16 April, from NSW Police Force

A man has been charged with murder following the fatal stabbing of a NSW Ambulance paramedic in Sydney's south-west today.

About 5.30am (Friday 14 April 2023), officers from Campbelltown Police Area Command were called to a fast-food restaurant on Queen Street,

Campbelltown, following reports a male paramedic had been stabbed.

The 29-year-old man was treated at the scene and taken to Liverpool Hospital, where he later died.

A crime scene was established, which was forensically examined by specialist officers.

The State Crime Command's Homicide Squad and detectives from Campbelltown Police Area Command commenced an investigation into the incident under Strike Force Tarpaulin.

A 21-year-old man was arrested at the scene and taken to Campbelltown Police Station.

Homicide detectives have now charged the man with murder.

He has been refused bail to appear at Parramatta Local Court tomorrow (Saturday 15 April 2023).

NSW Police would like to commend the actions of the emergency services and members of the public who rendered first aid and assistance at the scene.

14 April, from Ku-ring-gai command: Two charged over alleged 2020 home invasion and murder - Cherrybrook

Homicide Squad detectives have charged two men over the alleged home invasion and murder of a man in Sydney's north-west almost three years ago. Just before 12.30am on Wednesday 29 April 2020, emergency services were called to a home on Tallowwood Avenue, Cherrybrook, following reports two men had forced entry to the home.

Police attended and located the occupants, an 86-year-old man and 83-year-old woman, with serious head injuries.

They were treated at the scene before being taken to Westmead Hospital, where the man, Kalim Saliba, later died.

Officers from Ryde Police Area Command commenced initial inquiries into the incident before detectives from the State Crime Command's Homicide Squad took carriage of the investigation under Strike Force McCleery.

A \$1 million NSW Government reward was announced in December 2021 for information which leads to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons responsible for Kalim's death.

Following further extensive inquiries, strike force detectives attended a unit in Castle Hill, where they arrested a 33-year-old man about 9am today (Wednesday 12 April 2023).

About the same time, a 58-year-old was arrested at a correctional facility at Silverwater.

They were both charged with murder, and specially aggravated break and enter and commit serious indictable offence.

The younger man was refused bail to appear at Parramatta Local Court today, while the older man was also refused bail to appear at Hornsby Local Court later today.

Thank you to all the residents who voted for the project name for our Kerb Numbering project. The winner was "KerbWatch", with "Is Your Number Up?" and "The Burb's Kerbs " coming in second and third. We appreciated your own suggestions too, especially "Kerbie McKerbface" which made our volunteers smile ...

The Kerb Number Stencil Kits are being put together, ready to go to our volunteer(s) in Turramurra, as Turramurra is the first suburb off the rank. One of our volunteers is currently making an Instructional Video for residents to view

before they start the procedure and then everything will be as explicit as can be, ready to go ahead. Some residents have already emailed us, so we have started a shortlist to manage the requests. It's getting to the pointy end and we are very excited!

16 April, from NSW Road Safety - NSW GOV: Double demerits are in force Friday 21 April to Tuesday 25 April inclusive.



Get caught speeding, using a mobile phone illegally, or not wearing a seatbelt or motorcycle helmet this holiday period, and you'll face double the points.

16 April, from Australian Communications and Media Authority: SCAM ALERT: Have you received a call threatening to disconnect your phone service, claiming to be from the ACMA or another government agency? Be wary – this is a scam.



Scammers are targeting people who speak Mandarin by pretending to represent a government agency. Some calls give an English language option.

The caller will claim there has been illegal activity with your phone number and threaten to disconnect the service. The callers might also mention genuine ACMA phone numbers and website addresses to appear legitimate.

If you receive one of these calls, hang up. Scammers are trying to trick you into providing your personal information.

15 April, from KRG.NSW.GOV.AU: Council wins grant to boost volunteer numbers



Ku-ring-gai Council has been awarded a \$50,000 grant to support and encourage volunteering in the local area.

The grant is from the NSW Government's Social Cohesion funding program for local councils.

Under the funding agreement, Ku-ring-gai Council will spearhead the establishment of an 'Upper North Shore Volunteer Hub' to assist in increasing volunteer numbers in the local area.

The pandemic has seen a significant reduction in the number of volunteers participating in community organisations, particularly those in older age groups.

As a result some organisations say they are struggling to maintain services to the community, including those to vulnerable residents. Other activities planned include a volunteer information day, volunteer forums and events to show appreciation to volunteers, including those of multicultural backgrounds.

Mayor Jeff Pettett said that volunteers were an integral part of Ku-ring-gai's community.

"Volunteering is good for people's wellbeing, as well as enhancing a sense of connection in the community".

"We want to do more to help connect organisations with people who could become volunteers, as well as recognise those who are already giving so much to our residents."

The Mayor added that the first step would be creating a volunteer hub where organisations could reach out and connect with potential volunteers.

At the weekend Neighbourhood Watch volunteers are helping with 'cocooning' letterbox drops in Wahroonga and Thornleigh.

Cocooning is the idea of warning residents around where an incident has occurred. Our Crime Prevention Officer at Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command, Senior Constable Geoff Moeller, without identifying the actual residence for privacy reasons, identifies letterboxes around the area where community alerts can be delivered. Geoff prints off different community alerts depending on the type of offence. Hopefully the warning will prompt neighbours to be more vigilant, and less likely to become a victim. The <u>FBI</u> is warning consumers against using public <u>phone</u> charging stations in order to avoid exposing their devices to malicious software.

Public USB stations like the kind found at shopping centres and airports are being used by bad actors to spread malware and monitoring software, according to a tweet from the FBI's Denver branch.

"Carry your own charger and USB cord and use an electrical outlet instead," the agency advised in the tweet last week.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Fire Issues'

Tip #6. For businesses, include arson in your Business Risk Assessment Plan and include arson risk reduction strategies in your Risk Management Plan.

Tip #11. 'Vandalism-motivated arson' is a spontaneous category involving peer pressure. Be aware of unusual behaviour, and look for matches, lighters, cigarettes, spray paint cans, hairspray, perfume, tissues, or flammable liquids. Most fires occur in the evening or at night, Friday or Saturday.

Tip #14. Install hard-wired tamper-proof fire alarms. Consider a home security

system that includes a monitoring service. Activated smoke detectors will automatically call Triple Zero.

Tip #20. Download the 'Fires Near Me' App for updated information from the rural fire service. Consider

the 'Emergency+' App for your GPS at all times.

And... when travelling, please do not use the hotel's sprinkler system valve in the ceiling as a hook!
