08 December, from Ku-ring-gai command: TARGETING THE ELDERLY!

Be aware Scammers about - A message from Kuring-gai Police Area Command.

If you haven't solicited work from any so-called trades person, please DO NOT engage in their so-called services. Some of the works scammers pretend to

offer or carry out are tree lopping, cleaning of driveways and roofs and general home or garden maintenance. In the last few weeks scammers purporting to be tree loppers have scammed two elderly residents in our Command. These scammers returned to one of the victims and attempted to scam them a second time. They will typically knock on the victim's door and offer to do work for the victim, only to either overcharge or do little or no work at all. If approached by someone you haven't solicited work from and you feel something is not quite right, please call your local police station – **Hornsby 9476 9799 and Gordon 9418 5399** and report the matter. (Please share with any elderly or vulnerable person you know).

08 December, from Ku-ring-gai command: This time of year, can be a problem for noise issues.

Neighbours throw more parties, the music is louder, and illegal fireworks get let off. For noise complaints you can contact **Hornsby Police Station on 9476 9799.**

WHEN NOISE IS A ONE-OFF PROBLEM:

If you are disturbed by an incident like amplified music, contact your local council or the local police station. They can issue a warning or issue a noise abatement direction directing a person to stop making the offensive noise. A noise abatement direction may be issued at any time of the day or night and can remain in force for up to 28 days from the time it was issued. A person who fails to comply with it can be issued with an on-the-spot fine of \$300. Noise abatement directions cannot be appealed against. The police and authorised officers of councils have powers that allow them to seize equipment used to make noise (e.g. a sound system in contravention of a noise abatement direction). For further information about what constitutes offensive noise see the NSW EPA - Noise Guide for Local Government.

<u>Hornsby Shire Council</u> and <u>Ku-ring-gai Council</u> have some power to investigate offensive noise, though it is generally best to try to resolve the problem without involving police.

- **Step 1**: Keep a noise diary to record when and how the noise is affecting you.
- Step 2: Discuss your concerns with the person causing the noise. Often
 people do not realise they are being noisy and will work with you to solve
 the problem. You could also send them a letter outlining your concerns.
 Keep a diary of the incidents.
- Step 3: If the noise continues, seek mediation with your neighbour through the Community Justice Centre –
 http://www.cjc.justice.nsw.gov.au.
- Step 4: If the noise continues you can report the matter to Council, along with your completed noise diary. Council officers will need to see documentation from the Community Justice Centre to prove mediation has been attempted.

Tip for party goers: Remember to be aware of the fact that there are people around you who may not wish to participate in the level of noise that you are making. Consideration of others can go a very long way in keeping neighbourhood relationships positive and avoiding any knocks on your door by police.

08 December, from Ku-ring-gai command: About 2.45pm (Wednesday 25 November), officers from Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command were called to St Johns Avenue near the Pacific Highway, Gordon, after reports approximately three female teenagers – one aged 19 and two aged 18, have attempted to steal a handbag from a female victim.

The victim has only been described as Asian in appearance. When officers arrived, the victim had left the scene. The three female teenagers have since

been identified. Investigations are still continuing.

Police are appealing to the public to identify the victim or if the victim could come forward and speak to officers from the Ku-ring-gai Proactive Unit.



03 December, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: Northern Beaches Highway Patrol detect Learner rider at 152km/h in an 80km/h zone on Warringah Road Roseville Chase.

About 9am on Wednesday 2nd December 2020 officers were conducting stationary speed enforcement on Warringah Road when they detected a Triumph motorcycle travelling at 152km/h. Officers stopped the cycle and the rider produced an NSW Learners Class Riders licence. The cycle had no L plate displayed, also the rider had his mobile phone mounted to the handlebar and was using an application on the phone. The rider's licence was suspended on the spot for a period of 6 months and the registration plates of the cycle confiscated for a period of 3 months. He received the following penalty notices. In relation to his speed the rider stated, "I'm running late to my P's Test".

- Class A m/v exceed speed > 45 km/h.
- Learner drive motor bike not display L plate as prescribed.

• Learner licence holder use mobile phone while driving.

03 December, from Quakers Hill command: DON'T BE SCAMMED!!!

A string of scams are taking place asking people to make payments over the phone for things such as taxes, hospital bills, bail money, debt collection, and utility bills. The scams are committed using many methods, including gift cards. As the fraudsters are sometimes requesting codes from App Store & iTunes Gift Cards or Apple Store Gift Cards, we want to make sure our customers are aware of these scams.

Regardless of the reason for payment, the scam follows a certain formula:

The victim receives a call instilling panic and urgency to make a payment by purchasing App Store & iTunes Gift Cards or Apple Store Gift Cards from the nearest retailer (convenience store, electronics retailer, etc.). After the cards have been purchased, the victim is asked to pay by sharing the code(s) on the back of the card with the caller over the phone. It's important to know that App Store & iTunes Gift Cards can be used ONLY to purchase goods and services from the iTunes Store, App Store, Apple Books, for an Apple Music subscription, or for iCloud storage. Apple Store Gift Cards can be redeemed ONLY on the Apple Online Store and at Apple Retail Stores.

If you're approached to use the cards for any other payment, you could very likely be the target of a scam and should immediately report it to your local police department as well as the Australian Tax Office and the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC).

07 December, from NSW Police: A water safety video is today being launched in a bid to protect international students from drowning in NSW this summer. [edited]

NSW Police Force in partnership with Surf Life Saving NSW, Royal Life Saving NSW and Northern Beaches Council are launching the video today (Monday 7 December 2020), which was funded by Study NSW. The video, which is subtitled in eight different languages, encourages international students to enroll in swimming lessons and familiarise themselves with water safety when swimming in the ocean, rock pools, rivers and pools or rock fishing. Some of the recommended safety tips include:

- Never swimming alone
- Wearing a life jacket when fishing and boating
- Avoiding alcohol around water and not drinking if you plan to swim
- Learning Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).

04 December, from NSW Police: A fifth person has been charged over his alleged involvement in a spate of graffiti attacks that caused damage at train stations across Sydney and the Central Coast.

In September 2020, Strike Force McCarten was established to investigate malicious damage offences involving graffiti at train stations across the Sydney Metropolitan area and Central Coast. The alleged offences occurred between May 2018 and November 2020 at Central, Newtown, St Peters, Redfern, Maconaldtown, Dulwich Hill, **Normanhurst, Mt Kuring–Gai**, Point Clare, **Gordon** and Jindabyne. Police will allege the cost of the damage was \$74,000. As part of ongoing inquiries, three men – aged 20, 25 and 26 – and an 18-year-old woman were charged last month. They remain before the courts. Following further investigations, strike force investigators arrested an 18-year-

old man at a home at Wamberal, on the Central Coast, about 3.45pm yesterday (Thursday 3 December 2020). He was taken to Gosford Police Station and charged with shoplifting, destroy/damage property in company <=\$2000 and go onto or into or remain on or in running lines etc. The Wamberal man was granted conditional bail to appear before Gosford Local Court on Thursday 17 December 2020.

Tip #16: Request your Body Corporate pursue Crime Prevention initiatives, eg: 'Rapid Removal' graffiti policy, monitored CCTV, landscaping to reduce the opportunity for crime, secure fences & gates, security lighting.


Tip #17: Do not leave your car park remote control or any valuables on view in your vehicle, even if it is locked and in the secure parking area.

Tip #18: Consider replacing the main door lock(s) with high-quality deadlocks.

Replace any screws with longer ones to secure any doorchain/doorbar.

Tip #19: Fire exits are a risk. Never leave fire exit doors propped open.

Tip #20: Natural ladders are a risk. Don't provide easy access to upper level balconies, eg wheelie bins, lattice, trees, nearby fences.
