31 January, from Hornsby SES: When preparing for a storm, it is important to

secure loose items around a home.

Yesterday, this trampoline was blown in the wind and landed next to a fallen tree in the Arcadia area. Hornsby SES Volunteers cut the tree off the road last night. Loose items around a home can become projectiles in a storm and cause damage to property. This morning is a good opportunity to clean up around the home and check for any storm damage. BIG NIGHT? BE WARY IN THE MORNING

Your police conduct random breath testing 24 hours a day as drivers are discovered over the limits at all hours. If you drive after a late drinking night out, you are still likely to have some alcohol in your blood. When you consume a standard drink (a middy or small glass of wine) your blood alcohol rises on average 0.02.

That standard drink roughly takes one hour to be processed by your body and out of your blood. If you have a big night out with a late finish, you are likely to be still over 0.05 for some time when you wake up. So, plan your night out and the next day as well to be safe on the road.

WAHROONGA A 39year-old man was admitted to the Sydney Adventist Hospital after a violent robber bashed him with a metal bar last week in Gordon, About 3pm on Monday January 18, the victim from Stanmore – who was going to meet a friend at St Ives - was dropped off by a taxi in Gordon. The 39-year-old was approached by a man described as caucasian of a medium build and height with short brown buzz-cut hair. wearing a vellow shirt. The robber said 'how are you?' and before the victim could speak he asked for money and produced a metal bar. The robber hit the man over the head and arms before the victim threw \$350 at the attacker. The victim woke up bleeding from the head after his friend found him on Rosedale Ave in Gordon and took him to the SAN hospital. Hornsby police spoke to the victim and would like to hear from anyone who has information that may be able to assist them.

GLENORIE Police are calling for witnesses after a spate of thefts around the Glenorie area over the weekend. Two white vans, a motorbike and bicycle were stolen from four properties sometime between 6pm on Saturday and 7.30am on Sunday, One Nissan van from Dobbie place and another one from Tecoma Dr were stolen on Saturday, Also on Tecoma Dr, a 2013 Yamaha yz 250s dirt bike was stolen from a garage that had its lock forced open, and a \$1000 hybrid bike was stolen from a garage on the same street. Police are investigating and would like to speak to any

witnesses.

5 HORNSBY Police were alerted to suspicious activity at the Les Shore Reserve in Glenorie on Saturday. When they arrived at 2.20am, they found two people asleep. A 20-year-old man from Hornsby was given a cannabis caution.

HORNSBY Police are 6 urging people to be careful in warmer weather as there is a tendency to leave car windows slightly open. When parking on hot days - whether in a street, at the park or the beach - make sure all windows are closed and doors are locked. Don't provide easy access to your car. If you park in a garage make sure you lock it. Make sure all valuables are out of sight. Consider using a high-quality steering wheel lock, install a high-quality electric alarm or install an engine immobiliser. Keep your keys safe, keep them secure. Report Littering from a Vehicle

If you see someone littering from their vehicle, you can report them to the EPA. Fines from \$250 can now be issued from your reports. To report littering from a vehicle you need to:

- be 18 years of age or over
- have actually seen the litter being thrown (or blown) from the vehicle
- be able to provide details of the vehicle registration and the location the littering took place
- report the incident within 14 days
- make the report through the EPA website or the report to EPA mobile app.

From our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Car Owners:

- 11. LOCK VEHICLES IN FRONT OF HOME, ON THE DRIVEWAY, IN THE GARAGE easily forgotten if you're in the garden.
- 12. DISPLAY A SIGN †ALL VALUABLES HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM THIS VEHICLE†. CONSIDER LEAVING THE GLOVE BOX AND/OR CENTRE CONSOLE OPEN. This proves to thieves there is nothing worth taking.
- 13. BEWARE BLOOD ALCOHOL LEVELS THE-MORNING-AFTER-THE-NIGHT-BEFORE. Does your work depend on your licence?
- 14. REMEMBER TO TAKE YOUR PARKING TICKET WITH YOU. This makes it difficult for the thief to steal your car.
- 15. USE A HANDS-FREE KIT FOR YOUR PHONE. Preferably, keep phone calls & messaging for later.
- 16. CHECK THE PERSONAL PROPERTY SECURITY REGISTER www.ppsr.gov.au TO SEE IF A VEHICLE HAS AN OUTSTANDING DEBT. (You can also check machinery, crops, livestock & accounts. It accesses the NATIONAL EXCHANGE OF VEHICLE & DRIVER INFORMATION SYSTEM (NEDVIS) ie whether the car has been written-off, stolen, its make, model, colour etc.
- 17. CONSIDER NOT INCLUDING †HOME†IN YOUR GPS, BUT A NON-EXISTANT ADDRESS NEARBY. If your car is stolen & you have a garage door opener, the thief won†that have easy access to your house.
- 18. KEEP YOUR CAR KEYS BY YOUR BED AT NIGHT. The remote control can be used as a panic button in an emergency, setting off the car alarm. DON'T BE TEMPTED TO LEAVE KEYS ON THE TABLE BY THE FRONT DOOR.
