Mobile apps to help you find your child or relative:

HELP ME is a 99c app, available through iTunes, aimed at helping young people in distress. The app features a panic button which, when activated, alerts two nominated contacts via SMS of the user's exact location. The app also includes a function for recording suspicious activity, helpful phone numbers, child safety tips and educational resources.

Lost Kidz is an App, available through iTunes, designed to allow parents who have lost or been separated from their children to issue an instant alert to people in the vicinity. If your child goes missing, you can use the App to alert mobile phones within a 1 mile radius, with a current photo and details of your child. Without it, hundreds of people could be watching someone walk away with your child and not even know its happening. Orthopaedic surgeon and father of two Darren Fern came up with his "Lost-Kidz App" after losing his daughter while shopping at Tesco in Truro, England. SafeKidZone is an American application which when a child is under threat they can active this application at a press of the button and it will turn on their GPS and call their local police to notify them and the police can track them down with the GPS. Retirement Communities Crime Prevention Tip#4: Lock your doors when inside. Don't unlock and/or open your front door in preparation for a vistor or tradesman.

Retirement Communities Crime Prevention Tip#5: Consider wooden dowelling rod in the tracks of sliding doors & windows for added security.

From Saturday:

A young boy left initially unconscious when struck by a car was flown by CareFlight to hospital from East Lindfield, on Sydney's north shore, today. The doctor administered a general anasthetic and placed the boy on a ventilator to control his breathing as treatment for his head and abdominal injuries. After stabilisaiton ambulance drove the boy to the helicopter which flew him under intensive care monitoring to the Westemead Children's Hospital. The boy remained in a serious but stable condition on arrival at the hospital.

From Saturday: Firefighters are on scene of a fire at a marina at Bobbin Head in northern Sydney. Numerous crews from the NSW RFS and Fire & Rescue, including firefighting boats, are working to contain and extinguish the fire in the building which is fully alight. Please avoid the area.

CAN YOU RECEIVE A FINE IF YOU A LEGALLY PARKED IN YOUR CAR WITH THE ENGINE RUNNING AND USING YOUR MOBILE PHONE? The answer is NO.

Section 300 Use of mobile phones by drivers (except holders of learner or provisional P1

licences)

- (1) The driver of a vehicle (except an emergency vehicle or police vehicle) must not use a mobile phone that the driver is holding in his or her hand while the vehicle is moving, or is stationary but not parked, unless the driver is exempt from this rule under another law of this jurisdiction. A mobile phone does not include a CB radio or any other two-way radio. USE, in relation to a mobile phone, includes the following:
- (a) holding the phone to, or near, the ear (whether or not engaged in a phone call),
- (b) writing, sending or reading a text message on the phone,
- (c) turning the phone on or off,
- (d) operating any other function of the phone.

Harbourside LAC strongly encourages road users not to use their mobile phones whilst driving and if you have to use one ensure you are legally parked in a safe location before you do. Safe driving.

'Guardian Services' have been introduced by CityRail on the North Shore Line on Saturday nights, departing Central 10.28pm, arrive Hornsby 11.20pm. Transit officers travel on board each Guardian service and work closely with train crew and station staff to help ensure passenger safety and security. Guardian services may operate with only the four centre carriages open to ensure passengers are close to transit officers and the guard. Please wait for your Guardian service near the centre of the platform, close to the Emergency Help Point. CityRail and security staff will be present on arrival at Chatswood and Hornsby stations.

Our local Police's facebook page http://www.facebook.com/#!/KuringGaiLAC now has a tab added for easy reporting of **graffiti** on the **VandalTrak** website. At the top of the page, where you see tabs for 'Photos, Welcome, Report a Crime, Take the Survey, and an '8' with a dropdown arrow', click on that '8' to get the tab for VandalTrak. Please consider taking a photo of any graffiti you may see, whereever, whenever, and then upload it to the VandalTrak website. We must stop this illegal damage of people's property. Every photo is recording a crime, so that a complete log is created for a certain person's 'tag'. When that person is charged with an

offence, it can be for all the tags, not just the one they are caught for. If it is on your property yes, do clean off the graffiti, but please take a photo first in order to record the crime. Otherwise, that crime is lost and the tagger gets away with it. If it's not your property, don't worry, once the photo is uploaded, VandalTrak takes over with the process. Please help our community get back to having clean streets once more. It looks better as well as making us feel safer.

Hornsby Police news, 23/07/12. The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command;

Incident: Unaccompanied Learner Driver

Time/Date: About 2.45 am on Saturday 21st July 2012

Place: Pennant Hills Road, Normanhurst.

Driver: 18 year old female from a Thornleigh address

On Saturday the 21st July 2012, around 2:30am, police have observed, a black Holden CR-V 4WD driven by an 18 year old female who was travelling west on Pennant Hills Road Normanhurst. Police sighted four young male passengers seated in the back passenger seat of the vehicle. As a result police have stopped the vehicle and upon approaching have observed a further three unrestrained male passengers in the rear boot area of the vehicle. When asked to produce her driver's licence to which the female advised police she did not have it on her person and she was a Learner. Police observed no supervising driver within the vehicle. All passengers in the vehicle were males ranging in ages from 16 years old to 18 years old, all whom appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The female driver was subjected to a breath test which returned a positive reading.

An 18 year old female from a Thornleigh address will appear before Hornsby Local Court on Thursday 6th September 2012 charged with traffic offences.

Incident: Single Vehicle Motor vehicle collision

Time/Date: About 8.10pm on Sunday 22nd July 2012

Place: Secure Car Park Hornsby RSL Club

Driver: 43 year old male

About 8.05pm on Sunday 22nd July 2012 it appears the 43 year old male driver has driven from the open car park between Dural and Williams Street onto Williams Street. As the driver has exited the car park he has accelerated harshly crossing Williams Street at speed and impacting with the steel roller door at the entrance to the RSL Car Park, destroying the door. The vehicle has then continued through the car park at speed for about 30 meters before impacting with the concrete side wall which caused the vehicle to spin the rear side of the car into a concrete pillar. As a result the vehicle became wedged length ways between the pillar and wall.

The resulting impact caused the vehicle engine bay to catch fire; a witness to the incident has rushed to the aid of the driver and dragged him from the vehicle. The fire brigade attended and extinguished the flames, while ambulance officers treated the driver at the scene before conveying him to Royal North Shore Hospital. The male's injuries are several broken ribs, cracked sternum, broken collar bone, concussion, cuts to face, and possible lung puncture.

Police investigations into the collision are continuing.

Incident: Break, Enter and Steal

Time/Date: At 3.50pm on Friday the 20th of July 2012 Place: Residence in Stuart Avenue, Normanhurst

Person: 18 year old male

At 3.50pm on Friday the 20th of July 2012, the son of the occupants has attended the residence to find an 18 male rummaging through the sunroom. The victim's son has challenged the 18 year old male, who has thrown a bottle at the male and run out the back door. When the victim's son has checked the home contents he has observed a TV was missing.

Police arrived on the scene and were subsequently pointed in the direction of the rear fence, where the 18 year old male had allegedly ran. Police walked through the hole in fence, into the adjacent yard and went up to the opened rear door and observed through the door, a TV matching the description of the one stolen. Police could also see a number of other items inside the premises, and as a result, police held off the property and held a perimeter while a search warrant was applied for.

An eighteen year old male is to appear at Hornsby Local court charged with numerous offences

Incident: Menacing driving

Time/Date: About 5:30pm on Monday 9th July 2012

Place: Intersection of Unwin Road and Pacific Highway, Waitara.

Driver: 26 year old male from a Hornsby address

It is alleged about 5:30pm on Monday 9th July 2012 the 26 year old male has approached the intersection of Alexandria Parade and Patterson Avenue, Waitara and proceeded to beep his horn at the vehicle in front of his. The 26 year old male has then followed the vehicle ahead through the streets of Waitara. Until the two vehicles have come to a stop at the intersection of Unwin Road and Pacific Highway, Waitara.

It is alleged the 26 year old male has taken a torch from his vehicle and approached the driver's side door of the other vehicle. Where the male has proceeded to abuse the driver and hit the driver's side window with the torch. The 26 year old male has returned to his vehicle at which time the victim has recorded the registration number of the vehicle and contacted police.

A 26 year old Hornsby man will appear at Hornsby Local Court on Thursday 23rd August 2012 charged with Common Assault, drive vehicle in a manner that menaces, malicious damage, and possession of an offensive implement.

Incident: Break, Enter and Steal

Time/Date: Between 11:30am and 1:45pm on Friday 20th July 2012

Place: Residence in Merrivale Road, Pymble

Details: Between 11:30am and 1:45pm on Friday 20th July 2012 unknown person/s have forced open the ground floor rear door at a residence in Merrivale Road, Pymble by unknown means and gained entry. Once inside offender/s have rifled through drawers and cupboards, in the numerous rooms. Stealing items of jewellery, including engagement and wedding rings, necklaces, watches, and a camera with accessories. Property to the value of \$22 000 was reported stolen.

Incident: Stealing

Time/Date: Wednesday 18th July 2012

Place: IGA supermarket on Turner Road at Berowra

Person: 62 year old female

Details: About 11:00am on Wednesday the 18th July 2012 a 62 year old female entered IGA supermarket at Berowra. She placed items to the value of approximately \$44 dollars in her personal handbag then proceeded to shop. The female paid for the items in the trolley however

not making any attempts to pay for the items in her handbag. Police attended and the female was issued with a Criminal Infringement Notice for the offence of shoplifting

Incident:Shoplifting

Time/Date: About 2:17pm on Thursday the 19th of July 2012

Place Myers Westfields:

Person: 24 year old male from a Newtown address

About 2:17pm on Thursday the 19th of July 2012 a 24 year old male, walked into the Myers Department Store at Westfields Hornsby. He has walked directly to the electrical Homeware section and selected a blue ray DVD player. The male has moved the item several metres from its original location and continued walking around the store. He has then walked back to the item and picked it up and walked out of the store without attempting to pay for the item. The male was stopped by the Loss Prevention Officer who witnessed the incident of CCTV. Prompt response by the security and loss prevention officer has resulted in the male being taken back into the store, the item returned and police called.

Police conducted a check via police radio which revealed an outstanding Warrant, as a result the male was arrested, cautioned and conveyed to Hornsby Police station. Police viewed footage at Myers which verified the
