

09 March, What to do after a car crash



DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE IN A CAR ACCIDENT?

You will need to call Triple Zero (000) if any of the following apply:

- Someone is trapped or injured
- Police are needed to direct traffic or deal with hazards
- Any drivers appear to be intoxicated or drug affected
- A BUS or TRUCK requires towing
- Someone is failing or refusing to exchange details.

If nobody is trapped or injured, drivers can exchange details and can drive away from the scene you do NOT need to report the accident to police – It is an

insurance or civil matter.

You will need to call the Police Assistance Line on 131 444 (24/7) once you are home safe if:

- your car requires towing (at the scene of the accident you will need to organise your own tow through your insurance company or your preferred tow company)
- You are later treated for an injury
- If you are unsure or have any further questions.



From Kuringgai Council: Implementation of clearway on Mona Vale Road St Ives and parking changes

From Monday 13 February Roads & Maritime Services (RMS) are working with the Council to create additional parking in the car park opposite Stanley Street St Ives. When completed by mid March, there will be an extra 15 car spaces available in this car park.

RMS have advised the Council that they intend to implement a clearway along Mona Vale Road during peak periods at St Ives along both sides of the road. The clearway will extend from Pacific Highway Pymble through to Kitchener Street St Ives from Monday 20 March 2017.

This means there will be no parking along Mona Vale Road St Ives during peak periods. Peak periods are as follows:

- 6am to 10am and 3pm to 7pm on weekdays
- 9am to 6pm on weekends, except southbound between Stanley Street and Rosedale Road which will operate between 2pm and 6pm on weekends

Changes to the clearway including signage will be carried out by RMS staff between Tuesday 14 March and Sunday 19 March during the hours of 8pm to 5am.

The clearway will operate from Monday 20 March. The RMS have advised they

intend to tow and fine cars parked in the clearway from this date. Click here for details.

From Hornsby Advocate, 09 March 2017

Two southbound lanes on Pennant Hills Rd and one lane each way on the M1 Motorway will be closed intermittently at night for five months. [Edited]

CHERRYBROOK

Fortunately no-one was badly injured when a car ran off the road at County Dr, careened across a yard and hit a house on Saturday. Emergency services were alerted just after

midnight. A Castle Hill Fire and Rescue crew removed the car from the garden. The car hit a wall but there was only minor damage to the house.

WEST PENNANT HILLS

A 65-year-old woman returned to her West Pennant Hills home in Glenridge Ave on Friday to find it had been broken into. A window was forced open between 5.45pm and 10.40pm and the house ransacked.

GLENORIE

A man in his 50s suffered limb injuries when he fell through a floor while working on a house in Glenorie on Sunday afternoon. CareFlight's rescue helicopter landed in Glenorie at 3.30pm, on a property across the road from the accident. The man was treated for injuries by paramedics before he was taken to Westmead Hospital in a stable condition.

ASQUITH

A nine-year-old boy from Asquith who went missing on Thursday, March 2 was found more than three hours later, after police appealed for help from the public. The boy was reported missing about 3pm, outside a public school on Dudley St in Asquith. Hornsby Police were notified and started to search for the child. About 6.20pm he was found

on a train at Waitara train station.

KU-RING-GAI

Ku-ring-gai SES were still receiving requests for help from residents reporting water entering their homes after being hit by the hailstorm on February 18 or recent heavy rain and gusty winds. Since February 17, the NSW SES Sydney Northern Region has received 1356 requests for help with Ku-ringgai (418) and Hornsby (142) getting about 40 per cent of all those calls. The demands on the Kuring-gai area have been handled with the assistance of other units from across Sydney and other services such as the Ku-ring-gai Bush Fire Brigade and other units of the NSW Rural Fire Service, Fire and Rescue NSW, NSW Police Force and Ku-ring-gai Council. SES volunteers continue to give their time to help people who are unable to manage damage sustained to their home as a result of this weather. The SES is asking anyone who is experiencing delays with having their property repaired to escalate it with their insurer. NSW SES can provide emergency assistance and temporary repairs, but a tradesperson is best to do more permanent repairs. For emergency help during storms, or floods, call NSW SES on 132 500.

11 March, A warning from a neighbouring retirement village: I wanted to let you know about the latest phone scam.

A person rings a resident claiming to be a Police Superintendent from a local police station and explains there has been a security breach with their bank accounts. He gives you a Police Victim Number and asks you to ring 000 to get back to him securely. I believe he stays on the line. The resident dials 000 and yes he answers with Police, Ambulance or Fire? The resident says Police and gives the Victim Number, supposedly puts you through and you are now feeling confident this is a legitimate call and transfer money to the secure police site given.

Yes, this sounds ridiculous that someone can fall for this one but with the addition of 000 the resident felt it was real. A large sum of money was transferred by a very smart woman. So please make all your residents aware and ask them to contact the local police. The police will put all this information together as these scammers are targeting elderly people in retirement villages. NSWPolice have a fraud squad set up for these ongoing scams - all information will be logged and acted upon.

We have once again placed a note out to all our residents to remind them of phone scams and computer hackers. This seems to be intensifying in our villages.

If you can remind your residents again it may be an opportune time.

- If you get a strange call from the government, taxation, bank or police –
 hang up. Government employees won't call out of the blue to demand
 money or account information.
- Don't give out or confirm your personal or financial information to someone who calls.
- Don't transfer or send money. In fact, never pay someone who calls out of the blue.
- Feeling pressured to act immediately? Hang up!! That's a sure sign of a scam.

I hope this saves at least another resident from falling into a phone scam trap.

Mozilla has released an update to address security vulnerabilities in <u>Firefox</u>. You should apply this update as soon as possible to minimise risk to your computers, devices and information. You are advised to review security bulletins and advisories from any vendor you use and apply their updates as soon as possible. Many vendors allow you to automate the process of updating their software. Security updates address vulnerabilities in computer systems that attackers can otherwise use to gain access to systems or information.

From ABC Sydney: Man who allegedly pretended to be doctor worked in NSW hospitals for over a decade

A man is facing a \$30,000 fine after allegedly masquerading as a doctor at New South Wales hospitals for more than a decade. Shyam Acharya is accused of stealing a doctor's name and medical qualifications while in India before moving to Australia and becoming a citizen. To find work in Australia, he allegedly used

fraudulent documents to gain registration with the Medical Council of New South Wales in 2003. Mr Acharya worked at Manly, **Hornsby**, Wyong and Gosford hospitals under the name Sarang Chitale up until 2014.
