What do Firearms and Fingerprints have in common?


During the manufacturing process of firearms, unique markings are created within the barrel, around the chamber and with the firing pin. These marks are totally random and therefore are as unique to that particular firearm as fingerprints are to a person. The unique marks are transferred from the firearm onto the surface of the projectile or cartridge case during the firing process. The NSW Police Force Ballistics Investigation Section can use these marks to link shooting crime scenes together, as well as link firearms to crime scenes.

Did you know that the marks in firearms and on fired components can last many years? The New South Wales Police Force Ballistics Investigation Section, located in Sydney, has linked fired cartridge cases from an Armed Robbery in 1977 in Sydenham, to a firearm recovered by police in 2007 in Holroyd - that's 30 years after the crime!

The Ballistics Investigation Section utilises a national database that allows them to search not only within NSW but all around Australia. In 2015, they linked a crime scene from NSW all the way to a firearm recovered by police in Western Australia.

BEWARE: Car keys are often easy pickings by the front door on the lower home level. And car thieves these days need those car keys. The key message is the same, no matter where you live: please don't leave your car keys by the front door, or on the kitchen counter top. Put them out of sight, eg in a cupboard, under the bed, etc.

QUICK TIP: Lock your vehicle on the drive S in the garage. So many thefts are from unlocked vehicles. Remove the automatic garage-opener from your vehicle. Remove any valuables from eight.

Transporting your materials safely

Transporting your materials safely to a CleanOut collection is important. Here are some top tips for safe storage and transportation:

- Ensure containers are clearly labelled and well-sealed.
 If you do not know the contents, label the container 'UNKNOWN CHEMICAL'.
- Wherever possible keep all chemicals in their original containers.
- Never mix chemicals as this may produce dangerous reactions.
- Liquid can leak during transportation. Wrap old or damaged containers in newspaper, place in a sturdy plastic bag and then in a plastic container or tray.
- Keep household chemicals away from passengers e.g. in the boot.

Community Recycling Centres are available in
Thornleigh and Artermon for drop off of paint, gas bottles, batteries,
oils, fluorescent lights and smoke detectors for free
at a time that suits you.

Other recycling programs

19 April, A warning from Heba, the NSW government Community Engagement Officer: What are rental scams?

Rental scams come in many forms, but the main method is to trick people into paying money for a property or accommodation that doesn't exist, misrepresenting the actual property, or taking payments for rental properties that they don't own or control. The scammers usually advertise these rental properties on Facebook Marketplace, WeChat, or illegitimate real estate websites, and when people respond to the ads and express interest, the scammers ask for a deposit or rent payment in advance, often claiming there are other interested parties. In this increasingly competitive rental market, scammers are taking advantage of vulnerable communities, particularly international students, and people from culturally diverse backgrounds.

Example of a recent rental scam targeting specific community group

There was recently an incident involving 9 victims who reported to the Police that they had fallen victim to the same rental scam. The scammer used the Korean messaging service, Kakao', to advertise a property for rent. The scammer then hired someone to conduct property inspections for the victims, however the property turned to be an AirBnb and was not available for rent. The scammer demanded a bond and two weeks rent for the AirBnb property that he did not own. The total amount scammed from all 9 victims was over \$10,000.

Tips for international students

- Never send money or share personal details with anyone you don't know or haven't met
- Avoid paying for a rental property by transfer or cash as these payment methods are difficult to trace and could be lost to scammers.
- It is important to avoid paying rental bonds to individuals online. Instead, rental bonds should always be paid through a trusted third party such as NSW Fair Trading Rental Bonds Online, who will lodge and refund bond money securely.

Do your research about the property and real estate agent

- Check if the property is listed on a legitimate real estate website or contact the landlord or property manager directly
- Never pay upfront for a property before you've seen it in person
- Be cautious of properties with significantly lower prices than other comparable rental properties in the area or landlords who pressure you to sign a lease quickly.
- Scammers will display impressive photos of properties and ask for a deposit before you've even inspected it.
- Understand your rental rights
- Use well-known platforms
- Search for a rental property using a well-known reputable website or agency and do not use or click on suspicious links.

Reporting the scam

• If you suspect you have been or are being targeted by a rental scam, report it to the relevant authorities such as Scamwatch, your local police, or the website where the

- scam was advertised such as Facebook, Gumtree, WeChat, etc.
- The NSWPF treats all reports of Fraud as confidential and encourages all victims of crime to report to the police. The Police will do its best to investigate the matter and support the victim throughout the process.
- Victims can also contact NSW Fair Trading by calling them or making a complaint online (Fair Trading number 13 32 20).

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Garage Sales'

- **Tip #1.** NEVER ANSWER PERSONAL QUESTIONS about your alarm system, regular habits, living situation, children's schools, what's in your house, etc.
- **Tip #2.** MAKE ABSOLUTELY SURE that all valuable items are securely stored inside the house. Don't be tempted to hide your handbag/keys/purse/wallet/phone outside.
- **Tip #3.** ENSURE ALL POSSESSIONS THAT YOU DO NOT WANT TO SELL (or have stolen) are out of sight/covered and/or secured, eg bikes, wine, surf boards, plants in containers(!).
- **Tip #17.** CHARGE YOUR PHONE the night before & have it on you. Ensure emergency numbers are in your phone (see below). If in doubt phone! Alternatively, you could use your home/ car's panic alarm. Consider a personal alarm.
- **Tip #18.** REASSURE FAMILY by sharing your position during the day, using a mobile phone App such as Glympse. Use the camera phone for recording licence plates. Finish the sale before the light goes.
