22nd April: Major roads around the Sydney CBD will close and extra public transport will be operating for **Thursday's Anzac Day commemoration**.

Roads in the vicinity of the Cenotaph at Martin Place, where the Dawn Service takes place, will begin to close at 3am in preparation for the 4:30am service. "From 6am more roads will begin to close in preparation for the 9am march including George Street, Bathurst Street and Elizabeth Street which are all part of the march route," a Transport Management Centre spokesperson said. "Other roads surrounding the march route will also begin to close at the same time,including parts of King Street, Castlereagh Street, Hunter Street, Liverpool Street, Market Street, Park Street, Phillip Street and Pitt Street." Due to the road closures, buses which normally travel along the parade route and George Street will be diverted and will start and finish their journeys from different locations between 6am and 3pm. Motorists should also be aware special event clear ways will also be in place around the CBD from 1am. Anyone driving should check signs as vehicles parked in clearways will be towed and fees apply. All roads in the CBD will reopen by 3pm and clearways will be lifted by 4pm.

Indecent assault – Lindfield: Detectives are conducting inquiries after a woman was indecently assaulted on Sydney's North Shore earlier this week. The 21-year-old woman has told police she was approached from behind by an unknown man as she walked along Russell Avenue, Lindfield, just before 9pm on Monday (15 April 2013). He allegedly indecently assaulted the woman but ran off when she screamed. The victim only reported the incident late yesterday (Friday 19 April 2013) after becoming aware a 19-year-old woman had been sexually assaulted in the same area on Wednesday night (17 April 2013). The teenager was walking from Lindfield Railway Station to nearby Kochia Lane about 10.15pm, when she was pushed against a brick wall and sexually assaulted by an unknown man. The offender fled when the victim called out for help. Detectives are conducting inquiries into both incidents and examining the possibility they are linked.

The offender in Monday's incident has been described as being **aged between 20 and 30 with dark hair and a slim build**. He was wearing a dark-coloured zip jacket, light-coloured pants and thongs. Local police are urging women to be extra vigilant about their safety.

"Our inquiries into both incidents are continuing and I want to urge women in the local community to be extra wary when it comes to their personal safety – especially if they are out walking late at night or early morning," Acting Inspector Andrew Hamill, North Shore LAC Duty Officer, said. "I would also encourage them to use footpaths that are well lit and visible, and to walk in groups rather than alone. Acts of violence and sexual assault against women are unacceptable and detectives will continue to thoroughly investigate all reports," Insp Hamill said.



Police are again appealing for anyone who witnessed either incident or has information that might assist their inquiries to come forward. Safely Home - is a joint project of Alzheimer's Australia NSW and NSW Police. *Safely Home* provides rapid and accurate identification and return of a wandering person to their home. Safely Home provides a personalised stainless steel bracelet, designed to be worn at all times

by the person with Dementia. The bracelet features a toll free telephone number and personal identification number linked to the NSW Police *Safely Home* database. The database is accessible by Police 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It includes a detailed description of the person with Dementia, contact information, previous residential addresses and locations the person may visit. All details on the database are confidential. When someone finds the lost person, they can simply look at the bracelet, telephone the Police and quote the personal identification number. The Police then make arrangements for the person to be returned safely home. Carers can instigate a search for the person with Dementia by contacting the local police station and filing a Missing Persons Report. The Police initiate a search using information on the database.

To obtain an information kit, please telephone the **Dementia Helpline on 1800 639 331**. Safely Home has a nominal registration charge of \$39 for a member of Alzheimer's Australia NSW and \$54 for a non-member.
