Advice from Kuring Gai LAC:

- Never count cash at the machine or in public. Put cash in a safe place before walking away from the ATM or wait until you are in a secure place.
- Do not use an ATM that appears unusual looking or offers options with which you are not familiar or comfortable. This may be fitted with a skimming device.
- Always pay close attention to the ATM and your surroundings. Don't select an ATM at the

corner of a building (corners create a blind spot.) Use an ATM that is in a public, well-lighted location, free of shrubbery and decorative partitions or dividers.

- PIN security Try and cover the key pad when entering your pin. Do not allow people to look over your shoulder as you enter your PIN. Memorize your PIN; never write it on the back of your card.
- Maintain an awareness of your surroundings throughout the entire transaction. Be wary of people trying to help you with ATM transactions. Be aware of anyone sitting in a parked car nearby. When leaving an ATM make sure you are not being followed.
- Closely monitor your bank statements, as well as your balances, and immediately report any problems to your bank.
- If you are involved in a confrontation with an assailant who demands your money, COMPLY with them, stay calm. Call the Police at the first available opportunity. Try and remember vital information about the person to assist Police.

14th November, from the Sydney Morning Herald: NSW Police booked 780 drivers for illegal mobile phone use in the first 11 days of new phone rules which came into force on November 1. Breaching the rules attracts a \$298 fine and three demerit points, and this rises to \$397 and four demerit points if the driver is in a school zone. 14th November: Police Commissioner Andrew Scipione says the NSW Police Force will immediately adopt all five recommendations handed down today by the NSW Coroner in relation to the death of Roberto Laudisio Curti. Mr Scipione says a review has been commenced today into the training and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPS) with regard to the use of Tasers, other appointments and other methods of restraint. Complaint investigations in relation to some of the officers involved have also been initiated with the Professional Standards Command, now the Coroner has handed down her findings. "We accept all the recommendations and will carefully examine the issues the Coroner has asked us to look at." Mr Scipione said. "This was a tragic series of events and I do express my deepest sympathy and sadness to the Curti family, fully understanding the depth of feelings they have been experiencing. "It is a terrible thing to lose someone you love. I am a Police Commissioner but I am also human and I am a father. "Police have a special responsibility in our society and we have been granted special powers to protect the community. It is important that those powers are exercised properly. Mr Scipione says police are constantly amending both training regimes and Standard Operating Procedures in order to improve the way officers are able to go about their duties. "If we need to do anything to improve the safety of the public and the safety of police, we will do that. Mr Scipione noted the Coroner has recommended the actions of police involved be referred to the Police Integrity Commission. An examination of Police VKG

procedures has also commenced following the Coroner's recommendation and communication procedures with regard notification of a mental disturbance will also be reviewed with any appropriate training changes to follow. "No officer goes to work day or night expecting they will be involved in this type of tragic circumstance. They go to work expecting to serve their community to the best of their ability. They are aware they will face danger. "We are already examining a raft of recommendations made by the Ombudsman and we will report back on those next month.

"Both the Coroner and the Ombudsman have noted that our training guidelines and our SOPS are very good and we have recently made changes to SOPS based on our consultation with the Ombudsman's office. "I think we need to remember that Tasers have saved lives, and they have protected police and others, including those suffering mental health episodes, from the risk of injury on many occasions.

13th November, from NSW Fair Trading: \$1.465 million fine for romance robbers.

NSW Fair Trading Commissioner Rod Stowe today welcomed a landmark decision in the Supreme Court for false, misleading and unconscionable conduct. Zivko Dimitrijevski, the former director of the internet dating company True Love Corp (TLC) Consulting Services Pty Ltd and his wife Helen Dimitrijevski, a former manager of TLC, have been ordered to pay compensation of \$1,123,095. TLC's former co-director, Hollie Veall, was ordered to pay compensation of \$342,050. Zivko and Helen Dimitrijevski were also permanently banned from being involved in the introduction agency business. Full article at

From Harbourside LAC: Juveniles detected with False IDs

On Thursday 8th November 2012, police were conducting operations in the area surrounding end of HSC examination celebrations. During the operation police detected over 25 young persons using false ID's attempting to enter licensed premises in the North Sydney area. Police seized all of the false ID's and the juveniles detected were each issued with a \$220 fine for the offence. Police are reminding young people to be aware of the dangers of this behaviour and the legalities involved. In addition to the fine received by the young person, as an automatic deterrent the Deptarment of Roads and Maritime services place an additional 6 month period onto their provisional drivers licences before there are eligible to obtain a full unconditional NSW Drivers Licence. Police run the Your Choice alcohol program for young people and their parents with the NSW Ambulance Service to educate people about the harms associated with underage alcohol consumption. HUG, DON'T HIT - Injuring children is a crime.

If you are about to hit your child STOP now and try the following simple alternatives, you'll feel better... and so will your child:

- Take a deep breath. And another.
- Then remember you are an adult.
- Close your eyes and imagine you are hearing what your child is about to hear.
- Think about why your child is misbehaving.
- Count to 10. Or better yet, count to 20.
- Put your child in a time-out chair. (Remember the rule: one time-out minute for each year of age).
- Put yourself in a time-out chair. Think about why you are angry: Is it your child or is your child

simply a convenient target for your anger?

- Phone a friend or relative.
- If someone can watch the children, go outside and take a walk.
- Take a hot bath or splash cold water on your face.
- Hug a pillow.
- Turn on some music on the radio.

An extract from a popular **crime prevention leaflet - HOME SAFE -** that has been uploaded by our volunteers. Email NHWGordon@gmail.com for your soft copy of the complete leaflet:

ENGRAVING AND INVISIBLE MARKINGS

The engraving procedure is suitable for hard surfaces only. Engrave or etch your property with a traceable number, e.g. your driver's licence number for NSW Police identification. Ensure that you have adequate levels of insurance for the replacement of property. Please note: be sure that engraving of new property does not void the warranty of that item.

For items that cannot be engraved, marking can be achieved using an ultra-violet pen. This procedure causes no harm to the item and is only visible using an ultra-violet light. This kind of invisible marking fades over time and needs to be renewed. It is best to renew the markings when checking house or fire alarm batteries.

Many councils or local police stations will assist you with this activity. For advice on engraving or marking your property contact your local police station.



Incident: Concern For welfare

Time/Date: Tuesday the 13th November 2012

Place: Residence in Wiltshire Place, Turramurra

On Tuesday the 13th November 2012 an elderly couple residing at a premises in Wiltshire Place, Turramurra, have gone out to the backyard to check on an unstable oil heater tank fitted to an external war. It is believed one of the couple have touched the tank which measures approximately 1500 x 1200 x 450, causing the tank to come away from its fixtures trapping a 91 year old male and 90 year old female on the lower body and legs. An amount of oil has escaped

covering the couple. Both victims were eventually released by fire brigade/ rescue and conveyed by ambulance to Royal North Shore Hospital. Both victims are currently in a stable condition.

The estimated value of the fraudulently obtained gift cards is thirty one thousand eight hundred and eighty dollars and fifty four cents.
