

## Hornsby Police news, 21/11/11 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: P1 driver speeding charge

Time/Date: About 6.10 am on Friday the 18<sup>th</sup>

Place: Pacific highway, Asquith

Vehicle 1: Commodore

Driver 1: 19 year old male P1 driver

Details: The male driver was detected on radar travelling at an alleged 102 km/h in the 60 speed zone. When spoken to by police the driver allegedly said, "no excuse, I'm late for work". The driver had his license suspended by police and was charged.

Court: The male is to appear at the Hornsby local Court on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December Charged with Exceeding the speed limit by more than 30 km/h.

Incident: Road rage incident and assault.

Time/Date: About 8.40 am on Friday the 18<sup>th</sup>

Place: Pacific highway, Hornsby.

Vehicle 1: Subaru Grey.

Driver 1: 39 year old male.

Vehicle 2: Commodore.

Details: The Commodore driven by a female with her 12 year old daughter as a passenger was in lane 1 of 2 as was the Subaru both were turning right from Galston road into the Pacific highway. Both cars have merged into lane 2 of 2 (Subaru in front) after passing some parked cars the Commodore has merged back into lane 1 the Subaru is then alleged to have merged in front of the Commodore causing the female to brake and beep her horn. The 39 year old Subaru driver then allegedly gave her 'the bird' and jammed on his brakes causing the cars to collide. The cars have stopped when the male is then alleged to have become aggressive and at some point is alleged to have approached the 12 year old daughter with his fist raised and close to her face. A witness has stopped and assisted in getting the 12 year old away. Police have arrived and soon after arrested the male. Inquiries are continuing into the matter.

Incident: Arrest and charge major drug offenses

Time/Date: Tuesday the 15<sup>th</sup> of November

Place: Callabash bay, Berowra

Person 1: 39 year old male.

Details: As a result of inquiries by NSW State Crime Command into the manufacture of prohibited drugs a search warrant was applied for and granted to search a residence in Callabash bay, Berowra. At the location officers retrieved numerous items suspected of being used in the manufacture of large scale prohibited drugs. Soon after a 39 year old male was arrested in the Bondi area suspected of being connected to the location.

Court: The male has been charged with Manufacture Prohibited Drug - Commercial quantity. He was refused bail and is to face Central Local Court on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle

Time/Date: Between 7 pm on Friday the 18<sup>th</sup> and 5.30 am on Saturday the 19<sup>th</sup>

Place: Hillcrest avenue, Berowra.

Details: The owner had parked his Holden Crewman with several tools inside the 'ute' well area and secured with a locked hard cover. Unknown person/s have broken into the locked tub and stolen an inspection camera, battery drill and some pesticides used in pest control. The total value is estimated at about \$1,400.

Police are appealing to witnesses who may have information relating to the above incident to contact Hornsby police on 9476 9799, or phone Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 to report any information relating to the matter anonymously.

## The Next of Kin Register

The New South Wales Police Force has developed a Next of Kin Register. The Next of Kin register is free and enables persons living alone to record their details at the local police station. The register holds information of your nominated Next Of Kin, doctors and dentist details and any medical alerts.

This information may assist the ambulance and police in an emergency situation, to contact a relative or other nominated person to inform them of your situation.

You will be provided with a key ring and sticker with your registration number attached to alert emergency services that you are registered with the Next of Kin Program.

If you would like further information, contact your local police station and ask to speak with the Crime Prevention Officer.
