While stay at home directions are in place for Greater Sydney, including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong and Shellharbour, it's important to remind everyone that fleeing a violent or abusive relationship and seeking

domestic and family violence related services is a reasonable excuse to leave home.

13 July, from NSW Health:



From Tuesday 13 July, face masks must be worn in all indoor common property areas of residential premises in Greater Sydney (including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong and Shellharbour).

This includes any shared areas in apartment blocks including lobbies, lifts, stairwells, corridors and laundry facilities.

Masks must be worn by anyone entering including:

- residents
- staff such as cleaners and building managers
- visitors such as tradespeople, contractors, food and mail delivery services

You do not need to wear a mask inside your own apartment.

If you live in Greater Sydney but not in a residence with shared spaces, this mask advice does not apply to you.

09 July, from NSW Health: Please stay at home

⚠️ STAY AT HOME ORDER – ADDITIONAL RESTRICTIONS ⚠️



Given the growing number of infectious cases in the community and unlinked cases of community transmission, COVID-19 restrictions will be tightened across Greater Sydney including the Central Coast, Blue Mountains, Wollongong and Shellharbour.

From 5pm today (Friday, 9 July) the following additional restrictions will be in place:

- Outdoor public gatherings limited to two people (excluding members of the same household);
 - People must stay in their Local Government Area or within 10kms of home for exercise and outdoor recreation, with no carpooling between non-household members;
 - Browsing in shops is prohibited, plus only one person per household, per day may leave the home for shopping;
-

- Funerals limited to ten people in total (this will take effect from Sunday, 11 July);

The four reasons to leave your home remain in place:

- Shopping for food or other essential goods and services (one person only);
- Medical care or compassionate needs (only one visitor can enter another residence to fulfil carers' responsibilities or provide care or assistance, or for compassionate reasons);
- Exercise with no more than 2 (unless members of the same household);
- Essential work, or education, where you cannot work or study from home.

Restrictions in regional NSW will remain unchanged.

These tightened restrictions are based on health advice from the Chief Health Officer Dr Kerry Chant.

They are necessary due to the increasing number of unlinked cases in the community.

We understand this is a difficult time for the community and businesses. We thank them for their understanding and patience.

High testing numbers are key to finding unrecognised chains of transmission in the community, so please continue to come forward for a COVID-19 test, even if you have the mildest of symptoms.

Malicious Damage, including graffiti is a terrible eyesore and nothing a community should ever accept.

We continually have graffiti and other forms of malicious damage occurring within the Command. In railway corridors, ovals, parks, children's areas, BBQ areas, private homes.

No suburb is immune from it.

If you see someone acting suspiciously whether in the day or nighttime we need you to call us and report them to us at the time.

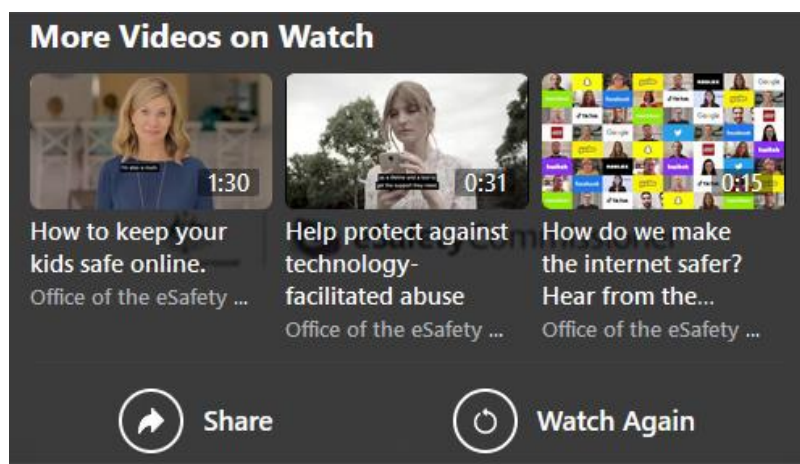

RIDING IN TAXIS/RIDE SHARE VEHICLES AND WEARING SEATBELTS – WHAT ARE THE LAWS?

Wearing a seatbelt doubles your chance of survival and reduces your risk of injury in a road crash.

Drivers will also make their passengers safer by wearing a seatbelt. In a crash impacting on the driver's side, an unrestrained driver can be thrown around the vehicle, injuring their front seat passenger.

The penalty for not wearing a seatbelt is a fine and loss of demerit points. Double demerits apply for seatbelt offences in Double demerit enforcement periods.

Drivers are responsible for passengers under 16 years old to be properly restrained in a seatbelt or an approved child restraint. A baby under 12 months must be restrained in an approved child restraint.

Passengers aged 16 years and older travelling in a taxi who do not use an available seatbelt will be fined.

A man has spit on another customer in an altercation over face masks at Thornleigh Bunnings.

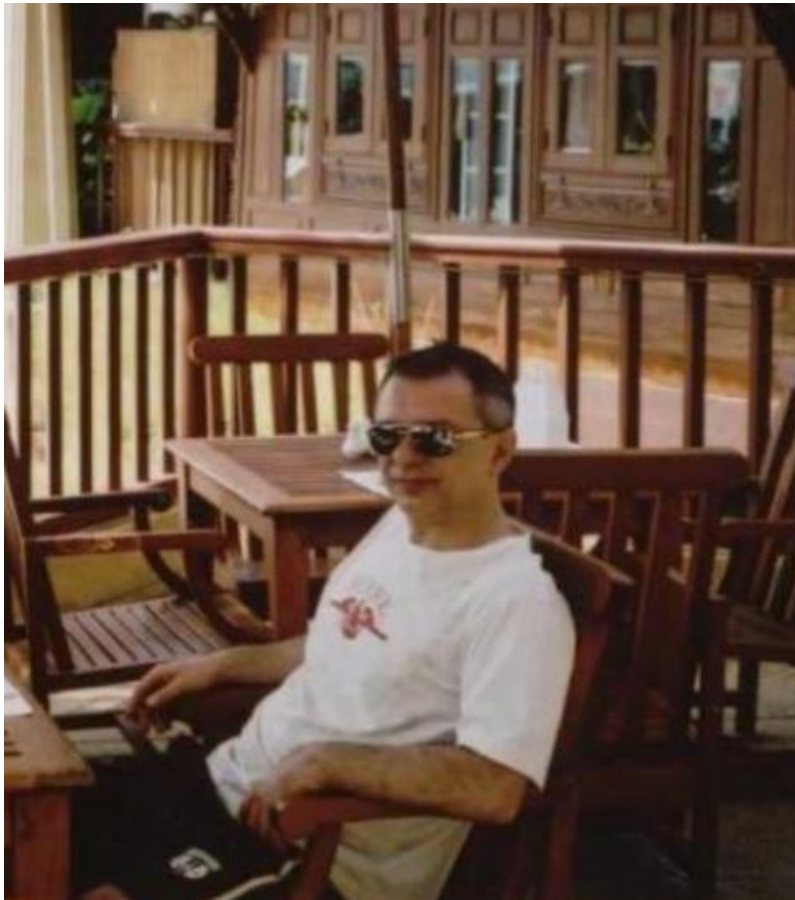
NSW Police Deputy Commissioner Mal Lanyon confirmed to Jim Wilson a man is being interviewed at Hornsby police station, assisting officers in their enquiries.

“That is a disgraceful act, and we’re asking for people to show some humanity.

“If someone is asking you to put a mask on, it’s because they’re caring about your health and the health of others.

“There was nothing threatening in the male’s action.”

NSW Police have released an image of a man and are appealing for public assistance, as part of ongoing investigations into the disappearance of Reville Balmain more than 26 years ago.

Reville Balmain, then aged 22, was last seen in the Kingsford area on Saturday 5 November 1994.

Her personal property – including a make-up bag, keys and a shoe – was later found scattered near Ainslie Street.

Ms Balmain was reported missing later that evening and has not been seen or heard from since.

Despite extensive investigations by local police at the time and over the years, no one has been charged in relation to her disappearance.

A Coronial Inquest in 1999 found that Reville had died at the hands of a person or persons unknown, and the matter was referred to the Unsolved Homicide Unit for future investigation.

Last year, a formal review of the case was conducted under the new unsolved framework and assigned to a senior detective from the Central Metropolitan Region for re-investigation under Strike Force Aramac.

In May this year, a \$1 million reward was announced by the NSW Government, as part of a renewed appeal to the community to come forward with any information that may assist investigators with their inquiries into Ms Balmain's disappearance.

Following the public appeal, police received several reports from the community relevant to the investigations and are in the process of assessing the information and identifying all lines of possible further inquiry.

As part of these ongoing inquiries, police have released an image of a man they wish to identify, and who may have information relating to Revelle's last known movements prior to her disappearance.

Strike Force Aramac lead investigator, Detective Chief Inspector Stuart Bell said the image was sent through to investigators anonymously following the reward announcement.

"It is believed that this image was taken some time in the mid-2000s, but that the individual depicted may have information that would help us progress our investigation," Det Ch Insp Bell said.

"It is our hope that someone in the community may recognise this man so we can speak with him and ensure all possible avenues of inquiry are followed through.

"As always, we continue to encourage anyone in the public that may have information about Revelle's disappearance to come forward and speak with police, so that we may finally provide answers to her family," Det Ch Insp Bell said.

KNOW ABOUT TOTAL FIRE BANS: •CHECK THE RFS WEBSITE, OR PHONE RFS INFORMATION LINE ON 1800 679 737 TO FIND OUT IF THERE IS A TOTAL FIRE BAN IN PLACE. •BEWARE SPARKS: BBQs, incinerators, welding, angle-grinders, cigarettes, etc. •KNOW THE LAW: eg, to use an the electric/gas BBQ you must have available “an immediate and continuous supply of water”. •TOTAL FIRE BAN & CURRENT FIRE DANGER CAN BE FOUND AT: www.rfs.nsw.gov.au.

Tip #9. MAINTAIN ADEQUATE LEVELS OF HOME AND CONTENTS INSURANCE. If you underestimate the value of your property, any payout may be reduced accordingly.

Tip #12. BE ALERT TO ANY THREAT CONCERNING FIRES. If a person threatens to set a fire, the threat should be taken very seriously. Contact Hornsby Police Station: 9476 9799.

Tip #16. CHECK ALL SMOKE DETECTORS ARE WORKING. A good time to replace batteries is in Spring and Autumn, when you change the clocks. CHECK DATES ON FIRE EXTINGUISHERS. Give powder ones a good shake. BUY A FIRE BLANKET. And practise using it.
