
eNewsletter # 178 - 09 March 2015

08 March, from the Hornsby Advocate: Man, 19, dies after getting trapped under a car at Berowra Heights

A YOUNG man has died after becoming trapped under a car at Berowra Heights on Friday. It's believed the 19-year-old was doing mechanical repairs on the car in Woodcourt Rd about 6.30pm when he became trapped.

Police from Ku-ring-gai Local Area Command attended with other emergency services and attempted to revive the man without success. A crime scene was established and police commenced an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the man's death. Police will prepare a report for the Coroner and are urging anyone with information to call **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000**.

05 March, from Crime Stoppers: Police release images after Sydney ATM's targeted - NSW Police Force Fraud and Cybercrime Squad

Police from State Crime Command's Fraud and Cybercrime Squad have released images of people who may be able to assist with inquiries into card skimming offences across Sydney. Investigators believe a group are currently working together to target ATM's of various banks, attaching skimmers and video cameras to the machines.

Officers would like to interview three people in the CCTV images released today in relation to these matters, as police continue to investigate the offences. The images were taken at about the time, of and in the vicinity of, skimming offences committed at Hurstville, Chatswood and Burwood in January this year (2015).



Anyone with information that may assist investigators, including the identity of

those depicted, is urged to contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

The Fraud and Cybercrime Squad works closely with financial institutions to ensure intelligence and images of people suspected of ATM skimming are promptly made available to the police for prosecution purposes; **however**, **would urge ATM users to take the following precautions:**

- When using an ATM, always use your hand to cover the key pad when entering your PIN.
- Always maintain security of your card.
- Be alert at all times when using your cards to purchase goods or withdraw money from an ATM.
- Report any people acting suspiciously around ATM's to the police.
- Regularly check your credit card statements and promptly report any irregularities to your financial institution.
- Always maintain sight of your card and ensure the transaction is processed in your presence every time you make a purchase.
- Retain your receipts from purchases for comparison purposes.

04 March, from the Hornsby Advocate: Police seize 1kg cocaine parcel destined for Mt Colah

MORE than 1kg of cocaine destined for a Mt Colah address was seized by police on Monday. Police said the cocaine was sent in a parcel from South America. The bust follows investigations by the Organised Crime Squad and the Australian Crime Commission (ACC). Yesterday afternoon police arrested a man and a woman at Wahroonga and they were taken to Hornsby Police Station.

Organised Crime Squad detectives then executed a search warrant on a home at Kogarah Bay, seizing 1.2kg of white powder believed to be cocaine, \$170,000 cash and other items. A second search warrant was executed at Mt Colah where electronic items were seized. The estimated potential street value of the cocaine is more than \$2 million. A 42-year-old Kogarah man has been charged with two counts of supplying a prohibited drug greater than a large commercial quantity and dealing with the proceeds of crime. A 38-year-old Mt Colah woman was released pending further inquiries. Officers attached to Strike Force Aldred and the ACC'S Operation Eligo began investigations into the commercial supply of cocaine in Sydney last month.

04 March, from the Hornsby Advocate: Man charged after police recover \$120,000 camper-trailer stolen from Berowra Heights

A MAN is due to face Fairfield Local Court today after police recovered a \$120,000 camper-trailer stolen from a home in Berowra Heights. Ku-ring-gai Police, with the assistance of officers from the South West Metropolitan Region, executed a search warrant at an auto-centre business in Wetherill Park about 1pm yesterday. During the search, they seized the stolen camper-trailer, as well as a Toyota LandCruiser and a boat, both of which are believed to have been illegally obtained. A stun-gun, numerous rounds of 9mm ammunition, an expandable baton, a flick knife and other items were also seized from the business.

A 31-year-old man was arrested at the property. He was allegedly found to be in possession of approximately 28 grams of cocaine and a number of prescription medications. He was taken to Green Valley Police Station where he was charged with supplying a prohibited drug; dealing in the proceeds of crime; and possessing a prohibited weapon/ammunition. Police said the camper-trailer was stolen during

a **break and enter at a home on Turner Rd, Berowra Heights** between January 31 and February 7. Investigators from the Ku-ring-gai Local Area Command's Proactive Team were notified of the robbery and immediately commenced an investigation into the matter.

04 March: Do you recognise these men? Armed robbery - Eastwood

Police have released CCTV images and are appealing for witnesses following an armed robbery at a convenience store in Eastwood. About 1.40pm (Tuesday 17 February 2015), a 31-year-old woman was working at the counter of a shop on Terry Road, when three men entered with their faces covered. One of the men allegedly threatened the attendant with a knife. Another man grabbed a large number of confectionary products and cigarettes while the third kept watch. The three men ran from the store and were seen fleeing in a grey sedan toward Darvall Road.

Police were called and officers from Ryde Local Area Command attended commencing an investigation. The attendant was not injured during the incident. A search was conducted of the area but the three men were not located.

Police have been told that the white 2007 Mercedes Benz SL65 AMG Roadster went missing, sometime between 12-2pm, from George Street St Albans while parked on the street. It is believed a witness saw two men and a tow truck in the street around the time the car went missing.

03 March, from News Local: Man from Carlingford charged with "up skirting― , voyeurism after Go Pro seized

POLICE are looking for at least 37 victims of a 38-year-old Carlingford man, who allegedly filmed up women's skirts, and into bathrooms.

The appeal comes after a Go Pro and a number of electronic storage devices were seized from the man's home in December last year. The storage devices depict the man, who is known to police, and a number of alleged acts of peep and pry, voyeurism, "up skirting― offences, along with acts of indecency, an indecent assault and aggravated break and enter offences. The offences are alleged to have occurred from October to December last year, in Carlingford, Epping, Beecroft, **Normanhurst and Thornleigh**.

TIP OF THE MONTH: Record your IMEI (International Mobile Station Equipment Identity) in case your mobile phone is lost or stolen.

It's a good idea to record your IMEI number. The IMEI (15 decimal digits: 14 digits plus a check digit) or IMEISV (16 digits) includes information on the origin, model, and serial number of the device. This is like the serial number for your phone, and can be used to help trace your phone or prove that the phone is yours, if it is lost or stolen. Find your IMEI number by looking underneath the battery, or by dialing *#06# (asterisk, hash, zero, six, hash).

From Hornsby Shire Council: Council is responsible for signs and banners throughout the Shire and can investigate unauthorised signage.

Some signage is exempt from Council control, such as real estate signs and community banners. There are also a number of places in Hornsby Shire where short-term community banners can be displayed without consent.

Approval may be required for some advertising signage. For more information refer to the Advertising and Signage information sheet at the Department of Planning, <u>click here</u>.

If you have concerns about unauthorised signage in Hornsby Shire you can ask Council to investigate.
