Incident: Mid range drink driving

Time/Date: About 6.05pm on Sunday the 9th

Place: Mona Vale road, St Ives.

Vehicle 1: Toyota Camry

Driver 1: 35 year old male

Details: The driver was seen by police to be weaving within his lane on Mona Vale road. The driver was stopped and spoken to. Observations of the driver and his manner of driving led police to give him a roadside breath test which was allegedly positive for alcohol. A further test gave a result of .149. The driver had his license suspended by police.

Court: The driver is to appear at the Hornsby Local Court on the 3rd of November charged with Driving with a Middle Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol.

Person: 38 year old male

Details: A member of the public has seen what appeared to be a person crouching near the cash register inside the business. The front door also had signs of being forced. 000 were called with police arriving soon after. The 38 year old male was allegedly seen inside hiding and was arrested by police.

Court: The male is to appear at Hornsby Local Court on the 2nd of November charged with Break Enter & steal. He was granted conditional bail.

Incident: Break Enter & Steal

Time/Date: Between 8am and 6pm on Friday the 7th

Place: Kooringal avenue, Thornleigh

Details: The home was broken into via a ground floor rear window. All rooms were ransacked and searched by the offender/s. Cash and Jewellery was stolen with a value of over \$7,000. Investigations are continuing.
