# 06 April, from Ku-ring-gai command: HOME SECURITY ASSESSMENTS

Are you concerned with the security of your property/apartment?

Would you like someone to talk to about the security?

Do you think your unit complex requires a security and safety assessment?


Here at Hornsby Police we take your security and safety seriously.

05 April, from Ku-ring-gai command: IMPORTANT REMINDER about NSW's ongoing Firearms Amnesty, particularly in relation to Gel Blasters (which are considered as an actual firearm).

In New South Wales, the amnesty allows for - Firearms or firearm related articles or prohibited weapons to be surrendered to a participating firearm dealer or Police Station without fear of prosecution. Before taking a firearm to a participating firearms dealer or a police station, make sure the firearm is unloaded and where possible, remove the bolt or other method to render the firearm safe. Place the firearm in a gun bag or wrap in a blanket. Ammunition can be taken at the same time as a firearm; however, it must be stored in a separate bag, box or container.


# 10 April, from NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: Beware of SMS scams like this one

# 08 April, from NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: One of our volunteers heard a story on the news last week [Thanks, John - Ed]

It was warning of 'Break & Enters' in another area of Sydney (Eastern Suburbs?). The report was about young gangs of criminals breaking into 2-storey homes, usually in the early hours of the morning when people were asleep upstairs in bed, because the car keys are often easy pickings by the front door on the lower home level. And car thieves these days need those car keys.

The key message is the same, no matter where you live: please don't leave your car keys by the front door, or on the kitchen counter top. Put them out of sight, eg in a cupboard, under the bed. etc.

07 April, from NSW Fair Trading: Do not deal with Mr. Duanne Hevers who has traded in NSW under the business name Fairwater Plumbing.

Mr. Hevers does not and has never held a NSW contractor licence. Consumers have

complained that Mr. Hevers seeks residential building work for which a licence is required and makes false and misleading statements to obtain money from them.

Always check for a licence via the online register before engaging a tradesperson: <u>verify.licence.nsw.gov.au/home</u>

A licence is required for all specialist work such as electrical, plumbing and air conditioning regardless of the cost. Further, a licence is required for all other residential work valued at more than \$5,000.

07 April, from Ku-ring-gai Council: A reminder to keep your pet on a leash when you're out and about, unless it's an off leash dog park.

Keeping your dog on a leash means your dog is safe - and so are other people or animals. You can be fined if your dog's off leash in a public place. You can also be fined if your dog is threatening or attacking other people or animals. Rangers are regularly patrolling to ensure on leash compliance.

# 06 April, from Crime Stoppers NSW: A common question asked by many parents is: "At what age can my children be left at home by themselves?"

The law provides no clear direction as to what age a child can be left at home alone and so as a parent you need to use your own judgement based on your own family circumstances and the age and maturity of your children. Babies or toddlers should not be left at home alone under any circumstances no matter how short a time. If a child is left alone in NSW and something happens, a parent could be charged with neglect.

**06 April, from NRMA Insurance: Who would be at fault in this accident scenario?** [Still taken from a video - blue car (B) has turned from the road into the side street and swerved into the tree to avoid the pedestrian - Ed]



**ANSWER:** In this scenario, Car B is at fault and would need to pay an excess. Even if pedestrian walked out without a pedestrian crossing Car B should be travelling at a safe speed to avoid a collision. (Same if it was a car in front that braked hard). Faster is fatal, slower is safe.  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{=}$  ~ Paul

06 April, form NRMA Insurance: City of Sydney has proposed a blanket 40km/h speed limit across its local government area claiming it will reduce road fatalities and injuries.

### **Product information**

Woolworths is conducting a recall of Woolworths 6pk Fruit Hot Cross Buns and Woolworths 9pk Fruit Hot Cross Mini. The products have been available for sale at Woolworths Dural in NSW only.

Date markings: best before date of 05 APR 23

**Problem:** The recall is due to the presence of foreign matter (metal).

Food safety hazard: Food products containing metal may cause illness/injury if consumed.

Country of origin: Australia

**What to do:** Any consumers concerned about their health should seek medical advice and should return the product to the place of purchase for a full refund.

# 04 April, from 7News.com.au: Mum charged over death of baby boy in Sydney

The 30-year-old is accused of attempting to murder her 10-month-old two days before a fatal incident that led to his death.

A Sydney mum is expected to be charged with murder over the death of a baby boy she allegedly tried to drown two days before the fatal incident. Emergency services were called to a home in Berowra Heights on March 21 following reports a 10-month-old baby boy was found unresponsive.

# From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for the Festive Season'

**Tip #9.** At the beach, allocate a person to watch your gear when you go in the sea. Bring only the minimum valuables. Consider use of a waterproof bag and/or nappy pin. Consider locking valuables away from view in a hiding place within your car boot. Do not leave keys hidden on the car.

**Tip #11.** Hide any spare house keys very carefully. Thieves know the typical places: under door mats, plant pots, fake rocks, or just inside the garage door.

**Tip #14.** Consider temporary travel locks, or a simple door wedge to secure hotel doors. See also info from the Travel page on our <u>watchout.org.au/travel/</u> website and our 20 Tips for Travel on our <u>nhwkuringgaihornsby.org.au/tips/</u> website.

**Tip #18.** If you are going on a road trip, secure any pet with a dog belt/pet cage/seat belt. Plan entertainment for any children so they are not a distraction to the driver. Stay hydrated and get fresh air. Check your route. Plan frequent rest stops. Swap drivers regularly. **Tip #20.** If you are leaving vehicles behind, hide the keys, or take them with you.
