Crime stats for week 18 Feb to 26 Feb

25th February, from our neighbours in Eastwood LAC: Police are reminding parents to check windows and flyscreens are secure after a toddler fell from a window in Eastwood today. About 9.30am (Monday 25 February 2013), emergency services were called to a block of units on May Street. The two-year-old boy fell from the third story unit through the flyscreen of an open window onto concrete below. He was rushed to The Children's Hospital at Westmea...d with minor abrasions. He is currently in intensive care in a stable condition with possible internal injuries. Police were notified about the incident and officers from Eastwood have spoken with the family. At this stage there appear to be no apparent suspicious circumstances. Police are appealing for parents and anyone caring for children to be vigilant, particularly when the child is near an open window or in high-rise accommodation.

A few safety tips include:

- Ensure windows are secure;
- Ensure windows cannot be opened more than 10cm, except by an adult OR have a securely fitted window guard;

- Window fly-screens are not 'child-proof' and do not prevent a child from falling from an open window;
- Don't place furniture in front of windows. Keep objects that a child can use to stand or climb on away from windows (including beds, cupboards, chairs and other furniture);
- Keep windows locked and closed if a child is left without adult supervision.

24th February, from Westleigh Rural Fire Brigade: Over Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 February 2013, multiple NSW RFS units from the Hornsby / Ku-ring-gai District (including Westleigh 1 Alpha and Westleigh 1 Bravo), assisted the NSW SES with storm damage calls. For assistance during storms and floods, call the **SES on 132 500**. For emergency assistance, call Triple Zero (000).

21st February: A BIKE rider, 30, died on the Hornsby mountain bike trail last

Saturday. Police said the Waitara man had previously experienced chest pains and was found collapsed on the southern section of the trail by two riders around 7pm. They noticed minimal damage to his helmet and bike and performed CPR until ambulance paramedics arrived. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital where he was pronounced dead. Police are yet to release the man's name, but said there were no suspicious circumstances surrounding his death.





Remember School Drop-off & Pick-up Zones: With a no parking zone you can only stop for 2 minutes and must stay within 3 metres of your car. The time limits apply from the moment you arrive, whether you remain in your vehicle or not. An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line and therefore the same rules apply as for a no stopping sign. You must not stop for any reason other than a medical or similar emergency. Fine exceeds \$206. Other behaviours to avoid: double parking, parking in an intersection, parking across driveways, parking too close to corners, stopping on crossings.



Do you always pick up your dog's waste? Fine for failure to remove dog poo is **\$275**. Need bags? Rolls of 100 bags for \$5 per roll are available over the counter at Ku-ring-gai Council, 818 Pacific Highway, Gordon.

Dog attacks: A dog that rushes at, attacks, bites, harasses or chases any person or animal, whether or not any injury is caused, has committed a dog attack. Fine for a dog attack is **\$550**.

Other responsibilities:

Dog not microchipped \$165
Dog not registered \$165
Dog without identification tag \$165
Dog not on a lead \$220

Nuisance Cats (Fines under the NSW Companion Animal Act 1998). A cat can be classified as a nuisance if:

- It makes a noise that persistently occurs & interferes with the peace & comfort of a person in a nearby premises.
- It repeatedly damages anything outside the property on which it is ordinarily kept.

Cat not wearing identification \$110
Cat found in prohibited place \$110
Cat not registered \$165
Nuisance order breach \$165




'Snap Send Solve' is a free app for your mobile that lets you report issues and provide feedback to councils in under 30 seconds. Whether it's a pot hole, fallen tree or an illegally parked car - download the app and report it! It's easy, give it a go! http://www.snapsendsolve.com/

Snap Send Solve determines the correct council using your smartphone's GPS location. Once your GPS location has been determined the server sends back all relevant council details, including contact information, location, and email contact. Snap Send Solve allows you to easily capture and report on common issues including Litter, Dumping of Hard Waste, Parking, Street

Cleaning, Trees, Noise, etc and also provide a general request or general feedback. All reports from Snap Send Solve are sent from the app using your email address so that the council can communicate directly with you to fix the issue.

However, please remember **graffiti can be reported via VandalTrak**. Upload your photos using either the VandalTrak app, or via the website at www.VandalTrak.com.au. VandalTrak not only coordinate clean-up (whether it is private property, Railcorp, Post Office, council property, etc) but also work with the NSW Police to identify and match tags, documenting all the evidence used by the courts for conviction purposes.



Ambulance has specifically designed this campaign for new parents to assist them to call Triple Zero (000) in a medical emergency. When a parent is confronted with an unresponsive child - not breathing or unconscious - the situation and fear is heightened when the patient is a newborn or toddler. First Steps is an emergency phone card that outlines the information that's required by our Control Centre staff so an ambulance can be dispatched quickly. It also gives parents and carers the information they need to give to attending paramedics.

Details: The males described above have attempted to steal two bottles of champagne from the liquor store, There is CCTV footage of the incident investigations are continuing.



About 3pm on Monday the 26th of February, Police conducted a **Patrol of the Hawkesbury River** specifically around the main channels leading in/out of Brooklyn. Over recent days the area has been subjected to extensive rain and storm/tempest related jobs including trees down within the area. As a direct result the Hawkesbury River has a large amount of debris in the main channels and waterways. The Kuring gai Launch Brooklyn was utilised to remove 3 large trees that were floating in the main channels of the water ways. Some of these trees were semi
