19th March: Police from The Hills Command are appealing for the public's help to find an elderly woman who was last seen in the **Hornsby area yesterday**. **90-year-old Ilse Viemeir** was discharged from Hornsby Hospital about 1.30pm yesterday (Monday 18 March, 2013), where she had been treated for a serious cut to her leg suffered during a recent fall. The woman got into a cab at the hospital and was last seen at the Hornsby Railway Station taxi rank later that day. Police and family of Ms Viemeir hold grave concerns for her welfare due to her age, her injury, and her medical conditions that require her to have regular medication. She has been described as Caucasian in appearance, about 165cm tall with short grey/white colour hair, She was last seen wearing black long pants, a white long sleeve shirt and a red button up shirt over the top. Cyberbullying can include:

- abusive texts and emails
- posting unkind messages or images
- imitating others online
- excluding others online
- inappropriate image tagging imitating others online.

How does it differ from face-to-face bullying? While cyberbullying is similar to face-to-face bullying, it also differs in the following ways:

- it can give the person doing the bullying a sense of being anonymous, so they may behave in ways they wouldn't offline
- it can occur 24/7 and be difficult to escape
- it is invasive, impacting students' social worlds at school and home, online and offline
- it can have a large audience—readily shared with groups or posted on public forum
- it is very difficult to delete bullying comments and images.

14th March: Drugs arrest.

As a result of a search warrant Kuring gai LAC detectives **searched a rural property in Canoelands** yesterday the 13th of March. During the search warrant police spoke to a 67 year old male and a number of items were located. These include recently cut green vegetable matter police allege is cannabis which weighed between 20 and 25 kgs. Also allegedly located at the property was a single barrel shot gun and some ammunition.

The male was interviewed and charged with various drugs and firearm offences, He was refused bail to appear at the Hornsby Local Court on Thursday the 14th.

14th March: Unit Fire.

The resident of a **unit in Link road, St Ives** has gone to bed during the early evening about 8.50 pm on Wednesday the 13th the resident was woken by smoke in the unit. On inspection a fire in

a bedroom was seen with a mattress on fire. The resident has managed to throw the mattress out the sliding balcony door and the mattress put out by the resident. Fire brigade officers and police have arrived and assessed the situation. The fire was confirmed as being out but an ambulance was called due to minor burns to the residents hands (from handling the burning mattress) and spoke inhalation. There is an estimated damage of \$20,000. Early investigations point to a laptop being left on a mattress which has overheated because of blocked vents on the laptop. There are no suspicious circumstances.

14th March, Arrest of 21 year old male.

Police were called to **Wahroonga village car park** due to a male intimidating members of the public. About 1.15am on Thursday the 14th police attended the location and saw a male without his shirt following 5 other males who appeared to be backing away from this male. Police have spoken to the 5 males and then attempted to speak to the shirtless male. The male appeared to be somewhat intoxicated and allegedly started swearing at police. The male is then alleged to have 'stood up to police' getting close to their personal space. The male was distanced by police from their personal space. The male has again allegedly swore at police again and entered their personal space the male was then distanced again. The male was placed under arrest however he is alleged to have resisted this but was eventually handcuffed. The male was charged and faces Hornsby Local Court on the 10th of April charged with Intimidate police, resist arrest and offensive language.

14th March, from our neighbouring command, North Shore LAC: NORTH SHORE BIKE SQUAD STRIKES AGAIN

This afternoon at 2.45pm the North Shore Bike Squad arrested a **33 year old man from Killara**. This arrest followed some great investigation work by the members of the Bike Squad into a series of frauds being committed at various retail outlets on the North Shore allegedly using stolen credit cards. The 33 year old man is currently at Chatswood Police Station and is expected to be charged with 15 Fraud related offences, 1 Break, Enter and Steal offence, 1 count of drug possession and goods in custody.

12th March: Police have issued a warning about a batch of LSD tabs printed with an image of Psy which are believed to be making teens ill and could result in brain damage or death. "Taking any drug carries with it an unacceptable risk. There is clearly more of this drug circulating in the community and anyone who consumes it carries with them the risk of permanent brain damage or death." A good idea also is to photograph all your jewellery and electrical items. Catelogue these and store the digital photos OFF SITE, that is somewhere secure like work or a trusted friend/relative. With jewellery place a ruler next to the item for reference to size. With your electronics include a photo of the serial number for insurance purposes. Also if the item is found, we can return it to the rightful owner.

11th March, Community reminder,

This is a just a gentle reminder when out and about in public. Know where your handbag and other personal property is at all time. Once or Twice a month Hornsby police get reports of handbags being stolen from shoppers. They are mainly taken from the seat of a shopping trolley, sometimes they get taken from a the floor or seat while at a Cafe or the like. An opportunistic thi...ef will target someone they think is an easy target (like leaving your handbag in the trolley) then in a matter of seconds while you are distracted they will strike. Either taking the bag itself or your wallet/purse from the bag. Police would like to remind you all that you should (must) always have a physical hold of your handbag. This also goes for when you actually pay for an item. Don't be rushed, take your time put everything away and make sure you have everything safely secured then get your shopping. If you're 'overloaded' with shopping maybe you should make 2 or more trips just to be safe.



Did you know?

A children's crossing is only a part time crossing.

When flags are not displayed on a children's crossing you do not have right of way unless combined with a pedestrian crossing.

Do not loiter and chat on or near a crossing. This is dangerous, can confuse motorists and hods up traffic.

Stop on or near children's crossing - fine exceeds \$353 + 2 demerit points.

Proceed at children's crossing while pedestrian at crossing - fine exceeds \$441 + 4 demerit points.

Pedestrian crossing the road within 20metres of a crossing - fine exceds \$59.

Incident: Middle Range drink driving

Time/Date: About 8.30pm on Sunday the 17th

Place: Alexandria Pde, WAITARA

Vehicle 1: White Holden

Driver 1: 38 year old male from a Hornsby address.

Details: The driver was stopped for a random breath test with was allegedly positive for alcohol. A subsequent test gave a result of .103. The male had his license suspended by police.

Court: The is to appear at the Hornsby Local Court on Thursday the 11th of April charged with driving with a middle range concentration of alcohol.

Incident: Single car crash F3.

Time/Date: About 12.15 pm on Friday the 15th Place: F3 Near Hawkesbury river bridge.

Vehicle 1: Holden Commodore

Driver 1: 28 year old female from a Gosford address.

Details: The Holden was seen on the F3 allegedly travelling above the speed limit weaving in and out of lanes while doing so. The Holden is alleged to have attempted to change lanes at speed and has spun a reported 2 full 360 deg turns. The Holden has then collided with a concrete barrier near the break down lane, then careering across lane 2 coming to rest in lane 3. The driver was trapped before being released by NSW Fire and rescue. The driver was conveyed to Gosford Hospital and her car was towed from the scene. Police will wait for the results of blood tests before proceeding with any action.

Incident: High range drink driving

Time/Date: About 8.20pm on

Place: Brooklyn Rd, BROOKLYN, 50m West of Cowan St

Vehicle 1: Toyota Hi-ace.

Driver 1: 53 year old male from Brooklyn.

Details: The Toyota was stopped for a random breath test. Police allegedly smelt intoxicating liquor from within the car. A roadside test was allegedly positive for alcohol. A further test gave a result of .152. The male had his license suspended by police and was charged.

Court: The male is to face Hornsby Local Court on the 11th of April charged with driving with a high range concentration of alcohol.

Incident: Tree falls on road.

Time/Date: About 3:50pm 16 March Place: Horace Street, St Ives

Details: About 3:50pm a branch from a large Eucalyptus tree broke away and landed on to the south bound lanes at the intersection of Amesbury Avenue near the eastern kerb of Horace Street, St Ives; The branch has caused minor traffic delays and a contra flow was set up until the road was cleared.

Incident: Juvenile shop lifter.

Time/Date: Between 6pm and 8 pm on Thursday the 14th

Place: Westfield Hornsby
Person 1: 15 year old female

Details: The 15 year old girl has attended Westfield with a friend and entered various shops. At Myer the girl is alleged to have taken 3 tops and exited the store without paying for them. The girl is then alleged to have entered 2 more shops taking cosmetics and jewellery items from them. At the 3rd store a witness has detained the girl and police were called. The girl is to receive a caution at a future date.
