Police are investigating the armed robbery of a service station at Carlingford last night.

Shortly after 8pm (Sunday 1 July), a 27-year-old employee was confronted by two males inside the service station on Pennant Hills Road. The men had their faces covered and were armed with a knife. The employee was grabbed and threatened with the weapon before being ordered to hand over cash. The two men... ran from the shop area and drove away towards Jenkins Road in an unknown vehicle. Police from The Hills Local Area Command established a crime scene which was attended by officers from the Forensic Armed Robbery Unit (FARU). At this stage, investigators have only limited descriptions of the two men involved.

Anyone who can assist the investigation is urged to contact The Hills Local Area Command or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

The NRMA has today congratulated the NSW Government's move to halve the cost of licence fees for drivers with a good driving record for five years from 1 July.

NRMA Motoring & Services President Wendy Machin said an NRMA survey found 95 per cent of people supported a reduction in license fees for drivers with a clean record. "The NRMA has been campaigning for a system that doesn't just penalise bad drivers but actually rewards good behaviour on the road," Ms Machin said. "It's great to see that the Government has responded. "The 50 per cent discount in licence fees is a great incentive for drivers to do the right thing and is an important step towards improving road safety. "Recently NRMA launched a Courtesy Driver campaign designed to encourage road users to be more courteous and practice good driving behaviours that may help to reduce risk on our roads. "We ran this campaign because we believe good driving behaviour can potentially reduce incidents of road rage and may save lives - the Government's move today goes some way in encouraging that. "This is a win for drivers in NSW."

The best way to prevent driver fatigue is to make sure you have enough sleep before driving, regardless of the length of your trip. The best way to avoid a fatal fatigue crash while driving is to recognise the early warning signs:

Yawning

Poor concentration

Tired eyes

Restlessness

Drowsiness

Slow reactions

Boredom

Oversteering

Tips on avoiding fatigue-related accidents:

Get a good night's sleep before commencing a long trip.

Do not drive at times when you would normally be asleep.

Avoid long drives after work.

Take regular breaks from driving (use Rest areas).

Share the driving whenever possible.

Pull over and stop when drowsiness, discomfort or loss of concentration occurs.

Find out whether any medicine you are taking may affect your driving.

Kuring gai Precinct Coordinator Julia added: People know that they must remove the graffiti on their

own property as soon as possible, but forget to document with a photo the fact that a crime was committed. So, please everyone, let's get all the crimes documented. VandalTrak includes GPS coordinates for each graffiti incident, done automatically if you have a smartphone, or providing googlemaps for you if not. VandalTrak analyses all the 'tags'. VandalTrak logs the jobs and coordinates the appropriate removal, including using teams such as the local Rotary groups. VandalTrak follows the job through the system, keeping you informed of progress. And finally, VandalTrak provides the evidence for charging the offenders. Please give it a go!

Hornsby Police news, 03/07/12. The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command;

Incident: Steal From Retail Stores

Time/Date: About 9.45am on Wednesday the 27th June 2012

Place: Westfield's Shopping Complex, Burdett Street Hornsby.

Details: About 9.45am on Wednesday the 27th day of June 2012 seven young person's have attended the Hornsby Westfields shopping centre. Whilst inside the shopping centre the young persons attended four stores. They have separated into smaller groups some have entered the Kmart Department Store, The Reject shop, and JB Hi Fi store, items have been taken from the stores with no attempt made to pay for them. Before all meeting up and going into the Top Bargain Store, where they have again taken items without paying for them.

The young persons have then walked into the car parking area and using a can of glow in the dark window spray taken from one of the stores. Proceeded to 'tag' three walls, which was witnessed by an alert member of the community, who has contacted security.

Police were called resulting in all seven young person's being arrested and taken to Hornsby Police station. Due to the age of the offenders they were deemed eligible to be dealt with under the Young Offenders Act and subsequently arrangements were made for the young persons to

be cautioned.

Incident: Single vehicle motor vehicle collision

Time/Date: About 1.55 am on Wednesday 27thJune 2012

Place: Ryde Road, Pymble Driver: 23 year old female

Details: About 1.55 am on Wednesday 27thJune 2012 a 23 year old female was travelling west along Ryde Road, Pymble when she appears to have lost control of her vehicle and collided with a power pole. The impact caused the vehicle to slingshot around the pole, which was pushed about one metre, cracked and bent about 3 metres from the ground. The vehicle has come to a rest upside down on the footpath. At which point the vehicle has caught on fire, police found the driver sitting outside the vehicle with lacerations to her leg, she was conveyed to Royal North Shore hospital..

A water main also had been affected by the collision and a large amount of water was being dispersed as a result. Police, with the assistance of RTA traffic management crews closed 2 lanes in both directions as there were low hanging power lines across the roadways. The replacement of the power pole took approximately eight hours affecting morning commuter traffic. Investigations are continuing.

Incident: Drug Detection

Time/Date: About 11.30 am on Friday 29thJune 2012

Place: Redgrave Road, Normanhurst

About 7.00pm Thursday 28 June 2012 a resident of Redgrave Road, Normanhurst noticed a red, black and white chequered bag sitting on their nature strip. The resident contacted Hornsby Council to collect the bag, believing it was rubbish and had been illegally dumped there.

About 11.20am Friday 29 June 2012 a council ranger collected the bag and opened it to check the contents. Located inside was approximately 8 kilograms of cannabis leaf. Police attended the LOC and seized the bag which contained approximately 8 kilograms of cannabis. It is unknown who placed the bag in this area. The neighbours do not recall any unusual activity in the area.

Incident: Strange Smell

Time/Date: Sunday 1stJuly 2012

Place: Residence in Albert St, Hornsby

Details: About 7.00pm Sunday 1stJuly 2012 police attended the location after complaints from the local residents about an odour consistent with a possible deceased being present. The

residents also reported the resident of the unit had not been seen for a week or two.

Police attended along with the NSW fire brigade and agreement was reached about entry being required due to the smell. Entry was forced by NSWFB and the odour was found to be coming from a fish tank that had a number of dead fish in it. It appears the resident has gone overseas, as a list was found naming his passport as an item to take, but none advising someone to feed the fish.

Incident: Motor vehicle collision

Time/Date: About 11.50pm on Friday the 29th June 2012

Place: Pacific Hwy Wahroonga

Details: Around 11.30pm on Friday the 29th June 2012 a white Toyota four wheel drive was travelling north on the Pacific Highway Wahroonga in the inside lane. With no warning the front driver's side tyre of the vehicle has unattached completely from the vehicle, bouncing in a northerly direction on the road.

The tyre has crossed lanes 2 and 3 northbound, jumped the concrete median strip and entered the southbound lanes of traffic. The tyre has bounced over e a sedan travelling in the outside lane southbound before colliding with the front of another vehicle. The driver of the four wheel drive has managed to bring the vehicle to a stop adjacent to the gutter. Police inspected the tyre on attendance and observed the bolts appeared to have completely shorn off. No persons were injured as a result of the incident.

Incident: Malicious damage

Time/Date: Between 3.15pm and 3.20pm on Friday 29thJune 2012

Place: Hornsby Hospital Person: 44 year old male

Details: Around 3.05pm on Friday 29th of June 2012 a 44 year old male of no fixed abode attended Hornsby Hospital seeking treatment. Upon his discharged the male has become enraged abusing medical staff, kicking and damaging a door. The estimated damage incurred as a result of the male's actions is \$500.

Court: A 44 year old male will appear before Hornsby Local Court on Wednesday 15thAugust 2012 charged with malicious damage to property.

Incident: Break, Enter and Steal

Time/Date: About 1.25am on Thursday 28th June 2012
Place: Residence in Benaroon Avenue, St Ives

Details: About 1.25am on Thursday 28th June 2012 a young resident at the location woke up and saw an unknown male in her bedroom. The unknown male was dressed in dark

clothing, described as about 6foot tall, slim build, Caucasian, wearing a baseball cap. At no time did the male make conversation with the resident.

The male has run down the stairs out the front door of the house. The male has stolen property to the value of approximately \$6500 which included, jewellery, two laptops, a set of house, car and work keys.

Police are appealing to witnesses who may have information relating to the above incidents to contact Hornsby police on 9476 9799, or phone Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 to report any information relating to the matter anonymously.
