This one appears to come from **JB HiFi** and asks you to click a link to redeem a gift card. We've contacted JB HiFi who confirmed it is a scam and did not come from them. ANY email that asks you to click a link or advising you have something for free or to collect please do a little research, if in doubt or are not expecting it don't respond or click the link. 24 July, from NSW Alerts: WARNING Check this out - an eagle-eyed man has filmed the moment he uncovered a card skimming device installed on an ATM in NSW. The footage is going viral online. Police are investigating and have issued a warning to all ATM users. To watch video from Daily Telegraph, or to read Police tips for protecting yourself from credit card fraud, click on image.



And a comment from our Crime Prevention Officer: Watched the video, yes that's a skimming device. But, he's not wearing gloves, so any fingerprints located inside the device are virtually useless for a prosecution in court, adding to this is the chain of custody of the device. So the warning is, if you see something different or out of place with any ATM, advise the bank and call the local police. Do not tamper with or try to remove the device.

24 July, from NSW Alerts: P-Plate drivers in NSW will soon have a new list of

restrictions, as part of a massive government crackdown on young drivers, which they hope will stop the rise in fatal crashes involving young people.

23 July, from the Hornsby Advocate:

Hornsby

A 25-year-old woman was charged with arson after she allegedly set the kitchen on fire at a house on Burdett St about 9.40pm on Saturday. The woman allegedly smashed a window before entering the home and lit a fire in the kitchen area. The woman was arrested nearby and was charged with damage property by fire and malicious damage. She is due to face Parramatta Court on Thursday.

Hornsby

A 19-year-old man was charged with stealing on Tuesday July 12 about 5.15pm in relation to items stolen from a Hornsby Westfield chemist.

Berowra

An 18-year-old man blew 0.135 after he was stopped on Berowra Waters Rd for a random breath test about 1.45am on July 10. He was charged with mid range drink driving and will face Hornsby Court on July 28.

Hornsby

A wheel guard of a Volvo prime mover parked in Sherbrook Rd was set on fire on Wednesday July 13 about 11pm, police inquiries continue.

Wahroonga

On Friday about 10.25pm police patrolling Morona Ave spoke to the occupants of a parked car and noticed drug paraphernalia. A 30-year-old man from Mt Colah was issued a court attendance notice for possessing cannabis and will face Hornsby Court on August 10.

A letterbox was ripped from a yard in Benson close between 3pm and 6pm on Tuesday. Call Hornsby police on 9476 9799 with any information.

Hornsby

Cash and jewellery was stolen from a home in Pulbrook Pde between 1.30pm and 3pm on Tuesday. Burglars entered by removing flyscreen and opening a ground floor side window.

Berowra

A dozen youths were moved on from Berowra Oval by police on Friday night about 10.50pm after complaints of alcohol consumption and anti-social behaviour.

Hornsby.

A 68-year-old man was taken to hospital by police due to severe intoxication after reports of his anti-social behaviour at Hornsby Westfield about 12.45pm on Saturday.

23 July: A man has been charged with commercial drug supply after over \$1 million in methamphetamine was allegedly seized in a vehicle stop in Haymarket yesterday.

About 4.30pm (Friday 22 July 2016), police from Redfern Region Enforcement Squad stopped a Mitsubishi Outlander after observing the driver using his mobile phone on Thomas Street, Haymarket. Police spoke to the 26-year-old male driver and developed cause to search the vehicle. During the search, police allegedly located over 3kg of methamphetamine, with an estimated potential street value of \$1.2 million. The man was arrested and taken to Day Street Police Station.

About 11.35pm the same day, officers executed a search warrant at the man's home on **Burnett Street**, **Hornsby**. During the search, police allegedly located more methamphetamine and a large amount of fraud and identity theft material. The man was charged with commercial drug supply, deal with proceeds of crime and traffic related offences. He was refused bail to appear at Parramatta Bail Court today (Saturday 23 July 2016).



22 July, from Crime Stoppers NSW: TIPS FOR PARENTS - whose children are attending parties.

As a parent or guardian you have the responsibility to ensure the safety of your children.

- Will your child have access to a phone if they need to contact you?
- Make sure that your child has change for the phone, a phone card or a mobile phone. If you are going out, make sure that they can contact you or another responsible adult should they need assistance.
- You should ensure that your child has the Emergency + App downloaded onto their phone in case of emergency. You can download the app here:

Apple or Android or Windows?

Also, you could consider downloading Tribesta* – a social safety app that connects tribe members – your family, friends, and anyone else you choose, giving you and them peace of mind. <u>Check it out here</u>.

Check the level of adult supervision available at the party!

- Where possible contact the adult responsible for the party and check if there is going to be supervision. You may suggest that they check out this information if they have not already.
- Is alcohol going to be served or permitted at the party?
- Remember that it is an offence to supply alcohol to a minor.

Would your child be able to get home if he/she needs to?

• Make sure that your child is able to get home should he/she need to. Consider giving your child enough money to catch a taxi home in an urgent situation or leave enough money in an agreed place at home.

Identification

• Ensure that your child carries identification on them at all times. This can be vital in the event of an emergency. A card indicating blood type and information on any allergies should also be kept by the young person in case of an emergency.

Make sure you know exactly where the party is going to be held

• Having the address, phone number and details of a party's location is helpful in the event that you need to get into contact with your child. It will also enable you to find the party should your child need help.

Negotiate times

• It is important that you know when to expect your child. Negotiate a reasonable time for them to return home from the party.

Designated Drivers

- If your child is going to be travelling to a party in a car, make sure that there is a designated driver.
- Ensure your child has some options to fall back on if the designated driver does drink during the night e.g. they should tell a responsible adult or call for a taxi or travel with someone else who hasn't been drinking.

What can I do if I think that someone is supplying my child or other young people with drugs or alcohol?

• If you suspect that someone is supplying drugs and/or alcohol to your child or to other young people in the community, you should advise the police. Call your local police station and talk to the Youth Liaison Officer or Contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000. You can leave your name if you choose. However, if you feel more comfortable providing the information anonymously, you may do so.

20 July, from Crime Stoppers NSW: IMPORTANT MISSING PERSON INFORMATION

35,000: is the number of people that go missing in Australia each year.

- 99.5%: is the number of people that are located after being reported missing and 85% of those located are done so in the first week they go missing.
- 50%: of young people account for all missing persons.
- 33%: of missing persons go missing more than once.
- 0: Is the amount of hours you have to wait to report someone as missing.
 Having a loved one go missing can be very distressing and we urge you to contact police as soon as you believe that your loved one is missing.
- 1800 333 000: The number to call Crime Stoppers on.

It is not a crime to be a missing person, and it is the aim of the NSW Police to confirm the welfare and safety of Missing Persons. If you are a missing person we urge you to make contact with Police. Your request for privacy will be respected.

20 July: *Insert Samuel L. Jackson voice* Snake on a train at Woy Woy...

A man has had his snake confiscated after revealing it to fellow passengers on a Central Coast train today. About 1am (Wednesday 20 July 2016), police from Brisbane Water Local Area Command were called to meet a northbound train at Woy Woy Railway Station, following reports there was a man with a live snake onboard the train. Police were told a 20-year-old man produced the three-feet long jungle python from a backpack and began to show it to fellow passengers. A number of passengers were concerned for the welfare of the snake and contacted police. Officers spoke to the man at Woy Woy Railway Station who stated that he did not have a permit for the snake, named "Bread". Police confiscated the snake and conveyed it to Woy Woy Police Station where it is expected to be examined by staff from a reptile park today.



19 July, from the Australian Federal Police: Check this out – yes, that is black meth.

No, it's not a new type of drug hitting the streets. It's actually just methamphetamine that criminals have tried to conceal by adding printer toner or charcoal to make it black.

Recently, a joint investigation by the AFP and <u>Australian Border Force</u> led to the arrest of a man trying to import this substance into Australia. He thought by making it black, it wouldn't get detected. He's now facing up to life in prison. It doesn't matter what colour it is – together with our law enforcement and border protection partners, we're committed to stopping all forms of harmful drugs reaching our community.



19 July, from our neighbouring Northern Beaches command, some good advice: ******ARE YOU A BIKE RIDER AND USE TRACKING APPS*******

There have been a number of expensive high end bikes stolen throughout the Northern Beaches LAC over the past months. If you are using tracking apps that track your bike rides be aware of the information that you are giving out to strangers. Like any app or social media site that you use, ensure that you have all your settings set to private and no private information such as residential locations, photos of bikes etc should be displayed on these sites for your own safety and protection. Ensure that you do your homework with any app or social media site that you use to make sure that they have good security settings to ensure that your information is secure.

Bank statements, warranty cards, lay-by agreements and photos of receipts can also be used as proof of purchase – but you may need to provide more than one of these to support your claim. It is always a good idea to get a receipt or other proof of purchase for products and services you buy. Keep all records just in case something goes wrong later.

- Ask for a receipt
- <u>Itemised bills for services</u>
- Receipts and other types of proof of purchase
- Businesses can ask you for proof of purchase
- If it's not right, use your rights



The information and the contact details all in one place if you ever need them in an emergency!


HOT OFF THE PRESS from the latest NSW Police Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Advisory Group meeting.
