
eNewsletter #575 - 18 October 2022

18 October, from NSW Police Force: Have you seen Simon?



Simon Feldman, aged 55, was last seen at an address on Guilfoyle Avenue, Double Bay, about 2pm yesterday (Sunday 16 October 2022).

Simon is described as being of Caucasian appearance, between 170cm to 175cm tall, of a medium build and green eyes.

He was last seen wearing black shorts and a light blue t-shirt.

Anyone who may have seen or heard from Simon, or may know of his whereabouts, is urged to contact police.

Police are investigating the theft of three vehicles, following a pursuit in Sydney's north west overnight.

About 1.45am today (Monday 17 October 2022), police attempted to stop a white Jaguar and a grey BMW travelling westbound along Pennant Hills.

When the vehicles failed to stop, a pursuit was initiated.

The pursuit continued along Pennants Hills Road before it was terminated on the M2, Kings Langley, due to the manner of driving.

Subsequent inquiries revealed the Jaguar, and a Dodge Ram utility were stolen from a home in Dural earlier that evening.

The Jaguar was located abandoned on Sedgemen Crescent, Shalvey and the Dodge on Ulundri Drive, Castle Hill. Both vehicles have been seized for forensic examination.

The BMW, which was reported stolen from a house in West Pennant Hills overnight, has not yet been recovered.

Investigations are ongoing by detectives from The Hills Police Area Command, with assistance from North West Metropolitan Region resources.

13 October, from NSW Police Force:



Drug and Firearms Squad detectives have charged four people following an investigation into the supply of prohibited drugs across the state's Central Coast and Hunter.

Search warrants were executed in Belmont North, Nords Wharf and Wadalba, where police seized more than 2kg of 'ice' – with an estimated potential street value of \$2 million – and \$220,000 cash.

Three men and a woman were arrested during the operation and each charged with drug-supply offences.



13 October, from 9news.com.au: Accused swim coach Kyle Daniels' evidence 'unusual', court hears



A Sydney swim coach's apparent inability to recall a key incident related to his alleged sexual touching of children doesn't stack up, a prosecutor has told a jury.

Balgowlah man Kyle James Henk Daniels has pleaded not guilty to 21 charges alleging inappropriate conduct towards young female students while working as a part-time instructor at a Mosman swim school in 2018 and 2019.

After a complaint was made in July 2018 to management about Daniels' touching of a girl during a lesson, a memo was circulated to staff about not holding children close to the groin or chest.

11 October, CSPC Meeting

Gay attended the CSPC (Community Safety Precinct Committee) at Hornsby Police Station. It was well attended with representatives from the community, such as Matt Kean's office, Alister Hensken's office, Westfield Security, CASS Group, Ku-ring-gai Council, etc. and also many officers from the Ku-ring-gai Command.

Sgt. Stephen Whalley presented crime statistics, giving a 12 month overview from June 2021 to June 2022. These figures are also available from the BOCSAR (Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research) website.


Crime categories discussed were Assault, Break & Enter, Steal from Dwellings, Malicious Damage, etc. Generally, crimes have been trending downwards in 2022. Only the Fraud category has increased in number, and that too by a very small margin.

Sgt Stephen Whalley also spoke about the PACER (Police Ambulance Clinical and Early Response) program which is gathering strength. It is a partnership

between the police and the ambulance services, offering on-site and telephone assistance to the community.

The good news is that Neighbourhood Watch have been offered support from the Ku-ring-Gai Command for our effort with the Kerb Numbering project. Stay tuned.


Tip #6. It can be a relief to talk to someone who cares: Lifeline Crisis Support 13 11 14. Lifeline.org.au

Tip #12. Check out the government's Stay Smart Online website. Get a copy of 'The Little Black Book of Scams' & stay aware. eg romance scams, scam artists such as tree-loppers, roof repair, etc. Don't be pressured into making a decision on the spot. Double-check with trusted friends or family.
