#### 18 March, from Ku-ring-gai Police Command: CAR REGO PLATE LOCKING SCREWS

Due to the increase in number plate thefts, we recommend using one-way locking screws to secure your plates.

A one-way locking screw is a screw that replaces a normal screw to hold your number plate in place. It goes in very easily, but because of the design, is difficult to remove.

## XPLEASE BE MINDFULX

There has been an increase in thefts resulting from people selling things online and meeting up in public areas. If you are selling things like mobile phones and electronics, you are more than welcome to suggest to your buyer to meet up at your local police station or other busy areas that are well lit and have CCTV.

If you don't feel comfortable about the sale, then walk away.



Online marketplaces like Gumtree and Facebook are becoming popular trading forums and they're becoming even more popular among thieves and scammers!

- Know who you're dealing with by taking some time to do a bit of research.
- Never send money to anyone you don't know!
- Always make cash transactions in public, in person. Also, it's a good idea to take a family member or friend with you.
- Use payment methods with buyer protection, such as PayPal or Afterpay.
- You should inspect the item carefully, in person, to ensure it is as described in the ad and any issues are known upfront before you exchange any money.

If it sounds too good to be true, it probably isn't true!

#### 158 March, from NSW Police Force: Charges Laid



A man will appear in court today charged following an investigation into an alleged business email compromise scam.

In May last year, investigators from the State Crime Command's Cybercrime Squad received reports a law firm had been subject to a business email compromise scam.

A BEC occurs when an individual or a company receives a fake invoice purporting to be from a service or goods provider, requesting that money be sent to a fraudulent account.

Strike Force Madeleine was established to investigate the report, and inquiries revealed an employee of the Sydney business had unknowingly transferred electronic funds into a fraudulent account.

It was further revealed a compromised email address of a paralegal at the firm had been utilised to source an invoice and alter the banking details.

Following extensive investigations, a 58-year-old man was arrested by detectives at a home in Toormina and taken to Coffs Harbour Police Station, where he was charged with knowingly deal with proceeds of crime.

Police will allege in court that the man was the recipient of the stolen funds and dealt with the proceeds of crime to the value of \$709,198.00.

# 21 March, from NSW Police: SCAM ALERT 4

A re-emerging scam Remote Access Scam has been detected by the NSW Police Force. Scammers, pretending to be from various financial institutions or well-known companies, get in contact, often via a phone call, and ask to access the person's device remotely. They often use the excuse that the device is sending out an error message or has a virus that they need to 'fix urgently'.

Various software applications or programs are used by scammers to access the device. Once the scammers have control, they can access the financial and personal data and use this to transfer funds out of the person's account or steal private data.

#### Please follow the prevention strategies below:

- ■■Never give an unsolicited caller remote access to your computer or device.
- ♠ Never give your personal, credit card or online bank account details over the phone to people you don't know and can't identify.



#### 20 March, from Neighbourhood Watch Ku-ring-gai and Hornsby

At the weekend Neighbourhood Watch volunteers helped with 'cocooning' letterbox drops in Wahroonga and Asquith.

Cocooning is the idea of warning residents around where an incident has occurred. Our Crime Prevention Officer at Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command, Constable Gemma Walker, without identifying the actual residence for privacy reasons, identifies letterboxes around the area where community alerts can be delivered. Gemma prints off different community alerts depending on the type of offence. Hopefully the warning will prompt neighbours to be more vigilant, careful and less likely to become a victim. # From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Apartments'

**Tip #1.** Only 'buzz in' those people you know, even if they seem trustworthy. Ensure the door shuts behind you.

**Tip #4.** Clear your mailbox daily. If you are away, ask a neighbour to assist. Or put a hold on your mail at the Post Office.

**Tip #6.** Don't give out spare sets of keys. Never give out copies of your building or apartment keys to tradespeople or friends.

**Tip #10.** Know your neighbours - who should be there, who should not? If in doubt, double-check with others in the building. Challenge those you are suspicious of, or contact **Hornsby Police Station: 9476 9799**.
