7 February, From Hawkesbury Command

Another example of why it is dangerous to drive across roads impacted by flood water. In February this year, a fire vehicle from Tewantin in Queensland was travelling slowly on a road experiencing what appeared only minor flooding. Given the size and capability of the vehicle, the crew made a decision to cross, unfortunately not knowing that the surface beneath the road had collapsed, causing the fire truck to become engulfed in a large subsidence. Please do not cross roads impacted by floods!





### **6 February, NSW Police Force**

Recently noted at Hornsby SES meeting (Our understanding - please do your own detailed research):

There has been a change in law. When a tree falls onto another property, it is now the responsibility of the owner where it falls (NOT, as previously, the responsibility of the owner of where the tree root ball was). So, if a tree growing in property A falls on properties B, C & D, the insurance companies of B, C & D will all be used. Also, any debris fallen on B, C & D shouldn't be thrown back over onto A's property.

### 2 February, Traffic and Highway Patrol Command

<u>â€</u>ª#Loadfail‬ trifecta ! AUSTRALIAN ROAD RULES - REG 292

Insecure or overhanging load 292 Insecure or overhanging load

A driver must not drive or tow a vehicle if the vehicle is carrying a load that:

- (a) is not properly secured to the vehicle, or
- (b) is placed on the vehicle in a way that causes the vehicle to be unstable, or
- (c) projects from the vehicle in a way that is likely to injure a person, obstruct the path of other drivers or pedestrians, or damage a vehicle or anything else (for example, the road surface).

Penalty: Offence provision.

Note: Other laws of this jurisdiction may deal with the loading of vehicles and carrying loads on vehicles.

Drive/tow vehicle with unsecured load \$425 / 3 demerits
Drive/tow vehicle with load causing instability \$425 / 3 demerits
Drive/tow vehicle with overhanging load \$425 / 3 demerits
Not remove/have removed any thing fallen/put on road \$425 / 3

### 2 February, NSW Police Force, [Edited]

New rules are being introduced on our roads to help drivers, bicycle riders and pedestrians Go Together safely. We all need to respect each other's space to ensure that everyone stays safe. On average, 11 bicycle riders are killed and 1500 seriously injured in NSW each year.

These new rules will come into effect on 1st March 2016.

• Introducing a new rule requiring drivers to leave a minimum distance when passing bicycle riders – at least one metre when travelling up to 60km/h and at least 1.5 metres when travelling faster than 60km/h, which will attract a penalty of \$319 and two demerit points.







Bicycle riders over 18 must carry photo ID

From 1 March 2016, all bicycle riders aged 18 and over must carry the required photo identification. This will help riders be identified in an emergency. NSW Police will also be able to ask for identification if they believe a bicycle rider has broken the road rules.

Bicycle riders will have 12 months to adjust to the new law. From 1 March 2017, riders stopped by police for breaking the road rules could face a \$106 fine if they do not have the required photo ID.

The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command.

Incident: Fail to supply breath analysis charge Time/Date: About 12.45am Tuesday 2nd

Place: Thornleigh

Vehicle 1: Toyota Rav 4 Driver 1: 38 year old male

Vehicle 2: Mercedes.

Details: About 12.45am the owner of a Mercedes was standing beside his car in the McDonalds car park. At that time a Toyota Rav 4 has reversed out of a parking spot and crashed into the Mercedes. The Rav 4 driver, a 38 year old male has got out and looked at the cars, then got back in and drove off. Police were called and attended. While police were there the Mercedes owner has sighted the Rav 4 on the Cumberland highway and told police, who gave chase. The Rav 4 was eventually stopped near Beecroft road and the driver spoken to. Police allege the Rav 4 driver begain swearing and refused a roadside breath test. He was then arrested and taken to Hornsby police station. The male has then refused a breath analysis, and he was charged. His licence was suspended by police.

Court: The driver is to appear at the Hornsby local Court on the 24 February charged with Failing or refusing a breath analysis and failing to exchange particulars as a result of the crash.

Incident: Drugs charge

Time/Date: About 5.45pm Friday 29th

Place: Hornsby mall

Person 1: 19 year old male.

Details: Police were patrolling the mall area and have seen a male drinking alcohol in the alcohol free zone. Police approached and spoke to the male who was holding something in his right hand and acting suspiciously. A search revealed a plastic bag containing a white substance police will allege is the drug known as ICE. A further search resulted in another bag of white powder (allegedly ICE) being located in a bum bag. The male allegedly made certain admissions to the possession of the drugs. He was then charged.

Incident: Stolen box trailer

Time/Date: between Sat 23 Jan and Sun 22 Jan

Place: Bunnings Thornleigh

Details: A silver coloured Bunnings box trailer, stored in the underground car park

was stolen by persons unknown.

Incident: Stolen car

Time/Date: Between 3.30pm and 6.30pm Monday 1st

Place: Galston aquatic centre.

Details: A silvered Hyundai I30 was parked at the aquatic centre, about 6.30pm the owner returned and found the car missing. It appears the driver's window had

been smashed.

Details: A home was broken into and ransacked; a watch was taken during the

incident. The alarm to the house showed it was activated at 10.20pm.
