Hornsby traffic accidents, a workover fall, theft and drink drive charges laid by police this week

Hornsby Police were called to some serious traffic accidents, a workover fall, thefts and issued charges for drink driving.

Cowan: A 21-year-old female was charged with negligent driving and speeding after her 1993 Ford Fairmont spun across three lanes of the M1, twice, crashing into a rock wall and a guard rail, 3km south of the Hawkesbury river bridge about 12.40pm on Friday. A witness told police he saw the Ford overtake him at well above 110km/h going north before it skidded out of control. The P-plate driver allegedly told police her glasses were dirty and removed them to wipe them on her jacket while driving. The car spun across to lane one hitting the rock wall and then bounced off, across three lanes and hit a guard rail. A passing motorist, an off-duty paramedic, helped the woman who suffered a small laceration on her head. She was then taken to Gosford Hospital for treatment.

Hornsby: A 21-year-old man was charged with drink-driving, failing to display P-plates and driving through a red light on the Pacific Hwy near Edgeworth David Ave about 3.30am on Saturday. The man's Toyota Hilux failed to stop at a red traffic light at the intersection of Edgeworth David Ave when the lights changed red, police allege. The driver allegedly returned a positive roadside breath test and blew 0.117 at Hornsby Police station. He will face court at a future date and his licence was suspended.

Hornsby: A 25 year old male was injured when he fell into a fishtank after cleaning the gutters of a unit complex in Linda St about 2.50pm on Monday, July 24. The employee of a plumbing company used a ladder on a balcony to get onto the roof of a three storey unit complex, and fell onto a fishtank on the balcony which smashed after impact and sliced his left ring finger. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital and will require surgery, workover will investigate.

Wahroonga: Police were called after reports of a bonfire at the carpark of the Golden Jubilee field about 10.45pm on Saturday. When police arrived at the carpark they found a small bonfire and numerous bottles of alcohol.

Hornsby: Three trees were hit by the same car, driven by a 25-year-old man who lost control of his Holden Commodore going south on Peats Ferry Rd about

8.55am on Saturday. While merging from lane one to lane two, the car skidded causing the front near side to hit a tree, and an airbag deployed. The car hit a second tree and then a third, as it bounced back into lane one. The driver was taken to Hornsby hospital, and pending blood test results the driver may be charged with negligent driving.

Thornleigh: Gardening and power tools valued at \$5000 were stolen from an Isuzu table top ute parked on the Comenarra Parkway between 9pm on Saturday, July 22 and 12pm on Sunday, July 23. Thieves forced a window down and took the items, leaving behind a pair of size 11 thongs. There was a party that finished about 1am next door to where the car was parked.

Turramurra: \$900 damage was done to three garbage bins that were set on fire at Turramurra High School between 6pm on Friday, July 21 and 12pm on Sunday, July 23. Police found smashed alcohol bottles at the scene and advise residents that if they see or hear anything happening out of school hours at a school to call Hornsby Police on 9476 9799.

Wahroonga: A \$400 bicycle was stolen from Wahroonga railway station between 8.30am and 6pm on Thursday, July 20. The bike was locked to a fence at the top of the stairs. Police are reviewing CCTV footage.

Cowan: A 61-year-old man suffered a broken ankle and wrist after he was thrown from his Victory brand motorcycle on the M1 about 1.40pm on Saturday. The motorbike was towing a trailer going north when the trailer swayed, ejecting him from the bike. The man came to rest in lane three, after hitting a rock wall. The man was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital and police will wait for results of blood tests before any action is taken.

From 10pm on Friday, Chalmers Street will close between Devonshire Street & Eddy Avenue.


As a result, northbound traffic will divert onto Elizabeth Street, which will have a new two-way traffic section between Randle & Foveaux Streets. Randle Street will

A review of end of year financial statistics have shown that despite police efforts, there are a high number of unauthorised drivers, and defective or unregistered vehicles on NSW roads.

End of financial year statistics show that there were 23,237 unauthorised (suspended, disqualified, or unlicensed) drivers, 86,832 unregistered vehicles, and 25,175 defect notices issued for unroadworthy cars.

When compared with the previous financial year, there has been an increase of 4912 infringements issued for vehicles defects, which serves as a warning to all road users to maintain their vehicles.

Statistics have shown a minor decrease in unauthorised drivers caught behind the wheel, with 42 less legal actions being taken, when compared to the previous financial year.

End of financial year statistics have also shown an increase of 7320 unregistered vehicles detected on the road, when compared with the previous year.

Is your car on this list? Check here.

Over 2.3 million cars in Australia are fitted with faulty airbags, and there are still over 1.4 million with these airbags on the road. Check <u>here.</u>

More worryingly, some Takata airbags can deploy defectively in up to 50% of cases. The Alpha inflators can be found in 12,300 Honda vehicles in Australia.

Have you ever seen one of these signs and wondered what they are?

Special event clearways are sections of road where you can't park or stop during the advertised time.

You can't park in them even if you have a local resident or mobility parking permit.

They're put in place for important events such as next month's City2Surf, and help keep traffic moving on roads near the event.

What happens if you park in one? Your vehicle will be towed away and you'll have to pay a \$196 towing fee and possibly a parking fine.

If your vehicle does get towed, it'll be moved to a legal parking spot nearby. You can call the Traffic Information Line on 132 701 to find out where it is.

Best way to avoid getting towed? Check the signs before parking. The locations of special event clearways for major events are also listed <u>here.</u>
