14 July, from the Northern District Times: Police are warning people to be wary of potentially counterfeit notes in the northern district

IF you have ever held a note that feels a bit too think or a bit too thin, and it doesn't have the Australian Coat of Arms, chances are you are holding a counterfeit note. Police are urging business owners and residents to be wary of such notes that are circulating throughout the northern district. Some \$20, \$50 and \$100 notes have all been discovered to be counterfeit and all have come from the North Ryde and Macquarie Park area.

12 July: Robbery and Serious Crime Squad detectives have charged two men as part of their ongoing investigations into a group suspected for stealing a large quantity of jewellery.

Strike Force Warbrick was established in June 2012 to investigate a series of robberies targeting people employed in the wholesale jewellery industry. From Monday 7 July 2014, detectives from the Robbery and Serious Crime Squad and Flemington Local Area Command, have been investigating break and enters across Sydney, including areas around the local area commands of Ryde, Rosehill, **Kuring-gai**, Harbourside and North Shore.

On Friday 11 July 2014, officers from Ryde Local Area Command responded to reports of a break in at a house on Wallace Street, Eastwood. On arrival two cars, a Hyundai and Ford Falcon were allegedly driving down Wallace Street. Officers

indicated for the two cars to stop, the Hyundai stopped and the Ford allegedly accelerated away from the police and a pursuit was commenced. The Falcon was pursued and after several minutes stopped on Rutledge Street, where three passengers and the driver allegedly ran from the car. The driver, a 34-year-old man, was arrested a short distance away from the car and was taken to Ryde Police Station. The other three were not apprehended.

Police will allege that during a search of the Ford, jewellery, housebreaking implements and two way radios were located. The 34-year-old was charged with aggravated break enter and steal (x2), Skyes Law – police pursuit, and drive in a manner dangerous. He was bail refused to appear at Parramatta Bail Court today (Saturday 12 July 2014). The driver of the Hyundai, a 28-year-old man, was spoken to by officers. They searched the car with a large amount of coins and house breaking implements allegedly located. He was arrested and taken to Ryde Police Station, he was charged with aggravated break enter and steal (x2). The 28-year-old was bail refused to appear at Parramatta Bail Court today (Saturday 12 July 2014).

Investigators also executed search warrants at two homes, one on Hall Street, Bondi, and the other at Holdsworth Street, Newtown. Officers will allege that during the searches cash, jewellery and other documents were seized.

11 July, from the Hornsby Advocate: Police investigate Burdett St house fire

A house fire in Hornsby last night is being treated as suspicious by police. Sniffer dogs and investigators from Ku-ring-gai Local Area Command and Fire and Rescue NSW are examining the damage to the home, on Burdett St.

11 July, from the Hornsby Advocate: Roads blocked and loud noises heard during army counter-terrorism exercise at Hornsby's Barker College

Nearby residents have reported "loud bangs― and roadblocks around Barker College during a military exercise at the school grounds on Thursday night.

"My mother-in-law lives behind the Blue Gum and she heard a loud bang and said the whole house shook,― said pizza delivery driver George El Hajjar.

A spokeswoman from Barker College, Sarah Onions, said the Army had asked months ago for permission to run a training exercise between 8pm and 11pm.

A letter dropped in mailboxes by the Australian Defence Force said the exercise was a counterterrorism training operation involving military personnel and aircraft.

10 July: Police are appealing for information to help identify two men police wish to speak to over a number of alleged fraud offences across Sydney.

Detectives from Harbourside Local Area Command have been investigating the series of incidents that occurred on 18 December 2013. Police believe a man attempted to withdraw money from a number of different branches of a financial institution. The man attended branches at Neutral Bay, Mosman, North Sydney, Crows Nest, Northbridge, Chatswood, Lane Cove and Gladesville, where it's alleged he presented false identification documentation. He successfully withdrew funds at four of the institutions, amounting to more than \$120,000.

Inquiries have also revealed a second man may have been acting as a look out during the transactions.

Investigations into the matters are continuing and police have now released CCTV images of two men who may be able to assist with their inquiries.

The first man is described as being of Caucasian appearance, about 35-45 years of age, with dark-coloured long curly hair tied back in a pony tail, facial hair, dark-coloured eyes and of a thin build.

He is shown wearing a dark-coloured suit, white shirt, white joggers and carrying a black business-style shoulder satchel.

The second man is described as being of Caucasian appearance, aged in his mid to late 30s, with short dark hair and of a large build. He is shown wearing dark-coloured jeans, a white button up shirt and brown shoes.

10 July: Received an unsolicited email, phone call or text message claiming

to be from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) stating that you're owed a refund? The call or message may ask you to provide financial information or pay a fee in order to access the refund.

Proceed with caution - it could be a scam!

Do not pay a fee or provide personal/financial information in response to unsolicited calls, SMS or emails claiming you are owed money. Always check with the ATO via contacts found on their official website, click here.

10 July: Two bush walkers were located after becoming lost in Berowra.

About 10.30am Wednesday 9th a male and female begun a bush walk along the Great North Walk from the Brooklyn area. They had walked along the track until they have reached a point where they have taken an incorrect track and have become lost. At approximately 6.00pm they contacted 000 stating they were lost and unable to make their way out of the bush. Local police crews attended and commenced a search, Police came upon a bridge across a creek that was damaged and were unable to cross it. As a result the police airwing were called and a helicopter sent to locate the walkers, they were found soon after near the Sandy Bay creek area. The walkers were assisted out of the bush to safety and were apologetic for the trouble they caused.



Motorcycle Lane Filtering in New South Wales Fully licensed motorcyclists will

be able to lane filter at low speeds on NSW roads with new motorcycle laws taking effect from 1 July. Under these new laws, it will be legal for motorcyclists to lane filter alongside vehicles that have either stopped or are moving slowly at less than 30 kilometres per hour, provided it's safe to do so. The reforms follow a successful motorcycle lane filtering trial conducted in the Sydney CBD in 2013.

08 July, from Kings Cross LAC: HOW TO BEST PROTECT YOUR BICYCLE FROM THIEVES

There has been a recent increase in bicycle theft around the Kings Cross LAC, and we want to help you keep your bikes safe. The best line of defence against bike thieves is a decent bike lock. If you are going to actively use your bicycle and leave it on the streets or at a bike rack, you have to lock it properly! Here are a few simple tips to help you secure you bicycle as well as possible:

- 1. NEVER RELY SOLELY ON A CABLE LOCK TO SECURE YOUR BIKE! These cables can be snipped and broken in a few seconds using basic tools. A high proportion of bikes stolen in the Kings Cross LAC were secured with cable locks. To put it simply, cable locks are not good enough and will barely protect your bike.
- 2. It is strongly recommended that you use a good quality bicycle lock. High quality bicycle locks are U-Locks or D-Locks (as shown in the picture). Although these locks cannot guarantee the safety of your bicycle, they are very hard to remove. Your local bicycle dealer will be able to assist you in choosing the best quality lock.
- 3. When parking your bike, lock it to something that cannot be removed or that the bicycle can be lifted over. Locking your bike to a street/parking sign is not the best idea, as thieves can easily lift the bike up and over the top of the sign.
- 4. Allow for as little space within the lock as possible; loose locks can be more easily broken open.
- 5. Park it in a place that is well lit and in full view of the public. If possible, park it in a place monitored by CCTV cameras.
- 6. Engrave or permanently mark the bicycle with a number or word that is unique to you, eg. Driver's licence number.

7. Record the purchase date, brand, model, make, size, colour, serial number, type of frame, number of gears, etc. Ensure this record is kept in a safe place. Also, take a photo of your bike!



Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) spotlight - East Killara

East Killara includes all the residences east of the Eastern Arterial, known as Birdwood Avenue as it goes past their suburb.

East Killara NHW is coordinated by Wal, assisted by Mary. Mary also currently holds the role of Coordinator for the quarterly 'All Areas' meetings, where all the NHW groups within the Kuring Gai Local Area Command get together and work as a team.

- Check accommodation booking terms and conditions carefully to ensure you understand what you are purchasing and get any agreements in writing.
- Ski tickets or lesson bookings may not be refundable, even if the weather turns inclement, you become sick or get injured. Check terms and conditions carefully, as these also set out and what your obligations are when participating in snow activities.
- If your accommodation does not match the advertising, advise the trader of your concerns as soon as possible. If the matter cannot be resolved, put your complaint in writing to the trader and consider taking photos of any issues, as this will assist in proving your complaint.
- If you have concerns with the working order or safety of hired equipment, these should be addressed immediately with the trader. Do not continue to use faulty equipment.
- It is compulsory to carry properly fitting snow chains when driving a twowheel-drive during the ski season on most roads within the Kosciuszko National Park. Chains are readily available for hire from service stations and


traders in the area, and must be fitted when directed by authorised staff at the designated fitting areas.
