Hornsby Police news, 21/11/2016

The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command.

Incident: Stealing

Time/Date: Thursday 17/11

Place: Westfield Hornsby

Person 1: Male approx. 18 years old

Details: A Loss Prevention Officer within Woolworths observed young male selecting hot chicken wings from within Woolworths. The male was seen soon after transferring them into a sports bag. He was then observed allegedly leaving the store without paying. The male realised he was possibly being followed and ran from the area. Hornsby Police were conducting covert operations at Westfield Hornsby and were approached by the LPO. A man was detected nearby a short time later, with a sports bag matching the description as seen by the LPO. The man was seen eating hot chicken wings - Police will allege these were the same chicken wings stolen prior. The male denied the allegations, however the incident was caught on CCTV.

A true case of running fowl of the law!

Court: The man is to appear at the Hornsby local Court charged with Stealing and has been banned from Westfield Hornsby for 12 months.

Incident: Possess Prohibited Drug

Time/Date: 10.50pm Friday 18/11

Place: Allan Small Oval, Saiala Road, East Killara

Details: Police patrolling Allan Small Oval located two unattended cars and a number of males sitting at a table. Police approached and found them to be drinking alcohol. A number of items on the table prompted Police to ask numerous questions and conduct searches of the males. A 20 year old male was searched and a small quantity of green vegetable matter, Police will allege was marijuana,

directed to move on.

Court: The man is to appear at the Hornsby local Court charged with Posses Prohibited Drug.

Incident: Break and Enter, Stealing

Time/Date: Between 3.30pm Fri 18/11 â€" 9.10am Mon 21/11

Place: Kings Road, Hornsby

Details: A padlock was cut open at a business on King Road, Hornsby. Offenders allegedly stole \$1000 worth of Copper wire and damaged machinery on property.

Incident: Break and Enter, Stealing

Time/Date: Between 11am Fri 18/11 – 11.20am Mon 21/11

Place: Koolah Avenue, East Killara

Details: A ground floor window was smashed open at a house in East Killara and a number of rooms ransacked. A safe containing passports and a large amount of jewellery was stolen. An unknown tool was used to rip the safe from the floor.

Time/Date: Between 6:20pm Sat 19/11 â€" 1am Sun 20/11

Place: Graham Avenue, Pymble

Details: A first floor balcony door was left unlocked at an apartment in Pymble. It was opened by the offender, a bedroom was ransacked and watch stolen.

Details: A worker inside a Patisserie on Railway Avenue, Wahroonga heard a smashing noise at the front of the store. He discovered two glass doors destroyed and a male attempting to break into a glass cabinet, along with a female friend. The worker challenged the male and the couple fled.

21 November, NSW Police Force: \$1.3 million in cycle fines in first months of new laws dwarf penalties for motorists

Cyclists in NSW have been fined more than \$1.33 million since harsher penalties came into force in March, more than double the amount the government collected in the entire 2013-14 financial year.

And while there has been a sharp increase in the amount raised from cycle fines, the total value of penalties imposed on motorists for failing to pass riders at a safe distance pales in comparison – just \$4857 in the seven months to September.

17 November, from Crimer Stoppers NSW: WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU FIND A USB STICK?

A recent survey showed that one in five people who find a random USB stick in a public environment will plug the drive into their personal device or office computer without giving it a second thought.

However, scammers and fraudsters are using USB sticks to deliver malicious software to infect computers. Once it is plugged in, the Trojan known as USB Thief will look to steal data, such as files and images.

Best practice is: If you find a USB stick then take the property to the nearest police station and hand it over to them.

Do not take the risk.

You beta believe it, scammers are at it again with this Nintendo Switch scam.



PERSONAL SAFETY...

NSW Police is committed to assisting the community to be safe in all situations. Always seek help if you are feeling unsafe or unsure of your surroundings and seek assistance if you have been a victim of crime.

Make sure you have the Emergency + app downloaded and placed in a prominent position on your phone.

Remember, potential offenders may also be acquaintances and know their victim. Most offenders hope to avoid confrontation or being caught, and choose targets that they perceive as vulnerable.

Transport:

• On the train:

• Travel in the guard's compartment identified by a blue light, or in carriages that have groups of people who could assist if needed

• Travel in groups of friends

• Arrive at the station as close to the departure time of the train as possible and stand where the station is well lit.

• In a taxi or Ride-Share vehicle:

• Sit in the back of the taxi and travel with friends

• Give clear directions where you want to go – if you are not on the agreed route, terminate the trip

• If feeling unsure, insist on being taken to a safe place and terminate the trip.

16 November, from Australian Federal Police

Don't take the bait. Phishing scams are costing Australians thousands of dollars each month.

To protect yourself:

- 1. Don't click on links or attachments from emails claiming to be someone and asking you to verify or update details. DELETE THESE.
- 2. Do an internet search of the exact phrases used in the email or message to see if they have been sent to others and are scams.
- 3. Look for the secure symbol a closed padlock or unbroken key icon at the bottom right corner of your browser.
- Check that the website reads "https― NOT just "http―
- 5. Never provide your personal, credit card or online account details to anyone who calls claiming to be your bank. Ask for the caller's name and number and check with the organisation they claim to work for.

14 November, from NSW Road Safety

The rules are changing. From December 1, new penalties will apply for green P2 drivers and motorcycle riders caught on mobile phones. Get your hand off it. It's not worth it.

P2 drivers

From 1 December 2016:

 P2 licence holders must not use any function of a mobile phone while driving or riding, or when stationary but not parked.

Learner, P1 and P2 drivers

From November 2017:

- Hazard Perception Test required for learners to progress to unsupervised driving
- Hazard Perception Test to be removed for P1 licence holders before progressing to a P2 licence
- Driver Qualification Test to be removed for P2 licence holders before progressing to an unrestricted licence
- Extending the time a driver must stay on their P2 licence by 6 months each time they receive a suspension for unsafe driving behaviour.

From the Hornsby Advocate, 17 November:

theburningissue

Hornsby Council is considering the installation of a 40m No Stopping zone along the western side of Eaton Ave, near the intersection with Malsbury Rd. The double barrier lines near the intersection will be moved to allow parking on the eastern side beyond the 10m No Stopping area. The aim is to improve adherence to parking regulations that apply near double barrier lines and minimise the loss of on-street parks. MOUNT COLAH

A 36-year-old man was charged with mid-range drink-driving after he failed a roadside breath test about 3.55pm on Saturday near Fox Glove Rd on the Pacific Highway in Mount Colah. The man was driving a Holden Commodore when he was stopped. He allegedly blew .144 at Hornsby police station and will face Hornsby local court on December 8.

BEROWRA

A car collided with a pushbike about 9.15am on Tuesday at Yellambee Rd in Berowra causing a 65-year-old man to go over the handlebars of the bike. A 49year-old man driving a Honda Odyssey was intending to go right on to the Pacific Highway and as he started to move out he hit the man on the bike. An ambulance was called and the 65-year-old was taken to Hornsby Hospital with bruises and scrapes to his face and shoulders. Police are waiting for blood test results from the cyclist before taking any action but there are indications that the motorist will be given a ticket for "fail to give way at an intersection".

DURAL

A young girl was taken to hospital after she was kicked in the face by a horse on Thursday.

NSW Ambulance paramedics were called to Quarry Rd,
Dural, in the evening of
November 10. The teenager suffered swelling and lacerations to her face. She was taken via ambulance to The Children's Hospital at
Westmead for treatment.

HORNSBY HEIGHTS

A pink wallet was stolen from a Mazda sedan parked on a driveway at Galston Rd in Hornsby Heights sometime between 10pm on Friday, November 11, and 9am on Saturday. November 12. The car's doors were closed but unlocked. Hornsby police said the theft was a reminder that criminals will go on to property and check to see if a door handle is locked. Hornsby police urge residents not to leave valuable items in your car.

HORNSBY

A charity box was stolen from a takeaway store in Hornsby Westfield about 11pm on Thursday, November 10. It is unknown how much cash was in the box but the theft was caught on CCTV on Tuesday, November 15. Inquiries continue.

HORNSBY

Two chemists were robbed in Hornsby on Tuesday. Two bottles of perfume worth about \$80 were taken from a chemist in Hornsby Westfield about 12.45pm on Tuesday, CCTV footage shows two women described as Asian, aged in their 40s, slim, one wearing a grey and white cardigan with black pants and the other wearing a black and white striped top with a skirt - take the perfume. One of the females distracted staff while the other grabbed the two perfume bottles. Police are reviewing the CCTV footage. Another chemist was robbed between 5.30pm and 6pm by what appears to be an opportunistic thief who took about \$900 while the cashier was away from the register.

DURAL

Thieves stole a generator from a house under construction in Wyoming Rd. The break-in happened between 10.30pm on Tuesday and 5.30pm on Wednesday, November 9.

REGIONWIDE

A scam promising pets online - french bulldogs in particular - has cost victims thousands recently. Ads on auction websites ask buyers to transfer money for non-existent pets. Then there are requests for money to pay for fees such as customs duty. Police urge people to check sellers/breeders are genuine before transferring any money.

theburningissue

Emergency work on Berowra Waters Rd, requiring it to be closed for several hours a day, will begin on Monday, November 21 and be completed by Monday, December 5 – weather permitting. The work will repair two sections of mesh fencing that have been made unsafe by recent accidents.

On the days the road will be closed from 9.30am to 2.30pm between Currawong Rd and Berowra Waters Ferry. No work will take place on weekends and the road will remain

open every Saturday and Sunday.

Last week our NHW Coordinator, Julia and our Crime Prevention Officer, Kuring Gai LAC, Snr Cst Paul Cleary, had their regular monthly spot with Cecilia Castle on her show on Triple H Community Radio 100.1 FM. A few tips came out of the discussions that we'd like to share with you.

A friend of Cecilia's in Hornsby was broken into recently, during the only hour that the home was empty. It had been targeted and watched:

Paul advised the community to be vigilant. He suggested we report it if we see anyone paying particular attention to a home, or strange cars in the area. He said, "Work with your neighbours!". The side or rear of a property are often targeted because there's less chance being seen, but also because these doors and windows often don't have as strong locks as the front door. He said, "Install double-locks on all doors. Good locks for weak points." If you confront someone, they have very quick answers and scenarios prepared, such as they are looking for the place to rent and thought your home was it - sounding very credible.

Discussion on Jay-walking:

The rule saying 20m from a crossing can be visualised better by comparing that distance with 4 average car lengths, or a block of land.

Crossing diagonally is an offence also.

if the crossing at a crossing, the chas is on the person to cross salety, if at or on a

crossing, the onus is on the vehicle. However, it is a crossing, not a right to cross.

A pedestrian crossing is for pedestrians only; A bicycle is a vehicle, except for an adult accompanying children under 12 years.

Beware using your mobile phone, even if you are on a crossing.

You must make an informed and conscious decision before crossing a road - reading your phone at the same time doesn't count.

Discussion on Schoolies:

It is an offence to supply someone under 18yrs with alcohol.

Never leave a drink alone.

Never accept a drink form strangers.

If in doubt, don't drink it.

Don't leave your phone/bag/wallet around.

Don't be pressured into doing something you wouldn't normally do, eg risky behaviour.

No means no.

Stick with your friends and look out for each other.

If you think a friend is drugged or has drunk excess alcohol, call 000 for medical assistance asap. Their safety is more important than issues with the law.
