20 December, from NSW Police Force: Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a woman and three children, who are missing from Sydney's south-west.

Officers from Campbelltown City Police Area Command were contacted about 3pm yesterday (Sunday 18 December 2022) after a mother and her three children could not be located. Police were told Elizabeth Harpley, aged 36, and her sons, Mathew Harpley, aged 10, Christopher Harpley, aged nine, and Mitchell Devine-Harpley, aged five, were last seen at Koshigaya Park, Campbelltown, about 2pm. Family and police hold serious concerns for their welfare, as the children live with conditions that require medication, which they do not currently have in their possession. They are known to frequent the areas of Campbelltown and Wollongong in NSW, and Pullenvale in QLD. It's believed they are in the company of a 49-year-old man – who is known to the family – and may be travelling in a red Jeep with QLD registration plates 061 VKM. Police are urging anyone who sights the children to contact Triple Zero (000) immediately.

20 December, from NSW Police Force: Can you help us find Hayley?

Hayley Hopwood, aged 15, was reported missing to officers earlier this month. She was last seen about 8.20pm on Saturday (17 December 2022) at Mt Druitt Railway Station. Officers attached to Nepean Police Area Command are continuing extensive inquiries into her whereabouts. Police and family hold serious concerns for Hayley's welfare. Hayley is described as brown of Caucasian appearance, approximately 150-160cm tall, of thin build, with long brown hair and brown eyes. She is known to use public transport and frequent the Penrith and Mt Druitt areas. Anyone who sees Hayley or has any information regarding her whereabouts is urged to contact Nepean Police or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

16 December, from NSW Police: Detectives have released CCTV vision as they continue investigations into the suspicious death of a man in a Sydney hotel last week.

About 3pm on Wednesday 7 December 2022, emergency services were called to a hotel on Kent Street, over concerns for a man's welfare. Officers from Sydney City Police Area Command attended and found a man deceased in the stairwell of the hotel. A crime scene was established, and detectives commenced an investigation into the man's death, which is believed to be suspicious. The man has since been identified as 25-year-old Chinese national, Tao Cheng. Investigators believe he entered the stairwell about 9pm on Sunday 4 December and have now released CCTV of two men who they believe can assist with their inquiries. As inquiries continue, anyone with information regarding the two men or who has any further details on this incident is urged to contact **Sydney police or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.**

16 December, from NSW Police Force: Two men will face court today charged by Arson Squad detectives following an investigation into a suspicious house fire on Sydney's Lower North Shore.

About 10.50pm on Saturday 3 September 2022, emergency services were called to Cliff Road, Northwood, following reports of a house fire. Fire and Rescue NSW firefighters worked through the night to extinguish the blaze; however, the house sustained significant damage. No one was home at the time and no injuries were reported. Detectives from North Shore Police Area Command conducted initial inquiries, before the State Crime Command Financial Crimes Squad's Arson Unit took carriage of the investigation under Strike Force Lenghwise. Following extensive inquiries, detectives executed search warrants at homes in Wentworth Falls and Punchbowl about 7.30am yesterday (Wednesday 14 December 2022). During the search, officers seized several items relevant to the investigation, including a Toyota Hiace van, and electronic storage devices. A 69-year-old man and a 20-year-old man were arrested at the properties and taken to Katoomba and Campsie police stations respectively. Both men were charged with destroy of damage property in company by means of fire or explosive.

15 December, from NSW Police Force: Three men will face court today charged over their alleged involvement in the large commercial supply of prohibited drugs across Sydney.

In October 2022, detectives from Raptor Squad established Strike Force Caste to investigate

the supply and distribution of prohibited drugs and dealing with proceeds of crime across the Sydney region. About 5.50pm on Monday (12 December 2022), emergency services were called to a home in Austral Street, Kogarah, following reports of a fire. A 51-year-old man was located outside the property, suffering burns to his hands, legs, and face. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a serious condition. Following inquiries, strike force investigators executed search warrants at the Kogarah house and properties in Campsie and Kingsgrove about 4.30pm yesterday (Tuesday 13 December 2022). Police seized several items relevant to the investigation, including 5.7kg of cocaine, mobile phones, \$15,090 in cash, electronic storage devices, and drug manufacturing equipment. Three men – aged 30, 37, and 51 – were arrested and have since been charged. Investigations under Strike Force Caste are continuing.

This week Neighbourhood Watch Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby has been informally advised of several car thefts and attempted car thefts.

Unfortunately we have no details to share, only the basics. There were two attempted car break-ins in Killara. On Sunday evening, a car was stolen from Wyomee Av, West Pymble. Early Saturday morning, there was an attempt to steal a car from a driveway on Grayling Rd, West Pymble.

- Please lock your cars on your driveway and in your garage.
- Keep the keys away from sight in the house, eg inside a cupboard, rather than on the hall table.
- Register your CCTV with the police here.
- Warn your neighbours.

19 December, from The Hills command: Good one from a Hills Dad.... And to clarify.... If they're soft its not illegal.

It is illegal and dangerous to fit a bull bar or accessory that extends beyond the vehicle. Protrusions that extend beyond the vehicle could seriously injure a pedestrian or road users who may come into contact with the protrusion. Bull bars, vehicle frontal protection systems and racks used to carry ladders or loads of any type must not have:

- protrusions
- sharp edges
- pointed corners or accessories that interfere with the driver's field of view such as what you can see to the front and sides of the vehicle.

This includes loaded and unloaded racks, fishing rod holders, winches, additional lamps and their respective mounting brackets. Aerials and winches which cannot meet this requirement must be removed after operational use.

20 December, from NSW Fair Trading: The NSW Government will make the practice of solicited rent bidding illegal to improve affordability for those seeking rental accommodation amid high cost of living pressures.

The new regulations will apply to all new listings from Saturday, 17 December 2022.

20 December, from NSW DPI Fisheries: For its 15th consecutive year, Operation Trident has been put in place to crack down on the illegal harvesting of Seafood across NSW this Christmas.

This joint operation NSW Department of Primary Industries, the NSW Food Authority and NSW Police includes both covert and overt patrols and inspections across NSW and is designed to deter oyster theft and protect consumers against potentially unsafe black-market produce. Maximum fines of up to \$275,000 and imprisonment apply. NSW is known for producing a diverse range of delicious, fresh, and healthy seafood that is enjoyed by customers all over the world, and we want to keep it that way. We strongly urge the public not to consume Seafood products if they do not know where it has come from. 20 December, from 9Now: High-range drink driver receives suspended jail sentence

A magistrate has decided the fate of north west Sydney man Shelvin Singh after he was convicted of high range drink driving while he had his two young children in the car. Singh has been sentenced to 12 months jail, which has been suspended, provided he does 150 hours of community service and complies with a number of other court orders. Singh was handed his sentence late last week after he crashed into three parked cars in Glenorie in May.

The investigation began on 16 September, 2022 when the AFP-led Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCCE) received a report from the United States' National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) about an online user uploading child abuse material to Facebook Messenger.

17 December, from Nepean command: THERE'S NO NEED TO PANIC

Keep calm and relax – School holidays are almost upon us – Only one afternoon to go. Just a few tips in preparation for the holidays and if you're planning to travel

SOCIAL MEDIA:

• Don't advertise where you are going on holidays and how long you'll be away

YOUR VEHICLE:

- Ensure your vehicle is serviced with tyres and fluid levels checked before you leave.
- When leaving your car anywhere, make sure you secure it by locking it

DRIVING:

- Do not trust the other driver
- Plan your trip and take regular breaks when driving long distances
- Drive with your headlights on
- · Never drive when you're tired
- Do not drive whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Do not speed
- Do obey the road rules
- Do drive to the conditions of the road.
- Do not use your mobile phone illegally when driving

YOUR HOME:

- Ensure your windows and doors of your home are locked and secured
- Tell a trusted neighbour that you're away
- Ensure your lawns are kept neat
- Ensure someone can collect your mail for you, or have it diverted or stopped for the time you're away
- Check that your sensor lights, alarm, and CCTV system are all working

17 December, from Crime Stoppers NSW: Christmas Grinches are out and about – ready to ruin your Christmas! One of the things most commonly targeted at this time of year are parcels being delivered to your home!

This includes Christmas Hampers, presents being delivered from loved ones and parcels from online purchases.

- Check your mail box daily and keep it locked!
- When expecting a delivery, make sure you are home, or organise to pick it up from the post office.
- Consider CCTV cameras.
- Advise of a safe or hidden place the delivery driver can leave the parcel or package.

Report online via the NSW Police Community Portal or call the **Police Assistance Line 131 444** if your delivery has been stolen. Call **Crime Stoppers 1800 333 000** if you can identify a Christmas Grinch who steals people's mail and parcels. It's what you know, not who you are. That's of interest to us.



17 December, from NSW Police Force: We're encouraging the public to be mindful on our waterways when carrying mobile phones and smart watches with automated crash detection feature after several false activations

The default feature on smart mobile phones and watches is designed to alert emergency services via Triple Zero '000' when the device holder has been involved in a crash, in most cases, detecting the rapid deceleration of a motor vehicle. Recent marine responses have highlighted that the device can be triggered when it is on board a vessel that is travelling over choppy water or bouncing over waves.

⚠ It is just as important to know how to cancel an alert when an emergency response is not required ⚠

An unintentional activation of this feature when on the water can trigger an extensive response not only from police, including our Marine Area Command, but also Marine Rescue NSW and Surf Life Saving NSW, utilising valuable resources and time.



16 December, from Ku-ring-gai Council: Road safety and local business in the spotlight

Tackling safety issues on Pacific Highway and more support for local businesses were unanimously endorsed by Councillors at their final meeting for 2022. The Council met on Tuesday 13 December before the Christmas and New Year recess and two notices of motion put forward at the meeting received unanimous support from Councillors. A notice of motion calling on the NSW government to provide solutions to the safety concerns posed by truck movements on Pacific Highway was adopted.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Garage Sales'

Tip #5: YOU CANNOT SELL dangerous goods, chemicals, faulty electrical items, or firearms.

Tip #9: LOCK ALL DOORS INTO YOUR HOME, including any joining doors, garage doors, shed doors, yard gates, even if you plan to go in and out during the day. Remove keys. Don't be tempted to pop a door on the latch. Set your alarm system. Advise neighbours to also lock their properties and be vigilant.

Tip #17: CHARGE YOUR PHONE the night before & have it on you. Ensure emergency numbers are in your phone (see below). If in doubt – phone! Alternatively, you could use

your home/ car's panic alarm. Consider a personal alarm.

Tip #20: RATHER THAN AT HOME, suggest hosting with a group of others as a community sale at the local school/church/childcare centre. This protects you & your home.
