If you're driving, remember there will be more people than usual walking around the CBD, so drive with care.



A great arrest by Ku-ring-gai LAC Proactive Crime Team.

On Monday evening (22 May) Ku-ring-gai officers arrested a 32 year old male from

an East Lindfield address for an outstanding warrant and numerous property related offences in the Kur-ing-gai area.

In May 2017 the Kur-ing-gai Pro-Active Crime team started investigating a spate of property related crimes in the Kur-ing-gai area. During the course of their investigations Kur-ing-gai PACT was able to identify a 32 year old male as a person of interest in these investigations.

On 5th May 2017 police allege the male was involved in the theft of a Toyota Hiace which was utilised, by him in numerous break, enter and steal offences within the Kur-ing-gai LAC area.

On 18th May 2017 investigating officers recovered the stolen Toyota Hiace at a Hornsby address where numerous break, enter and steal offences had been committed. Recovered from within the stolen Toyota Hiace was a vast amount of property identified as being proceeds from numerous break, enter and steal offences. These items included personal paperwork, high end bicycles, tools, computer equipment, drugs and drug paraphernalia.

On the evening of 18th May 2017 a Silver Toyota Echo was stolen from another Hornsby address which was again the scene of numerous break, enter and steal offences. This vehicle was later established to be in the possession of the 32 year old male who was allegedly utilising this vehicle in the commission his crime spree. On Saturday 20th May 2017 Kur-ing-gai PACT arrested a female associate of the male in the commission of an attempted mail theft. The female was allegedly found in the possession of numerous pieces of identity documents, stolen mail and a skeleton key used to access the mail boxes.

Officers commenced a search of a nearby address recovering a large quantity of stolen property allegedly from the break, enter and steal offences which had been committed by the male. On Monday 22nd May 2017 Kur-ing-gai PACT located the male and the stolen Toyota Echo, at an address in East Lindfield where the arrest of the male was carried out. Also located at the address were huge quantities of property which police allege were the proceeds from the male's crime spree.

The male has been refused bail and is currently in custody facing a large quantity of charges including break, enter and steal, take and drive conveyance without consent and drug possession charges.

Investigating officers are aiming to lay additional charges when the full scope of offences and victims is established.

Ku-ring-gai police have recovered a large amount of property believed to be from

multiple break, enter & steal offences. Police are requesting victims of break and enter incidents to please ring the Police Assistance Line (PAL) on 131444 to update property stolen in these break-ins. Please don't ring Hornsby or Gordon police stations to update the lists due to the large amount of property recovered and time involved to collate this.

Hornsby police will contact all victims of the break-ins in due course.

Police are appealing to witnesses who may have information relating to the above incidents to contact Hornsby police on 9476 9799, or phone Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 to report any information relating to the matter anonymously.

Aussie Night Markets return to St Ives Showground in June

Following the success of a four week trial, over 40 stalls and food trucks will be at the Showground every Friday night from 9 June.

Aussie Night Markets, the company behind the event, say they are aiming to create 'a moving night market which will operate 5 - 6 nights a week in different locations around Sydney, a family event with food, fun and shopping'.

The Council has reached agreement with Aussie Night Markets to make St Ives Showground their Friday night venue, starting on Friday 9 June.

The market will be open from 5pm and finish around 10pm, with food trucks, market stalls live music and kids activities.

The Council trialled the night markets during April and May this year, with crowds averaging 4000 each night.

Free parking is available at the Showground and patrons are reminded to take care when entering and leaving the venue.

Kuring Gai Local Area Command crime prevention officer Senior Constable Paul Cleary is warning people to be wary of those they speak to online after a woman, 59, was caught up in an alleged internet fraud romance. The woman was using an online dating service in April, when she met a man in the US who she started talking to. Earlier this month,

the man allegedly told the woman he was having trouble paying his daughter's school fees and requested \$4000. The Pymble woman obliged, however he also later asked for \$5000, which the woman sent. On his third request for money, the woman allegedly became suspicious and informed police, who are now investigating.

Stealing charges

A WOMAN, 31, was charged with stealing offences after police allegedly noticed her lurking around letterboxes at an apartment block in Waitara about 4.25pm on Saturday, May 20.

A search of her apartment and garage allegedly recovered stolen property with a value of about \$5000, including electrical equipment.

She was given a future court attendance notice to face Hornsby Court for stealing offences and receiving stolen property.


Arrest over break-ins

A 32-year-old man from East Lindfield is expected to face up to 100 charges for a number of alleged break ins throughout the north shore including Hornsby.

On Monday Kuring Gai Local Area Command Police arrested the man.

It is alleged he was involved in the theft of a Toyota Hiace on May 5 which was contained a number of stolen items.

The charges include break, enter and steal, take conveyance without consent and drug possession.

A 65-year-old man has died at the NorthConnex Wilson Rd compound on Tuesday morning, following a "workplace accident" on the site.

An Ambulance NSW spokesman confirmed the 65-year-old man received chest injuries before subsequently suffering from a cardiac arrest.

"Paramedics were called out to Pennant Hills Rd, Pennant Hills, shortly after 8am this morning after reports of a man suffering from chest injuries," the spokesman
