between Berowra and Strathfield. During the journey the man has gone to the toilet, leaving his backpack on the seat. When the train was at Strathfield the man realised his backpack was missing. The backpack contained a laptop, camera and an iPhone.

Incident: Stolen plants

Time/Date: Between 2pm Saturday 30th and 8am Sunday 31st

Place: Saint Stephen's Anglican Church, Thornleigh.

Details: 15 plants from a garden bed were stolen from the yard of the church. The

plants were valued at several dollars.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle

Time/Date: Between 8pm Saturday 30th and 8am Sunday 31st

Place: Braeside street, Wahroonga

Details: A Honda Odyssey was parked in the driveway of a house with the doors unlocked. An unknown person has stolen a torch and a number of tools from inside

the car.

Incident: Stolen golf clubs

Time/Date: Between 5.30pm and 6.15pm Saturday 30th

Place: Gordon Golf pro shop.

Details: A golfer had finished a round of gold and was visiting the pro shop at the course. His golf buggy and bag containing clubs were left outside while he went in.

At some point a thief has stolen the equipment.

Incident: Stolen boat and trailer

Time/Date: Between 9.30pm Friday 29th and 8am Saturday 30th

Place: Darnley road, Gordon

Details: A Stacer brand runabout on a Dunbier trailer was parked on the street outside the owner's home. During Friday night the trailer and boat were stolen.

Incident: Steal from dwelling

Time/Date: Between 4.30pm Saturday 30th and 9am Sunday 31st

Place: Moree street, Gordon

Details: A ground floor rear door was left open. An unknown person has entered the house and stolen a handbag which contained a purse, credit cards and cash.

Incident: Break, enter & steal

Time/Date: About 6.35pm Saturday 30th Place: Wentworth avenue, East Killara

Details: An alarm of a house was activated about 6.30pm, a neighbour has come outside to see what was happening and saw 2 males leaving the house. One male was carrying what appeared to be a small safe. Both males have entered a car and left the area. Police were called and patrolled the area but couldn't locate the car or the men. A number of inquiries are continuing into the matter.

Incident: Break & enter with intent to steal.

Time/Date: Between 11.30am and 8.30pm Sunday 31st

Place: Andrew avenue, West Pymble

Details: A ground floor rear door had its lock forced; the home was ransacked with several rooms having items thrown about. It is unknown if anything was taken.

Incident: Break, enter & steal

Time/Date: Between 6pm and 6.30pm Saturday 30th

Place: Calga avenue, Normanhurst

Details: A home in Calga avenue had cash and a mobile phone stolen, it is unknown how a thief got into the home.


### 01 September, from the AFP: Yes folks, that's poo-covered pellets of heroin.

If you're a user, this is where your heroin could have come from. Internal concealment is a method used by some drug importers to try to get past our friends at the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service.

What the importers do is wrap the drugs into little parcels using balloons or something similar. These pellets are then swallowed, one by one, and the courier carries the drugs into our country in their stomach and bowel. Later, they go to the toilet and catch the pellets as they come out. Sometimes, the pellets burst before they're passed and the drug courier gets an unexpected overdose. This isn't funny - many have died.

This particular haul was allegedly brought in to Australia in the intestinal tract of a Japanese man. He was identified at Melbourne Airport on arrival and taken to a hospital where he is alleged to have passed 100 of these pellets, under close supervision. He's the lucky one. He may spend a considerable amount of the rest of his life in jail, but he's alive.





29 August, from neighbouring Northern Beaches command: Organised Crime Squad detectives have arrested and charged a man after seizing more than 500 grams of cocaine from a home in northern Sydney.

As part of an ongoing investigation, detectives executed a search warrant at an apartment on Kentwell Road, Allambie Heights, around 1.30pm yesterday (Thursday 28 August 2014). Inside the property, officers located and seized 500 grams of cocaine, approximately 1.5 kilograms of a substance believed to be a cutting agent, 10 grams of cannabis and numerous items associated with the supply of drugs. A 27-year-old resident of the property was arrested and taken to Dee Why Police Station where he was charged with commercial drug supply.

Refused bail, the man is scheduled to appear in Manly Local Court today (Friday 29 August 2014).

The Commander of the Organised Crime Squad, Detective Superintendent Scott Cook, said the strong partnerships the squad had formed with other agencies continued to deliver excellent results. "This arrest resulted directly from our work with the Australian Crime Commission, Australian Federal Police, NSW Crime Commission and other law enforcement agencies on the Eligo National Taskforce," Detective Superintendent Cook said. "We're continuing to work closely with our Commonwealth, interstate and international colleagues to tackle organised criminal groups no matter where they may be operating in Australia or overseas."




29 August, from neighbouring Ryde command: Police are appealing for witnesses after a woman was left with serious spinal injuries following a single motor vehicle crash at North Ryde earlier in the year.

About 3.15am, Thursday 13 March 2014, a blue Peugeot 306 sedan was travelling east along Epping Road, near the intersection of Lyon Park Road, when it mounted a traffic island and crashed into a sign post. Police and NSW Ambulance Paramedics were called to the scene and a 19-year-old woman, who was a passenger in the vehicle, was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a

serious condition. She underwent X-rays and scans and was transferred to the Intensive Care Unit for treatment of serious spinal injuries. A 24-year-old man, who was driving the car, was not injured in the crash and has been spoken to by police.

Detectives from Ryde Local Area Command are continuing investigations into the crash and are appealing for witnesses to come forward. They are particularly interested in hearing from anyone who may have seen the Peugeot driving along Epping Road prior to the crash. Google has issued updates for Chrome, including <u>50 security fixes</u> for a range of vulnerabilities it rates as high and critical.





### **Taken from a NSW Police Rural Crime Prevention leaflet:**

- Trim vegetation that creates concealment opportunities and blocks the line of

sight from the house.

- Install double cylinder deadlocks or deadbolts on all perimeter doors.
- Don't hide keys outside.
- Install security interior and exterior lighting. Have spot or floodlights mounted around the building and connected to time switches or movement detectors.
- Engrave or permanently mark all property with information that is unique to you, such as your driver's licence number.
- Make a detailed inventory of all personal valuables and household and farm equipment. Record serial and model numbers, inscriptions, replacement value and other identifying features.
- Photograph or video valuable stock, machinery, jewellery, antiques and other collectables.
- Ensure guns and ammunition are registered and locked in an approved gun cabinet securely bolted to the floor.
- Avoid leaving the property unattended at he same time each week.
- Cancel deliveries while away.
- Notify Police, trusted friends and neighbours as to where you may be contacted during your absence.

## WHAT if every woman and child in Australia received free self-defence classes?

That's the hope for 11-time world self-defence champion and Thornleigh resident John Gill, a man who knows the benefits of arming young women with the tools to defend themselves. "I trained a 13-year-old girl who was later grabbed, dragged into a toilet block and gagged," Mr Gill said. "She knew what to do and managed to escape."

The 52-year-old has written to Prime Minister Tony Abbott requesting the Federal Government fund a national self defence program – estimated to cost upwards of \$5 million. He said Australia has the world's third-highest rate per capita for rape and male violence claims at least one woman's life every week.

Mr Gill is holding free self defence workshops for women, children, families and the elderly at Thornleigh Squash and Fitness Centre on September 4.

Classes are from 1.30-2.30pm for seniors, 5-6pm for children and parents and 7-8pm for women and families. For more information, visit
