# 03 April, from The Daily Telegraph: Evacuations as huge fire rages in Hornsby factory

FOUR people have been injured and dozens evacuated as a massive factory fire in Sydney's north continues to burn. Emergency services were called to a business in Jersey Street Hornsby just before 6am this morning where they found the building well alight. Paramedics treated four people for smoke inhalation and police evacuated up to 60 residents of neighbouring properties as a precaution.

# 31 March, from 7News: Murder charge after Sydney stabbing

Secret affairs or a jilted ex-lover could be the motives behind a frenzied stabbing attack at a Sydney restaurant which left a man dead and a woman seriously injured. Horrified patrons fled in terror from the Kang Nam BBQ restaurant in the Hornsby Westfield Shopping Centre as a couple were stabbed repeatedly while eating dinner about 9.30pm on Wednesday. A 44-year-old man has been charged with murder and attempted murder over the killing of a 53-year-old man and the injuries suffered by a 38-year-old woman. Some media are reporting the attacker is the woman's ex-partner.



# HOT OFF THE PRESS - Tonight's Turramurra Neighbourhood Watch meeting

Thanks to **Rose Torossian**, Volunteer Paralegal with Dr Cedric Spencer Lawyers who spoke about the "Care, Responsibility & Protection of Children & Young Persons".

Rose was very clear that protecting children is everyone's responsibility. Everyone in the community has a role to play, and this includes Neighbourhood Watch. Any person can report if they believe a child is at risk of harm, and it will remain confidential. If you suspect a child is at risk, phone **Child Protective Services on 132 111**.

Thanks also to Senior Constable Paul Cleary, Crime Prevention Officer at Hornsby Police Station. Paul gave an update on the crime position within the command. Currently we have had a spike in Steal from Motor Vehicles, including vehicles that

weren't locked! In one instance thousands of dollars of a tradie's tools were stolen. If you can only garage one vehicle, consider protecting the work vehicle, where your livelihood may depend on it. Please lock your car and remove valuables from view.

Paul led a great discussion on the various scams that are around and to be aware of. Have you had the phone call asking if you've been in a car accident and need help with a claim? Hang up. Paul also reminded us to:

- never click on unknown links in emails
- back-up our computer
- never give personal details out over the phone
- · change the locks when moving into a new home
- secure our mobile phone with a good password
- run a security system on our mobile phone (just like on a computer)
- not let our mobile remember any passwords (just like on a computer)
- report scams to the Australian Cybercrime Online Reporting Network (ACORN)

As a community member we are encouraged to **report illegal dumping** of waste and hazardous materials. Please help keep your neighbourhood safe and clean.

#### WAHROONGA

Police laid charges against two Wahroonga men over the alleged assault of another man in Parramatta. The two men are alleged to have been involved in a brawl where a 39-year-old man was kicked, punched and left with suspected facial fractures at Parramatta railway station. A third man, 20, from Blacktown was also charged over the incident, which occurred on March 16 about 11.40pm. The three men, in their 20s, ran from the scene but were arrested by Police Transport Command at the Argyle St bus interchange a short time later. The 20-year-old man from Wahroonga and the Blacktown man were each charged with affray and were granted conditional bail to face Parramatta Local Court on Wednesday, April 13. The other man, 22, from Wahroonga was charged with affray and will face Parramatta Local Court at

#### MOUNT COLAH

A Mount Colah man was charged with high-range drink-driving after his Holden Commodore hit seven cars on Crown Rd in Queenscliff on Sunday about 11pm. At least four cars have been written off. The 27-year-old driver allegedly blew 0.169 and will face Manly Court on Tuesday, May 3.

# ST IVES

An alleged burglar, who fled on a bicycle, ended up in hospital with wrist injuries after he was chased and arrested by police on Tuesday. Between 2.30-3.30pm, a burglar forced a lock on a ground floor unit at Eastern Arterial Rd and stole credit cards and jewellery. The alleged thief was later stopped by police after a short pursuit of a bike, which turned into a foot pursuit. A 29-year-old Belmont North man is assisting police with their investigations.

#### ROSEVILLE

Police have charged a teenager with trespassing and malicious damage after he gatecrashed a party. Last Thursday, about 8.30pm, police were called to a premises on Oliver Rd, after a couple of teenagers had tried to jump the rear fence to get into the party. Police later found a 17-year-old male from Turramurra nearby, and when they spoke to him,

he became argumentative and started using offensive language. He was given a direction to move on, which he complied with, but when police returned to Oliver Rd, they found the teen, who again used offensive language. Due to the level of intoxication, he was arrested and taken to Chatswood Police Station, where his parents were contacted.
