

10 March, Android malware targets Australia banking apps, from 9news.

Millions of Australian bank customers who use Android devices could be at risk from a malware virus that steal account details.

Commonwealth Bank, Westpac, National Australia Bank and ANZ Bank customers are all targeted by the malware which hides on infected devices waiting until the user accesses their banking apps.

9 March, Carjacking attempt in St Leonard's foiled by good Samaritan as police investigations continue.

A 55-year-old woman has been rescued by a passing stranger after a man armed with a knife attempted a carjacking.

The incident occurred about 10.15am this morning on the Pacific Highway in St Leonards when the woman was stopped at a red light.

Police alleged the man approached the car, got in the front seat and held a knife to the woman's chest, telling her to drive.

Identifying Elder Abuse

What to look for (signs of abuse)

- · Carer hovers around older person
- Unkempt appearance
- · Ill-fitting clothes or underweight
- Not dressed appropriately for weather
- · Poor hygiene or unsanitary conditions
- · No food in the house, unpaid bills
- · Overly paranoid or excessive fear
- · Limited access to money/bank account

Elder abuse can take many forms

Financial: Misuse of money, bank accounts or powers of attorney.

Psychological: Verbal abuse; belitting or name-calling: isolating older person from others. Neglect: Failure to provide for basic needs,

e.g. food, heating or healthcare.

Physical: Assault; shoving or rough handling;

physical or chemical restraint.

Sexual: Any unwelcome sexual behaviour or act; can include inappropriate washing or handling.







Responding to Elder Abuse

Talk/listen to the older person

Ask the person if they feel safe to talk and arrange for privacy if necessary.

Do not just rely on information from family or carers

Exclude if needed.

Respect the right of the older person to decide for themself

e.g. finances; who lives with them, etc.


If you suspect abuse, take action

- Call an ambulance; a social admission to hospital can prevent further abuse
- . Consult the DO, DVLO or CPO
- · Record all details on COPS
- Contact myagedcare for a service assessment
- Call EAHRU for advice











March 10, from the Hornsby Advocate:

Police have charged a

KILLARA

man after he was allegedly disturbed during a break-in about 12.30am on Tuesday, Police were called to a unit on the Pacific Hwy in Killara, following reports of a break-in. When North Shore police arrived they spoke with a 24-year-old resident of the apartment, who was uninjured. Shortly after, police found two men sitting on the awning of the unit. One man, aged 41, came down on police request, however the other man, aged 33, stayed on the awning for a short time before he was able to climb onto the balcony. Following a search of the 33-year-old man, officers located medication boxes and an electric shaver. Police will allege the items were stolen from the unit. The 33-year-old was taken to Chatswood Police Station, where he was charged with aggravated break and enter. He was refused bail and will appear in Hornsby Local Court.

TURRAMURRA

\$2400 was taken from a home on Lamond Drive between midnight and 11am on Monday. The ground floor screen door was found open, a purse, it's contents and a wallet were stolen.

WAHROONGA

Seven rooms were ransacked and a laptop was stolen from a home in Water St between 10am and 2pm on Monday. Burglars smashed a ground floor glass window to get into the home.

TURRAMURRA

A thief broke into two cars on Laurence St between 5pm on Sunday and 6am on Monday. Lollies were taken from a Toyota Yaris and a Subaru was also broken into but nothing appears to have been taken from it.

From Hornsby Shire Council: New rules for drivers, bicycle riders and pedestrians

From 1 March 2016, new rules come into effect to help drivers, bicycle riders and pedestrians. We all need to respect each other's space to ensure that everyone stays safe.

Drivers must give bicycle riders at least a metre of space

From 1 March 2016, drivers who pass a bicycle rider must allow a distance of at least:

- 1 metre when the speed limit is 60km/h or less
- 1.5 metres when the speed limit is more than 60km/h

Tip #9: FORM A 'NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH' WITH ALL BUSINESSES, RETAILERS, COMMERCIAL PREMISES, HOUSEHOLDERS ETC IN YOUR LOCAL AREA. You are the eyes and ears of your community.

Tip #13: PHOTOGRAPH & RECORD DESCRIPTIONS, MODEL & SERIAL NUMBER OF ALL VALUABLES. CONSIDER ETCHING A DRIVERS LICENCE NUMBER.â€"

- Warrimoo Avenue 6.45am to 1.30pm northbound lane only between Killeaton Street and Mungarra Avenue
- Woodbury Road 8.30am to 1pm between Mona Vale Road and Hume Avenue
