05 January 2015: Hornsby Police news, 5/1/15 The following relate to local

issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command.

Incident: Middle range drink driving charge.

Time/Date: About 10.45pm Sunday 4th

Place: Pacific highway, Wahroonga

Vehicle 1: Commodore

Driver 1: 40 year old female

Details: The 40 year old female was stopped for a random breath test which was allegedly positive for alcohol. A subsequent test gave a result of .081. The female driver had her license suspended by police and she was charged.

Court: The female is to appear at the North Sydney local Court on the 5th of February charged with Driving with a Middle Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol

Incident: Low range drink driving charge

Time/Date: About 9pm Sunday 28th

Place: Mona Vale Road, Pymble

Vehicle 1: Mazda

Driver 1: 42 year old male

Details: The male driver was stopped for a random breath test which was allegedly positive for alcohol. A subsequent test gave a result of .063. The driver was then charged.

Court: The male is to appear at the North Sydney local Court on the 29th of January charged with Driving with a low Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol

Incident: Motor cycle crash

Time/Date: About 3.40pm Saturday 3rd Place: Pacific highway, Brooklyn

Vehicle 1: Honda motor cycle

Driver 1: 28 year old male

Details: The male rider was travelling on the Pacific highway about 2kms north of the pie in the sky, while negotiating a sweeping bend the cycle has hit a small stick on the road causing the rear wheel to lose traction, the rider has come off the bike and skidded into the Armco railing. An ambulance was called and took the rider to Hornsby hospital with grazes and a broken collarbone. While police were in attendance at the location numerous sticks and branches could be seen over the road from nearby trees due to the high winds, as such no action is being taken into relation to the matter.

Incident: Speeding offence

Time/Date: About 7.35am Sunday 4th
Place: M1 Motorway Mount Colah

Details: A 17 year old Queensland male driving a VW Golf was detected allegedly travelling at 178 kmh in the 110 speed zone. Police have stopped the male in relation to the speed. He was issued a ticket and had his license suspended by police.

Incident: Arrest and charge 2 x break and enters plus other stealing offences

Time/Date: Between 8am and 8.30am Monday 29th

Place: Alan Road, Berowra.

Details: Witnesses claim 2 males were seen acting suspicious at a home in Alan road, Berowra. It is alleged the males have broken into a home stealing a number of items. Witnesses have detained the men until police arrived soon after. Inquiries revealed another home in Turner road was also broken into and a shop stealing offence nearby which police will allege the males were involved in. The males were arrested and subsequently charged with various stealing offences.

Court: A number of inquiries are continuing into the males activities which may result in further charges.

Various break and enter offences:

Boolarong Road, Pymble, 22 December to 30 December.

Window frame bent. Ipad and jewellery taken.

Woonoona Avenue, Wahroonga, Saturday 3 to Monday 5.

Unit entered and credit card stolen, Used in subsequent fraud offence.

Hayle Street, St Ives, 5 December to 3 January.

Unknown entry point, Jewellery and cash taken (owners on holidays at time of incident).

2 x homes in Golfers Parade, Pymble 23 December to 1 January.

Shed and home entered. Jewellery was taken.

04 January: Nearly 1,900 motorists were caught breaking the law on the second last day of the Christmas / New Year road safety campaign.

Operation Safe Arrival started at 12.01am on Friday 19 December 2014 and runs until 11.59pm tonight (Sunday 4 January 2015). Yesterday (Saturday 3 January 2015), police charged 1,890 motorists for a variety of traffic offences. Of note, 740 motorists were caught speeding, 109 were booked for not wearing a seatbelt, and 35 were charged for drink-driving.

03 January, from our neighbouring command: Police have charged a man over a number of alleged aggravated indecent assaults in North Sydney last year.

In November 2014, detectives attached to Harbourside Local Area Command began investigating allegations of indecent assault at a medical centre in North Sydney.

It's alleged a staff member performing ultrasounds at the centre had indecently assaulted three women during their examinations.

Following further inquiries, a 67-year-old man attended North Sydney Police Station yesterday (Friday 2 January 2014), where he was arrested.

The man was later charged with seven counts of aggravated indecent assault and was granted strict conditional bail to appear before Downing Centre Local Court on Monday 16 February 2015.

Investigations into the incidents are continuing and detectives are urging anyone with information to contact **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000**.

02 January, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: Northbound on Pennant Hills Rd today a fridge secured on to a trailer by an extension lead!!!!



01 January, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: "It's not all about tonight, you have to think about tomorrow" is the message from the state's highway patrol to New Years Eve revellers.

On New Years Eve 2013 and New Years Day2014 police conducted 97,315 random breath tests and charged 345 people with drink driving offences. Traffic and Highway Patrol Command's Assistant Commissioner John Hartley said anyone thinking of having a big night out tonight should consider how capable they are of controlling a vehicle the next morning.

"Alcohol leaves the body slowly over time, and even though you might think you are right to drive the next morning, chances are you won't be," Assistant Commissioner Hartley said. "This is why police often conduct random breath testing operations in the morning. "You should name a designated driver, call a taxi or spend the night where you are celebrating."

Some examples of inappropriate driver behaviour during Day 12 of Operation Safe

Arrival include:

"About 3:15pm yesterday (30 December 2014), a **45-year-old Turramurra man** was stopped on the Old Hume Highway at Mittagong for a random breath test. The roadside breath test returned and positive reading and he was arrested and taken to Bowral Police Station. A subsequent breath analysis returned a reading of 0.216. He was issued a Field Court Attendance Notice to appear at Moss Vale Local Court on February 3 2015 to answer allegations of high range drink driving. His licence was suspended."

30 December 2014, from News Local: Who you call for help in an emergency when everyone has gone for the holidays

Triple Zero (000) is the national go-to phone number to call police if you or your property are threatened, you have just witnesses a crime or serious accident or if someone is badly injured or in need of urgent medial attention. If you are deaf or have a speech or hearing impairment call 106.

But keep those numbers for emergencies — call **131 444** to contact police other than in an emergency. Do not forget to call Crime Stoppers, free and confidential, on **1800 333 000** with information to help solve a crime. "Speak Out" against racism and abuse by calling **1800 131 555**. Call **132 500** for storm and flood assistance.

Summer is great for messing about on the water, but in a boating emergency call

Marine Rescue NSW on **Channel 16 on VHF** (distress and calling channel) or **Channel 88 (27.880 MHz)** on a 27 MHz radio or by calling Triple Zero. Volunteers deal with everything from assisting sinking vessels, boats with flat batteries and other mechanical problems, to those that have run aground, often towing disabled vessels back to safe harbour.

30 December, from CareFlight: FIVE INJURED IN CAR, BIKE ROLLOVER ON OLD PACIFIC HWY

A 49-year-old woman was airlifted to Sydney's Westmead Hospital tonight with multiple injuries after an incident involved a car and motorbike on the Old Pacific Highway north of Sydney. The woman was a passenger in a late model BMW coupe which rolled about **1km south of Brooklyn Bridge**. A motorcycle rider and pillion passenger then came to grief trying to avoid the overturned car.

The CareFlight rapid response trauma team were called in at 6.09 pm landing about 21 minutes later adjacent to the scene on the Old Pacific Highway helipad where police, NSW Ambulance and a Cowan Rural Fire Service crew were in attendance. The woman suffered a serious hand injury as well as possible chest and abdominal injuries. She was treated at the scene by the CareFlight doctor and paramedic before being placed in the helicopter for the flight to Westmead. The driver and another passenger were treated by lacerations and minor injuries while both the rider and pillion passenger were treated to abrasions and bruises.



"No way, is the response from food safety experts. Smell is not a good way to tell whether food is safe to eat, says Lydia Buchtmann from the Food Safety Information Council. "A lot of people rely on the sniff test, [but] that means nothing whatsoever," says Buchtmann. When a plate of leftovers starts to pong, it means spoilage bacteria have taken hold. These are different from bacteria that cause food poisoning."

Tips for Drivers

Pass cyclists safely. Leave at least one metre when overtaking. If it's not safe to pass, 'brake and wait'.

Drive carefully, do not cut in front or squeeze a cyclist off the road.

Tips for Cyclists

Be mindful, ride according to road, weather and traffic conditions.

Make eye contact with drivers.

Indicate clearly and let cyclists know where you are going.

Regularly check behind you and be predictable – maintain a smooth riding line.

Cyclists can be difficult to see at intersections and in low visibility

conditions. Check rear view mirrors and cars at know your blind spots. Take a second look doors. before opening car doors.

Ride at least one metre from parked cars and watch for drivers opening doors.

Take special care when entering and exiting driveways. Watch for cyclists.

Indicate your intentions. You may occupy the centre of the traffic lane when using roundabouts or when getting ready to turn, use hand signals prior to turning.

Cyclists are vehicles. They have as much right to use the road as you and can legally ride two abreast.

Scan ahead and look for pedestrians or drivers who may not have seen you, and for potholes or drainage grates.

Make sure you can be seen. Wear bright clothing, an approved helmet and lights and reflectors for night riding.
