Incident: Shop Stealing

Time/Date: Between 12.20pm and 12.30pm on Tuesday the 16th

Place: ICE design Westfield Hornsby

Person 1: 15 year old female.

Details: The female has entered the store and selected a pair of jeans and a dress then entered the change rooms. The female is alleged to then place the items in a carry bag she had and leave the store without paying for them. The female was detained by store staff and police were called. Certain admissions were allegedly made. She is to receive a caution for the offence.

Incident: Shop Stealing.

Time/Date: About 5.30pm on Monday the 15th

Place: Coles Westfield Hornsby Person 1: 35 year old female

Details: The female has entered the store with her son in a pram. The female is alleged to have then placed (hidden) numerous items in a storage compartment at the bottom of the pram covering them with a blanket. The female has then paid for a few other items and is alleged to have left the store without paying for the 'hidden' items. She was detained by store staff and police were called. The total of the items was \$299.59. The female allegedly made certain admissions and received a Criminal Infringement Notice for the offence.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle

Time/Date: Between 5pm on Sunday the 14th and 5.30pm on Monday the 15th

Place: Twickenham close, Thornleigh

Vehicle 1: BMW

Details: A BMW was parked at the above location but was left unlocked, unknown person/s have entered the car and stolen a total of \$1,400 in cash from the centre console.

Incident: Shop stealing

Time/Date: Between 10am and 10.50am on Monday the 15th

Place: ICE design Westfield Hornsby

Person 1: Described as being a 15 – 19 year old female of Caucasian appearance with Brown

hair.

Person 2: Described as being a 15 – 19 year old female of Caucasian appearance with Brown

hair with pink hi-lites.

Details: 2 unknown females have entered the store and removed from display racks a pair of shorts, 3 shirts and a pair of thongs then left the store without paying for them. They had total value of \$97.

Protecting your car

Having personal items stolen from your car is inconvenient, distressing and expensive. You face the cost of replacing those items, and also the cost of repairing damaged windows or locks. Most thefts from cars are crimes of opportunity: the items stolen can be seen from outside the vehicle, and a window is broken.

Keep your possessions safe:

The following are 'hot items' that are usually left in cars and stolen.

Usual method of theft:

Number Plates stolen - method Removed with a screwdriver

What can you do? Install theft-resistant number plate screws (number plates are stolen, then used in fuel theft offences at servo's can cost over \$100 to replace your plates).

GPS devices stolen - method Smashed window

What can you do? Remove portable GPS devices when you park your car. Wipe off suction marks left on your windscreen and turn off Bluetooth devices (other bluetooth devices can 'sniff' your bluetooth device).

Cash stolen - method Smashed window, forced lock

What can you do? Don't leave any valuables in your car

Laptop computer, mobile phone stolen - method Smashed window, used Bluetooth to detect presence.

What can you do? Turn off Bluetooth devices and don't leave valuables in your car.

Money and other valuables stolen - method Smashed window, forced lock.

What can you do? Don't leave any valuables - no matter how small - in your car.
