About 11:57am on Wednesday 23rd August, 2017 a Learner driver was detected driving a white Holden Commodore with their number plate obscured. He was issued a \$439 Infringement including 3 demerit points. A caution was issued for failing to display 'L' plate on the front of the vehicle as required.

The supervisor of the learner driver failed to ensure Road legislation not breached. He was issued a \$110 infringement.

23 August, Hornsby Police News

Hornsby Police were called to thefts, reports of an intoxicated man in the women's toilets at Berowra and a houseboat near Bobbin head where a Bulldogs fan may have broken his shoulder celebrating a rare win for the team.

Berowra: A 32-year-old man was detained by police after two visits to the female toilets at Berowra village shopping centre at 8.40pm and 10.40pm on Sunday, August 20. When police entered the female toilets the man closed the door and locked it. After numerous requests to come out, he allegedly abused police and appeared intoxicated. He then allegedly struggled with police before being put in a caged truck and detained as an intoxicated person.

Cherrybrook: A 47-year-old woman was fined and given a banning order after

allegedly taking four bottles of vitamins worth \$25 each from a Castle Hill shop on July 24. Police were called when the Cherrybrook woman returned to the store on August 18.

Hornsby: A white parrot brand drone, worth about \$600, was found in the backyard of William St home a few weeks ago and handed into police this week. The resident found it in the backyard, and left a note on the front fence about it but no one claimed it. Contact Hornsby police on 9476 9799 with proof of purchase and identification to claim it.

West Pennant Hills: Jewellery and a small amount of cash worth a total of \$7500 were taken from a home on Bellamy Farm Rd between 7.30am and 4pm on August 14. Entry was gained via a ground floor rear door.

Hornsby: Four youths from western Sydney were allegedly found with more than \$7500 worth of stolen clothes and electronic items, from Hornsby Westfield last week. A 12-year-old boy from a Colyton address was allegedly found with \$575 worth of items with David Jones security tags and \$7140 worth of Apple items with security tags attached. The boy was found with other youths in a Mazda 323 sedan.

Dangar Island: A 61 year old man returning home from the local bowling club alleged he was assaulted about 8.30pm on Saturday, August 19. The man told police he was walking through a laneway when he heard dogs barking, kicked a fence and told them to shut up. A resident, aged 36 heard this and then argued with the man. There was a scuffle and due to the slope of the land the pair fell to the ground and wrestled. The 61 year-old contacted police about the matter and allegedly made admissions to drinking alcohol on the night. He also did not want to pursue the matter and no one was injured.

Bobbin Head: A 60-year-old man suffered a suspected broken arm after he slipped on a houseboat while celebrating a rare Canterbury Bulldogs win about 6.45pm on Sunday August 20. The man was on a Holidays afloat vessel in the Bobbin head area with family celebrating a victory, when he slipped and fell on his right shoulder. Police were called because the hiring contract said the boat was not to be driven at night. Police from the Ku-ring-gai launch and Broken Bay area command attended the boat, where they were told he had "celebrated a little too hard", due to the team's poor form this year. The man was taken to Hornsby hospital.

Thornleigh: A grey plant trailer worth \$1000 was stolen from a business at Childers Rd between 10am on Wednesday, July 19 and Saturday, August 19.

Hornsby: Sporting and camping gear was stolen from an underground garage storage area at a unit complex on Pound Rd between 10am and 6pm on Sunday, August 20. A resident was moving house and left items including a bike, a helmet, a tent, a backpack and snorkelling gear in a car space which, were taken. If you suspect the call is a scam, hang up. More <u>here</u>



Marine Rescue NSW: Hazardous Surf Warning

Surf and swell conditions are expected to be hazardous today for coastal activities such as boating, swimming and rock fishing on the Byron Coast, Coffs Coast, Macquarie Coast, Hunter Coast, Sydney Coast, Illawarra Coast, Batemans Coast and Eden Coast.

Boaters already on the water should remember to wear a lifejacket and Log On with their local Marine Rescue radio base by marine radio, phone or the free MarineRescue App.

The NSW Police Force, Marine Area Command advise that boaters planning to

cross shallow water and ocean bars should consider changing or delaying their voyage.

THIEVES CAUSE WATER HAVOC

The community of Berowra Waters had their water supply cut off last Saturday after what has been described as "a ridiculous theft".

The marina and 98 households lost access to water after thieves pilfered water pipes and meters.

water pipes and meters. Hornsby Council Acting General Manager Steve Fedorow slammed the selfishness of crooks who stole the pipes. "This was a ridiculous theft, particularly

"This was a ridiculous theft, particularly considering the low monetary value of the equipment that was stolen," Mr Fedorow said. "It takes an especially callous and foolish criminal to cause such widespread inconvenience for such minor gain." The council was alerted to the theft on

The council was alerted to the theft on Saturday morning and had all homes reconnected to water by late on Saturday afternoon

"I would like to thank the Council staff who gave up much of their weekend to return water to the households that were without," Mr Fedorow said. "Without their quick actions and tireless effort this could have been much worse than it was."

Junior football manager charged with sex crimes [Edited]

LINDFIELD Football Club has sent letters home to its junior players and parents after a club manager was charged with the sexual assault of a three-year-old girl earlier this month.

The North Shore Times revealed earlier this week that David Carl Ewen, 50, was an under-8s team manager at the club and was arrested and charged with sexual intercourse with a child under 10 and an alternative charge of indecent assault of person under 16 years of age as well as a separate charge of indecent assault for a second incident on August 11.

PYMBLE

Police are appealing for information after an unknown man allegedly took unsolicited photos of a group of girls on a train headed from Pymble to Chatswood about 3.15pm, Friday. The young girls allegedly heard clicking from his phone before alighting at Lindfield. On Monday, the same man appeared on the same train and sat near the girls again and allegedly took photos. CHATSWOOD

Police conducted an oparation targeting the possession of prohibited drugs within Chatswood CBD on Friday night with the help of the force's drug detection dog, Belle. Throughout the evening, nine people were allegedly found to be in possession of prohibited drugs, including cannabis, cocaine and heroin. Police handed out cannabis cautions, youth cautions and laid several charges.

GREENWICH


A 22-year-old male driver lost control of his vehicle on Pacific Highway in Greenwich and crashed into a power pole last Thursday, before continuing to drive to nearby Innes Rd. Police were called and located the driver, who allegedly smelt strongly of alcohol. He was charged with mid-range drink driving and is due to face Hornsby Local Court next month.

LANE COVE NORTH

Police have charged a O woman, 23, of Cranebrook, over an aggravated break and enter that allegedly occurred last month. Occupants of a home in Johnston Cres woke to find their front door open and property missing from their house, including their black Volkswagen Passat. Investigations led to a search of a Cranebrook home where a woman was arrested. Police allegedly located many items bought fraudulently with a stolen credit card. She was refused bail and will appear in Penrith Local Court soon.

ST IVES

Police attended an ad-6 dress in Tores Pl where they saw two men working in a backyard. They said that, on seeing police, both fled. After a chase, capsicum spray was used and the men apprehended. Police said checks revealed one was in the country on a visitor's visa while there was no record of the other, who had \$2000 cash on him, entering the country. Officers said they were investigating if one of the men obtained an illegal NSW driver's licence after finding a Chinese licence in a van the duo travelled in.



A 50-year-old woman and 62-year-old man were allegedly assaulted in Turramurra on Wednesday morning. Police said the woman and a 10-year-old relative arrived at their Eastern Rd house when the child ran inside and was confronted by an intruder. A man grabbed the child, who escaped and ran into the garage. The intruder allegedly followed and stood over the woman and child, demanding her watch. The woman struck him in the face with her keys. A neighbour who came to help was punched in the face. Police are calling for witnesses. The man is described as caucasian, about 30, with sandy hair and beard.
