30 March, Hornsby Police news, 30/3/15 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: Smash repair business fire Time/Date: About 4.45pm Friday 27th Place: Kelray place, Asquith

Details: Workers at the repair business noticed smoke coming from an area inside the workshop with a fire starting to engulf the area. Several workers have used fire extinguishers and pressure water cleaners to try and put the fire out while fire brigade units were on the way. The fire was eventually put out about 6.45pm by the fire brigade; police and fire investigators onsite commenced an investigation. In total 6 privately-owned cars at the business for repairs were destroyed. Inquiries into the cause are still being investigated, but at this stage it does not appear to be suspicious.

Incident: Car on fire.

Time/Date: About 3.15pm Saturday 28th Place: Koola Avenue, East Killara

Details: The owner of a Citroen had just finished refereeing a local football match, as he attempted to start his car, smoke then flames could be seen coming from under the bonnet. The fire brigade were called and extinguished the fire, however the car was destroyed. Investigations revealed a manifold leak was the likely cause of the fire.

27 March, from Stay Smart Online: Google Android installation vulnerability paves way for vulnerability: Alert Priority High

A vulnerability in Google's Android operating system could enable an attacker to covertly replace a benign Android application with malware during the

installation process. The vulnerability affects applications installed from third party application stores.

According to <u>researchers</u>, this malware could allow the attacker to gain full access to a compromised Android device, including usernames, passwords and sensitive data. It is estimated that this vulnerability could potentially affect nearly half of all current Android devices. Devices running Android 4.4, KitKat, or later are not affected.

Please also have a read of the Crime Prevention Tips regarding letterboxes:

• If you live in an apartment complex, approach your body corporate or strata managers and request to install CCTV cameras to overlook mailboxes.


- Clear your mail at least once daily
- If you are in strata situation consider if the letter boxes could be in a more secure location only accessible by the tenants
- Consider installing CCTV overlooking the mailboxes
- Consider a different style of mailbox that cannot be opened by a skeleton key or forced open.
- Ensure you have a sturdy lock on your mailbox
- If you will be away for a period of time, have your mail held at the post office or have someone you trust collect your mail.
- Consider a PO Box
- Do not have anything valuable such as credit cards mailed to you collect credit cards from the bank where possible.
- Contact your utility and communication providers and request that your bills are emailed to you.
- Cheques can be transferred electronically
- Sign up for electronic statements
- It's a good idea to invest in a personal credit check if you suspect that your identity has been used.
- Keep any eye on anyone acting suspiciously around mailboxes and if you see someone acting suspicious, notify police.

25 March, from NSW Fair Trading: Phony callers are doing the rounds at the moment offering tax refunds from us here at Fair Trading.



Hot Off the Press! Some tips from tonight's Turramurra Neighbourhood Watch meeting, where our Crime Prevention Officer (CPO) was talking about "The Importance of Photographing, Identifying and Measuring your Valuable Items." In no particular order...

- As well as the front, photograph the back of an item, showing the serial number etc.
- Store your list of valuables as a spreadsheet and keep it elsewhere than
 your home email it to yourself for safe-keeping on the cloud, copy to a
 USB stick and keep at work, or seal in an envelope and ask a friend to look
 after it.
- Password protect your p.c.
- Don't install a safe with a gap beneath this gives purchase to a crow bar.
- Your first line of defence is a good quality alarm, with a good battery backup.
- Don't advertise you are on holiday get a neighbour to help clear junk mail, clear the local newspapers, park on your driveway, maybe mow the grass.
- Don't leave the garage remote control in your car.
- Deadlock the internal access door from the garage into your home.
- New home-owners/new tenants have the locks re-keyed/changed.
- Chaperone any tradies in your home you are probably not insured if you have invited them in.
- Only use a tradie you know or is recommended by a friend.
- If you have given your home key and/or burglar alarm code to a tradie, consider having the locks re-keyed and/or replacing that alarm code.
- Consider installing a cctv system.
- Borrow an engraver and/or UV pen from our CPO and mark your valuables with your drivers licence number. Phone Hornsby Police Station on 9746 9799.



From the Hornsby Advocate, 26 March: State called on to oversee brothels

LOSING its case against an alleged illegal brothel has prompted Hornsby Council to call on the State Government to take over responsibility for the red light industry. The council lost its case and about \$100,000 in court costs last month, trying to prosecute an alleged illegal brothel in the Hornsby CBD.

As part of its investigation, the council hired an undercover investigator to have paid sex with an alleged sex worker to provide evidence for its case. However, the court dismissed the case for lack of evidence, citing the Restricted Premises Act 1943 defines a brothel as having more than one prostitute providing sexual services in exchange for payment.

The council voted unanimously to write to NSW Attorney- General Brad Hazzard in support of a parliamentary inquiry into the regulation of brothels across the state and transfer compliance and enforcement responsibilities to the State Government. It also called on the NSW Planning Department for an "urgent review of the legislative definitions of a brothel― .

A Planning Department spokesman said there were no current plans to change the definition of brothels under the Act and would respond to the council's motion once received. Mayor Steve Russell said the laws were "ridiculous― . "l don't think we should have to provide more than one instance of a prostitute offering sexual services,― he said.
