There was so much shared that evening that it is difficult to summarise for you. Needless to say there were plenty of anecdotal stories of 'capture'. Anthony's emphasis was more on the kids than the crime. He spoke of the role VandalTrak plays in helping these offenders. They may not realise it, but these youths are lucky to be stopped before they can move on to worse crimes - graffiti is a 'gateway crime'. Since VandalTrak was started, not one of those caught so far has reoffended. If we all upload photos whenever we see graffiti (and the system points out any duplications) a huge database is created. VandalTrak employs a professional to interpret the tags, who can identify such things as left- and right-handed tags, the angle of the spraycan, the colours and brands, etc. Now we have VandalTrak, the taggers can't get away with it - there is too much information available now to the Police. We will win, both as a community looking after our streets, and as a community setting the youths onto a better path as early as possible, addressing their real problems.

Anthony's message for us? He is encouraging grandparents to take notice of the tag drawings on their grandkids' books, because this is where the kids practise.





From News.com.au November 12th: The death of a fisherman at a southeastern Sydney beach could have been avoided if he had been wearing a life jacket, police say.

The 39-year-old Warrawee man was swept off rocks at Little Bay on Sunday morning. He had been fishing with two friends when they were hit by a large wave. Despite them trying to hold onto each other, the trio were washed into the ocean and separated. Only one of the three was wearing a life jacket. He was able to clamber back on to the rock ledge and then help another man to safety. The pair tried to help their 39-year-old mate by throwing a rope out to him, but neither could swim, according to Superintendent Gavin Dengate, Eastern Beaches Local Area Commander. The man was eventually washed towards the rocks and was pulled from the water, with the help of a passerby. Emergency services were called, but paramedics could not save the man.

"If you are going to fish from rocks, it is imperative that you are properly equipped and that means wearing a life jacket at all times," said Supt Dengate. "Sadly, I believe this tragedy could have been easily avoided if all present had been wearing these essential items." A report will be prepared for the coroner.

Hornsby Shire Council is seeking public comment on a proposed "no left turn" to be introduced into Albert Road (east) from Beecroft Road, Beecroft. It would operate during school drop-off and pick-

up hours and is designed to improve traffic conditions in Wongala Crescent during those times. If approved, the work will be carried out by the Roads and Maritime Service, at no cost to Council. An estimated 290 vehicles will need to find an alternate route during the morning period and 20 vehicles in the afternoon. Some motorists may use Chapman Avenue and Hannah Street as an alternative to Albert Road. These streets are constructed to a higher standard and do not have the narrow carriageway that causes traffic congestion in Wongala Crescent. All comments from the public will be forwarded to the Hornsby Local Traffic Committee, which will then make a recommendation to Council.
