We have been asked several times recently on how to stop spam calls. Our answer, you can download an App such as this one to your mobile phone and it will screen your incoming calls.

### Stay protected from robocallers and scammers with Truecaller.

Our famous Caller ID tells you who is calling you and why, so you can decide whether to pick up the

call or not. Use the Powerful Dialer for reverse number lookup and to call friends and family in your contacts. Truecaller will also identify and warn you about robocallers, scammers, fraudsters, telemarketers and other unwanted or unknown phone numbers. The Advanced Spam Detector will automatically block and protect you from unwanted calls and SMS. To help you stay safe, the phone numbers on this spam list are updated in real time by millions of users worldwide.




On Saturday 29th April, around 5:02pm, a brown sausage dog was hit by a black SUV on Mcintosh St and the involved vehicle failed to stop. The dog was hit and left near the kerbside of the road, crying in pain. It's extremely sad to see a distraught and helpless animal being left in a state like that: badly injuried, unable to move and could only cry in pain. It's animal cruelty. A few neighbours went out to assist the dog when we heard the big bang then the howling sound of a dog crying in pain. A very kind passer-by lady took the dog with the assistance of a witness to the animal emergency. My neighbour later found out that no treatment was given to the dog from the instruction of the dog owner and no other further info was available due to privacy reasons. I could not imagine the rest because it was a terrible car incident. May I please stress about the importance to slow down when driving on suburban streets especially as it will get dark a lot sooner as we approach Winter. It can be anyone just trying to cross the street.

# From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips to Protect Your Identity':

**Tip #14.** Use a strong password on mobiles, tablets and laptops.

- Use (in order of strength) complicated passwords, or a pattern, or a PIN.
- Alternatively, consider using facial or fingerprint recognition (both strong). Note that the easiest (read 'laziest') method may not be the most secure your devices can contain a HUGE

amount of sensitive data about you, your home, your emails.

- Set a NEW strong password on devices such as CCTV cameras, baby monitor, Internet router, telephone answering-machine, smart TV, smart speaker. Look around your home!
- Download apps from only the official stores. Don't jailbreak your device.
- Install the latest software updates and patches to your devices, as these help to stop viruses.
- Also install firewall and anti-virus software on all devices, including your mobile phone. Set all updates to 'Auto'.
- Before disposing of a device, remember to delete all personal information. For laptops, use the
  Wipe Disk or Reset features of Windows. For tablets and mobiles, reset to factory settings.
  (The reset will delete the encryption code.) For external hard disks or USB sticks, use data
  erase software or destroy with a hammer or drill.
- For all touch screen devices, regularly clean the screen to remove tell-tale marks.
