## Hornsby Police news, 31/10/11 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: Mid range drink driving

Time/Date: About 9 pm on Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup>

Place: Pacific highway, Hornsby

Vehicle 1: Holden Barina

Driver 1: 36 year old male

Details: An RBT operation was being conducted near Bridge road, police saw a car stop about 150 meters short of the RBT site. Police went to the car and saw the male and a passenger. The male was allegedly argumentative with police who were trying to establish why he stopped short of the police RBT operation. A roadside breath test allegedly showed the presence of alcohol. A further test gave a result of .090. Police suspended the man's license.

Court: The driver is to appear at Hornsby Local Court on the 24<sup>th</sup> of November charged with Driving with a Middle Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol.

Incident: Car Vs tree.

Time/Date: About 10 pm on Thursday the 27<sup>th</sup>

Place: Kissing Point rd, Turramurra.

Vehicle: Hyundai Getz.

Details: The driver by admissions has allegedly reached for a cigarette while driving. The

male has looked up and realised he was on the wrong side of the road. As he was attempted to correct this he has started sliding on the gravel verge and hit a tree. No one was injured, the male received a ticket for negligent driving.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle x 3

Time/Date: Sometime Friday night the 28<sup>th</sup>

Place: Doncaster avenue, West Pymble.

Details: 2 x Landcruiser's and a Nissan Pulsar were broken into during Friday night. A wallet, GPS and other items were stolen valued at over \$4,000.

Incident: Malicious Damage

Time/Date: Between 1 pm and 5 pm on Sunday the 30<sup>th</sup>

Place: Business in Bridge road, Hornsby

Details: Unknown person/s have used a small metal ball bearing to smash the front plate glass window of the business. The damage is estimated at \$6,000.

Incident: Stealing

Time/Date: About 1.15 pm on Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup>

Place: United Service station Eastern road, Turramurra.

Details: The service station attendant has momentarily left the store to deal with a delivery truck. As he returned he saw 3 x male youths run from the store carrying a box. A check showed 91 packets of cigarettes missing. The total value is estimated at over \$1,700.

Incident: Steal from dwelling.

Time/Date: Between 3 pm on Monday the 24<sup>th</sup> and 9 am on Wednesday the 26<sup>th</sup>

Place: Netherby st, Wahroonga.

Details: Unknown person/s have entered a home which is under construction via a window spacing (window not installed yet). A commercial floor sander was stolen the value is estimated at \$9,000.

Incident: Break Enter and Steal

Time/Date: Between 9 pm on Sunday the 30<sup>th</sup> and 7 am on Monday the 31<sup>st</sup>

Place: JJ's at Brooklyn.

Details: Unknown person/s have broken into the store via the roof. Several rooms and areas were searched with the cash float of \$800 being stolen.

If required a higher level coordination and support will be provided to them by Crime Prevention Partnerships, Regional Interagency Teams and support services.
